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The purpose of this filing is to accomplish a number of housekeeping changes. These changes include:

- Updating the sheets shown above from Sheet No. 7 through Sheet No. 49 and Sheet No. 57 by changing the rates from cents to dollars and other minor changes including changing, where applicable, the letter in the sheet number from lower to upper case in all sheets in this filing.
- Standardizing the Adjustments paragraph on street light schedules by updating Sheet 53-L which includes updating the kWh rate to be applied in adjusting schedules to the average rate that is applied to all street lights. Previously the adjusting rate for Schedule 24 had been used for new types or sizes of lights. In addition, the paragraph was clarified that this average rate only applies to new types or sizes of lights.
- Updating the General Rules and Provisions, Sheets 80-B, 80-T and 80-X to (1) delete the prohibition against resale as it is duplicative of WAC 480-100-108(5) and in light of the recent revision to RCW 80.28.320 could be easily misunderstood by the public; and (2) to update metering provisions to clarify that PSE will determine the type of meters to be installed, to clarify that the point of metering may differ from the point of delivery resulting in an adjustment for losses, and providing, as has been past practice, that commercial and industrial customers provide telephone service for transmitting meter readings; and (3) changing the demand measurement to allow for decimals and for quantities other than kW, kVa, or HP.
- Updating Sheets 95-K and 95-L to reflect rates for Schedule 54 LED street lights. Currently those rates are based on the "Adjustments" section of Schedule 54.
- Updating Sheet 132-D to correct a scrivener's error in the heading for Schedule 58 street lights.
- Updating Sheets 26, 141-A, 141-B and 141-C to clarify cent or dollar signs.
- Updating Sheet 248-B to reflect the correct paragraph numbering.


