Re: Notice to State Commission under *FCC Interconnected VoIP Numbering Order*


Dear Mr. King:

Under the *FCC Interconnected VoIP Numbering Order*,¹ interconnected VoIP providers are required to file a notice of intent to request numbers with a state commission at least 30 days prior to requesting numbers from the numbering administrator. Vonage received authorization from the FCC on March 31, 2016 to obtain telephone numbers.² By this letter, Vonage provides notice that it intends to request the following numbering resources from the numbering administrator in Washington on May 1, 2016 or shortly thereafter:

- 10,000 block in the Seattle (674) LATA to establish an LRN.

In order to establish an LRN, it is necessary for Vonage to order a 10,000 block. Consistent with its practice in the FCC interconnected VoIP provider numbering trial, Vonage intends to return nine 1,000 blocks to the pool from the 10,000 block used to establish an LRN.³
