

PREPROPOSAL STATEMENT OF INQUIRY

CR-101 (June 2004)

(Implements RCW 34.05.310)
Do NOT use for expedited rule making

Agency: Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission

Process for developing new rule (check all that apply):

Subject of possible rule making: On November 7, 2006, Washington voters approved Initiative Measure No. I-937, also known as the Energy Independence Act, or EIA, now codified as RCW 19.285. This chapter requires qualifying utilities to obtain fifteen percent of their electricity from new renewable resources, such as solar and wind, by the year 2020 and to pursue all available conservation that is cost-effective, reliable and feasible. The Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) adopted rules to implement the EIA as WAC 480-109 in 2007. The subject of this inquiry is to consider whether the Commission should modify rules in chapter WAC 480-109 t to implement the statutory changes and provisions of RCW 19.285. Docket UE-131723.

Statutes authorizing the agency to adopt rules on this subject: RCW 80.01.040, RCW 80.04.160 and RCW 19.285.080(1) and (4).

Reasons why rules on this subject may be needed and what they might accomplish: Since the adoption of the rules, the legislature has enacted changes to various sections of the statute. The Legislature has adopted changes in statute over the last few years, including the following legislation in 2013: SB 5297 (ch. 158, laws of 2013), SSB 5400 (ch. 61, laws of 2013) and HB 1154 (ch. 99, laws of 2013). In addition, the Commission's experience with implementing the law has led to development of decisions, policy statements, and best practices which may need to be incorporated into rules. Given the statutory changes and the Commission's experience in implementation, the Commission believes it may be appropriate to revise WAC 480-109. RCW 19.285.080 provides that the Commission "may adopt rules to ensure the proper implementation and enforcement of this chapter as it applies to investor-owned utilities" and "may be revised as necessary to carry out the intent and purposes of this chapter." Given these developments since the initial adoption of the rules, the Commission is initiating this inquiry to examine whether the rules should be revised.

Identify other federal and state agencies that regulate this subject and the process coordinating the rule with these agencies:

Public utilities not jurisdictional to the Commission are required by RCW 19.285 to acquire minimum amounts of conservation and renewable resources. RCW 19.285.080(2) requires the Department of Commerce (Commerce) to adopt certain rules that will apply to such public utilities. The Commission welcomes Commerce's participation in this inquiry as an interested person. Commission staff has attended a parallel rulemaking inquiry recently initiated by Commerce. If practical and convenient, the Commission may conduct joint workshops with Commerce on certain subjects pertinent to this inquiry.
