Water Rate Notification Letter

March 25, 2016

Dear Suncadia Water Company Customer:

Due to significant increases in the cost of providing Suncadia with a sustainable and clean water supply over the past five years, the Suncadia Water Company is proposing a change to the current water rates charged to customers. We have provided the below information to both inform and explain the reasons behind the upcoming rate changes.

First, water rates in the Suncadia Resort have not been adjusted for the past 5 years despite changes that have impacted operating costs. These changes include increasing power rates, two increases in the cost of treating our water from Cle Elum, construction of approximately 200 homes, and development of several parcels.

Next, our recommendation for updated water rates has been developed over the past several months utilizing Washington State Utilities and Transportation Commission (UTC) specified methodologies and a UTC supplied spreadsheet tool. Prior to submission of this rate case to the UTC the proposed changes were reviewed by members of the Suncadia Residential Owners Association Advisory Committee. A few highlights of the methodology and data used in the Water Rate Study are:

- Tiered water rates are maintained and strengthened to encourage conservation. The tiered rates are set up so that as water consumption per service increases, the rate per unit of water used increases in set intervals. In other words, as more water is used by a customer, the more expensive the water becomes. The top water usage tier is raised significantly to encourage conservation.
- One full year of actual metered water usage data is utilized.
- One full year of employee time-keeping is utilized. Time spent on water company business is calculated and used in the setting of the rates.
- There are no special irrigation rates. All services of a given size pay the same amount regardless of how water is used by the end customer.
- There are no special commercial rates. Meter equivalent sizing is used to determine commercial rates per UTC requirements.
- Consistent with the past filing, utilization of a "Used and Useful" concept continues. This means that customers of the system today won't be paying for portions of the system constructed to serve future development parcels within the Resort.
- As in the past we have included special charges for dedicated fire lines.
- A Ready-To-Serve (RTS) calculation is also included and updated. The UTC believes that the RTS rate should be the same as the base rate for active users and we are proposing to phase in this change over several rate cases rather than implement the change all at once.

In total, the changes amount to an increase in operating revenue of approximately 29.4% based on study year data although the increase will be less if the tiered rates result in significant water conservation. A summary of the changes is as follows:

Please note that the irrigation system that supplies water to the golf courses in Suncadia and Tumble Creek is completely separate from the domestic water supply system, which is the subject of this letter. Costs related to supplying water to the golf courses are not included in the costs that make up the water rates shown in the chart above.

The commission has the authority to set final rates that may be either lower or higher from the company's request, depending on the results of its investigation. Commission staff will make a recommendation to the commissioners at an open meeting in Olympia, which is scheduled for 9:30 a.m. on April 28, 2016. You will have an opportunity to comment in person at this meeting. If you are unable to attend the open meeting, the commission has a bridge line, which enables you to participate or listen by telephone.
