IX. Comments

Event Description:

On April 2, 2017, Jonathan E. Sharpe was struck and fatally injured by a westbound BNSF freight train at milepost 1760.1 on the Scenic Sub Division on the main track. Snohomish County Sheriffs Department investigated the incident. When they arrived, they found Mr. Sharpe approximately 150 feet west of the east side of the bridge. The train stopped on bridge 1760.1. The locomotive engineer stated he was traveling westbound when he observed a male stand up and run to the tracks and layed down in the middle of the tracks. The train was traveling at 40 miles per hour when it struck the individual. The Engineer activated emergency braking but was unable to stop before striking Mr. Sharpe. All horns, bells and lights were working on the locomotive at the time of the incident. Toxicology reports show that Mr. Sharpe's alcohol content level was at 0.27 percent.

Site Description:

The site is located in a secluded area. The area is not fenced but is marked with "No Trespassing" signs. There is a single main line track going from east to west and a bridge is immediately located to the west of where individual was struck. There is a housing community on the west side of the bridge. There is no public access to this site.

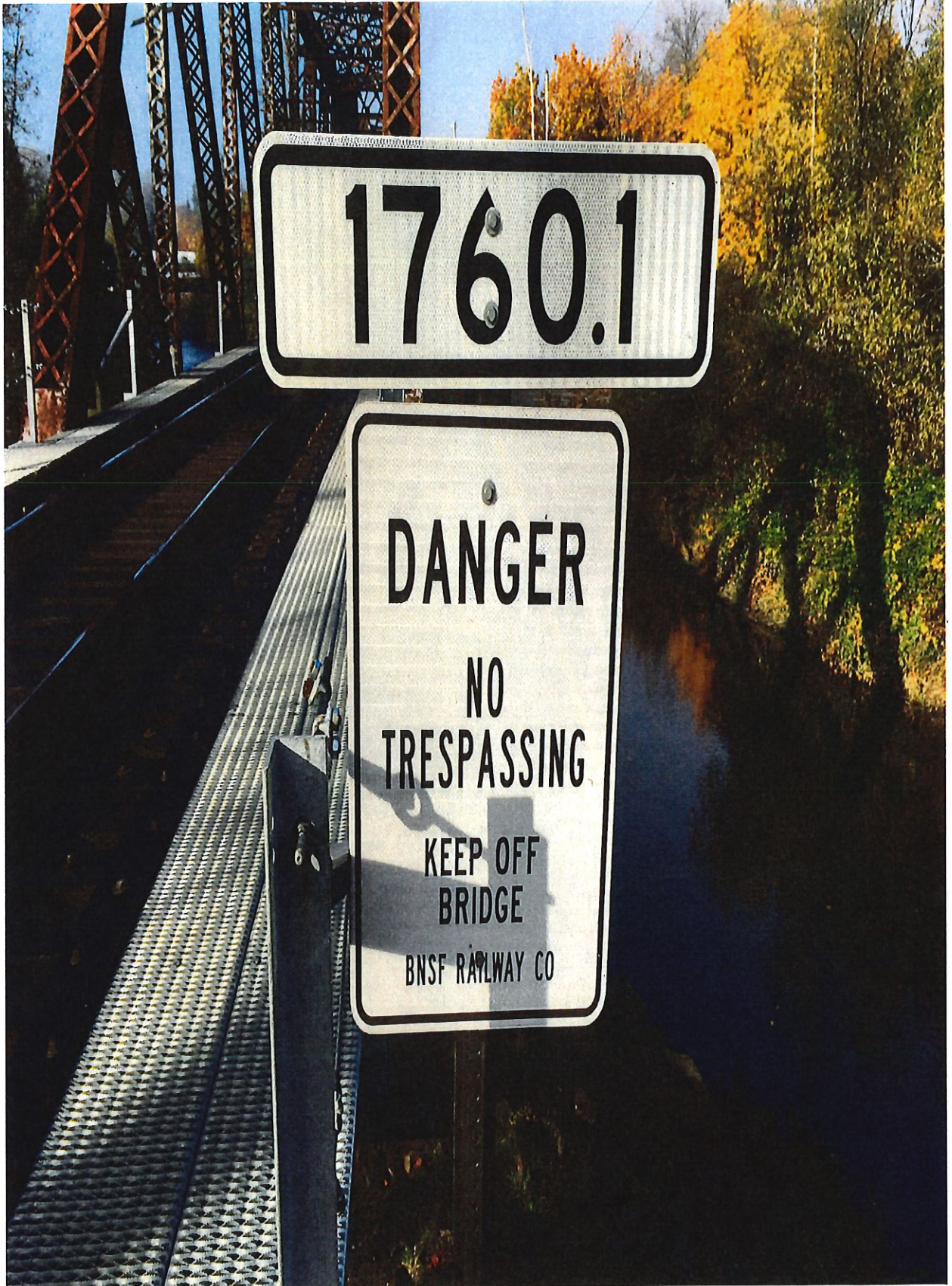

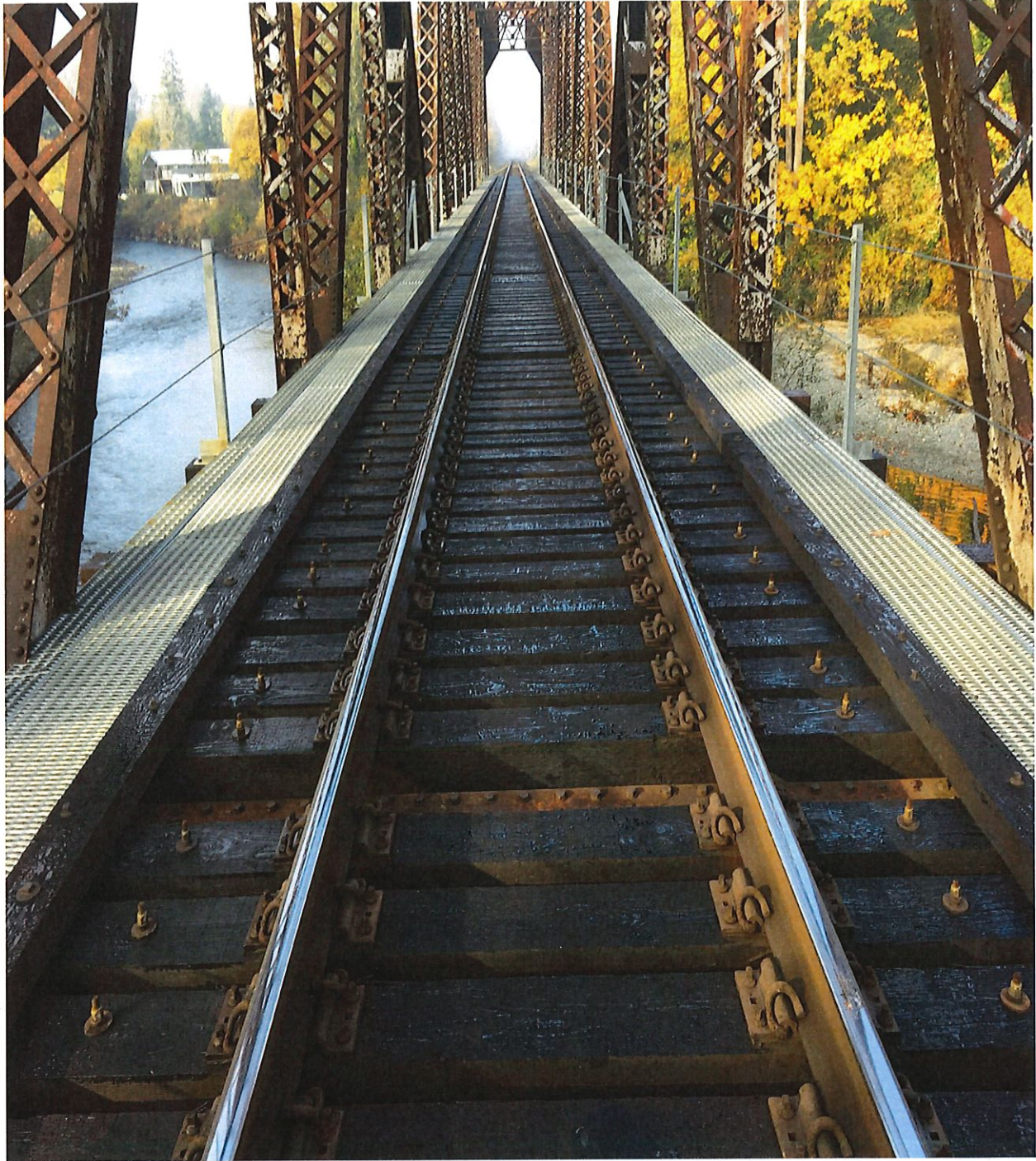

One of the FD guys went under the bridge to the water's edge and told me that he found a wallet which he marked with an upright stick so that we could locate it later. They cleared and I remained on the bridge.

The weather was changing quickly and was about to rain so I used my issued camera that I grabbed before leaving my patrol truck and took several photos of what I had located thus far. I then went under the bridge remaining far enough away from the water and located a beer can, pack of cigarettes, and the wallet. I took photos of this area and reported to Sgt Haldeman about the wallet. It appeared to have been just left there as it was not wet or dirty. After photos were taken of it I opened it up and located a WA driver's license belonging to Jonathan E.T. Sharpe (4b) which was given to Sgt Haldeman who was acting incident command.

At approximately 1336 hours, a body was located under an orange railcar just east of the midspan of the bridge. I took photos of what could be seen and relayed information to command. I was advised that Deputy Metcalf with CIU was on his way along with a medical examiner investigator. I remained at my location until their arrival. When Deputy Metcalf and the ME responded I briefed them on what I had known and located. They took photos and then the train was moved to the west to clear the tracks for collection and removal of the body and parts. Once other photos were taken, and with the help of a BNSF truck that was capable of driving on the tracks the body and parts were recovered and driven back to 14930 Reese RD. It was then that I turned the wallet over to the ME. Deputy Metcalf instructed me to download my photos onto a disc and to inter office mail it to him, which was completed.

On 04/02/17 at approximately 1202 hours, I was dispatched to the area of the train tracks and 10th ST in Sultan in reference to a train vs pedestrian accident. Prior to arrival the call was updated that this was a third hand report coming from BNSF and that the residents who live at (4b) are reporting to access it from their property. I am very familiar with those residents and the area. I arrived at their driveway at approximately 1208 hours and observed a freight train completely stopped on the tracks. I was towards the back of the train so it appeared that it was heading west.

I walked along the tracks on the north side of the stopped train towards the Wallace River bridge which was approximately .25 miles from my patrol truck. Prior to getting to the bridge I stopped and talked to Jane Sinclair who resides at (4b). I asked her if she located anyone or saw anyone and she said no but that there are parts of someone along the bridge. I asked her if she saw anything and she said no that she was outside and heard and saw the train apply its emergency brakes and come to a screeching stop. She called BNSF and was told that the train had hit someone. I told her to continue back to her house and we would contact her later if needed. I proceeded west to the bridge and upon looking under the train on the tracks I saw what appeared to be brain matter and chunks along with some splatter. As I continued west I observed more of the same along the bridge. I was met by two Sultan FD members who came from the west to me and they did not see anyone along the way. STATEMENT: ON 4-2-17 at about 1210 I (Sarah Lamm) was working in my front yard when the BNSF train came to a quick stop. My wife (Jenae Sinclair) commented that it sounded like emergency brakes. Within minutes my wife got a phone call and was told the train had hit somebody. We went out to our field to see if anyone was hurt and needed emergency first aid. Nobody was noticed in the field. I very soon noticed what looked like a chunk of skull. Then I noticed what looked like a smaller chunk of skull just south of the under side of the bridge. I looked to see if I could see a body. I did not see one. My wife asked me to come out that it was going to be a crime scene. I walked back under the bridge to the north side where my property is. While walking out I noticed about 1/2 of a pack of Camel 100 cigarettes laying closely to the pile of guts/brain matter it caught my attention since they were dry and it had been raining. I left and went home.

On 04-02-17 at approx 1330 hrs, I was contacted via telephone by Sgt Kahler and asked to respond to Reese Rd in Startup for a reported train versus pedestrian collision. On arrival, I was briefed by Sgt Haldeman and Dep Griner. Sgt Haldeman had established incident command.

Investigation:

It was reported that a Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) train was traveling westbound in Startup, WA along Reese Rd when a white male (later identified as Jonathan E. Sharpe, (4b)) emerged from under the trestle at Wallace River and jumped in front of the train. The collision occurred approx 1/4 mile west of the residence at 14930 Reese Rd..

The train was stopped at the location as I walked the tracks from 14930 Reese Rd westbound. The point of impact (POI) appeared to be at the east end of Bridge 1760 (MP 1760.1). This is a trestle that travels over the Wallace River. Sharpe reportedly walked up from the south side of the tracks on the east end of the trestle and jumped in front of the train as it approached traveling from east to west. Sharpe's wallet was located under the trestle on the east end a short distance from where he jumped in front of the train. There were also several Busch beer cans and an open pack of Camel cigarettes under the trestle. All of these items were dry even though it had been raining.

I was able to locate body parts which started on the east end of the bridge under train car #156491 and continued to the body's location under train car 35012 (CTTX695026). There were also several body parts located under the bridge to the north and south. I used an engineer's roller wheel and determined the distance to be approximately 165 feet from the POI on the east end of the bridge to the body's location. I took digital pictures of the scene which I later booked CD copies of the pictures into evidence at the Special Operations Center (SOC).

The MEs office was notified and medical investigator, Jane Jorgensen, responded to the scene. Jorgensen took pictures of the scene and then the train was moved to the west after it was determined there would be no more damage to Sharpe's remains. After the train was moved, Jorgensen and I took additional photos and then Sharpe's remains were recovered by Jorgensen. A BNSF vehicle was used to move the body off of the tracks to Jorgensen's vehicle. The ME case number is 17SN0556. Jorgensen took possession of Sharpe's body/belongings and transported to the Snohomish County Medical Examiner's Office.

The engineer of the train was identified as Nathan D Odell, (4b). The conductor on the train was identified as John W Coheley, (4b). Additionally, there was an engineer trainee on the train, Mark S Houle, (4b). The train master who responded to the scene for BNSF was identified as Elgin Hawkins, (4b). BNSF Agent Nies was also on scene.

The train was pulled by BNSF engine # 4833. The train was a automobile car hauler with 53 total train cars. The train was 5059 feet in length and had a weight of 3772 tons. The train was traveling at 45 mph at the time of the collision. The train cars were full of new vehicles.

Odell and Coheley said that Sharpe came from the south side of the tracks and was described as running and then diving in front of the train.

Homeowners Sarah Lamm and Janae Sinclair, (4b) stated they responded to the scene after the train stopped in attempts to render possible aid. They stated they saw body parts below the bridge and then retreated back towards their residence until aid crews arrived.

On 04-03-17 at approx 1700 hrs, I was contacted by BNSF Agent Nies by telephone. He stated that he spoke to homeowner Sinclair earlier in the day. I contacted Sinclair via telephone on 04-04-17 at 0900 hrs. Sinclair said Sharpe's aunt Georgina was at the collision scene and placed flowers. She said that Georgina said that Sharpe was clinically depressed and was on anti-depressants. Sinclair said that Sharpe's cousin Desiree said he was talking about suicide, specifically suicide by train. Desiree asked Sharpe, "what about your kids?" Desiree said that Sharpe said his mom would take care of them. Reportedly, Sharpe waited until his mom took the kids to Arizona before jumping in front of the train.

On 04-06-17 at 1300 hrs, I spoke with Jesse Heller from BNSF about the train video. He said he has retrieved the video. He will set something up next week for me to view the video. Heller delivered the video to my office on 04-21-17 at 0830 hrs. The video showed Sharpe running from the south side of bridge 1760 towards the tracks. As the train approached, Sharpe appears to lay down on the tracks and looks up at the train as it struck him.

On 05-12-17, I received the autopsy from the Snohomish County Medical Examiner's Office. The autopsy showed extensive blunt force trauma to the head and trunk. The toxicology returned with a blood alcohol of .27g/100mL. The manner of death was classified as suicide.

Weather:

At the time of the collision, there was some rainfall in the area. Upon my arrival at the scene, the rain had subsided. It was daylight and there were no weather related issues that would have hindered visibility for the train operators or Sharpe.

Equipment:

The train tracks appeared to be in good condition with no obvious defects noted. The bridge and decking on the bridge also appeared to be in good shape. There was warning signage in the area including no trespassing signs for the bridge.


Causation:

This appears to be a suicide case. Sharpe's history and the train video corroborates the manner and cause of death as a suicide along with the high level of alcohol intoxication.

Odell and Coheley said that Sharpe came from the south side of the tracks and was described as running and then diving in front of the train.

Homeowners Sarah Lamm and Janae Sinclair (4b) stated they responded to the scene after the train stopped in attempts to render possible aid. They stated they saw body parts below the bridge and then retreated back towards their residence until aid crews arrived.

On 04-03-17 at approx 1700 hrs, I was contacted by BNSF Agent Nies by telephone. He stated that he spoke to homeowner Sinclair earlier in the day. I contacted Sinclair via telephone on 04-04-17 at 0900 hrs. Sinclair said Sharpe's aunt Georgina was at the collision scene and placed flowers. She said that Georgina said that Sharpe was clinically depressed and was on anti-depressants. Sinclair said that Sharpe's cousin Desiree said he was talking about suicide, specifically suicide by train. Desiree asked Sharpe, "what about your kids?" Desiree said that Sharpe said his mom would take care of them. Reportedly, Sharpe waited until his mom took the kids to Arizona before jumping in front of the train.

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On 05-12-17, I received the autopsy from the Snohomish County Medical Examiner's Office. The autopsy showed extensive blunt force trauma to the head and trunk. The toxicology returned with a blood alcohol of .27g/100mL. The manner of death was classified as suicide.
