## IX. Comments

Event Description:
On June 1, 2017, Ashley N. Guthrie was struck and fatally injured by a southbound BNSF freight train at milepost 122.8, on the mainline in Ellensburg, WA. Kittitas County Sheriffs Office investigated the incident. When they arrived, they found the train stopped on the main track in the area of Stone Road and Woodhouse Loop. The locomotive engineer stated he was traveling southbound when he observed something lying along the side of the tracks. The train horn was sounded in an attempt to alert the unidentifed object. The engineer noticed that the object was a female and stirred and sat up facing the train. The brakes where immediately applied and the horn continued to sound. He stated that the cattle guard struck the individual. It was reported by the Washington State Patrol Toxicology Laboratory that drugs were detected in the lab results.

## Site Description:

This portion of track runs west to east from Ellensburg to Yakima. There is approximately one mile of sight distance in both directions. There are no "No Trespassing" signs in the area. A two lane road runs parallel to the train tracks. There is a crossing at Ringer Loop Road, about two-tenths of a mile east of where the individual was struck. This is a rural area, with no public access to the track.
