### **IX. Comments**

**Event Description:** 

On June 1, 2017, Adam Sampson was struck and fatally injured by a southbound Amtrak train at milepost 68 on the Scenic Sub Division on the main track. Mount Vernon Police Department investigated the scene. When they arrived, they found Mr. Sampson under a railcar approximately 50 feet south of where he was struck. The train was stopped underneath the I-5 overpass.

The locomotive engineer stated he was traveling southbound when he observed a male walking northbound on the outside of the west rail. The engineer sounded the horn and and placed the train into emergency braking. Mr. Sampson made no attempt to move out of the trains way. The train was traveling at about 43 mile per hour when it struck Mr. Sampson.

Site Description:

This incident occurred under the I-5 overpass. There is no fencing in this area or "No Trespassing" signs. There is a sharp curve with approximately 50 feet of sight distance in both the north and southbound directions at this location. There are several tracks that run parallel to the mainline on the west side of the track. There is a public walkway that leads to this area.

#### Recommendations:

This area is being assessed for possible trespass abatement measures, recommend including this most recent incident as part of the assessment.

We received a call from BNSF (817.352.2832) at 0950 local reporting that an Amtrak train struck a trespasser in Mt Vernon (48.43127; -122.3318) RR mp 69 on the Bellingham Subdivision. The train is blocking the main line tracks. No hazmat involved. Local POC is TrainMaster Elgin Hawkins 425.212.8744. Skagit county dispatch confirms details and provided the address of Freeway Dr and Cameron Dr in Mt Vernon. Local PD has blocked the streets in the area and providing traffic control to limit the number of bystanders in the area. Call came in at 0917 local time. Skagit dispatch case number: 17-M09550. Status of trespasser unknown. State incident # 17-1945

On 06/01/2017 at approximately 0917 hrs I overheard radio traffic of officers being dispatched to the area of Freeway Drive and Cameron Way regarding a train/pedestrian accident.

I responded to the area and was advised that a subject had been hit by the train and was now deceased underneath the train on a side track underneath the I-5 overpass. It was pointed out by Officer Gless that he had been speaking with two females who had been on the train who said that after it occurred the conductor asked if anybody had any medical experience and since they were both doctors they came out to assist. In their opinion the subject who was deceased had been laying there for a while.

Lieutenant Moore and I then went to the front of the train to see if we could see evidence of impact. We were able to clearly notice on the cow-catcher on the front left side of the train as you face it, and the area just behind that, had what appeared to be blood stain as well as what was potentially brain matter. I then spoke with the engineer, Samuel Morrisette who indicated that he had come around the corner at about 50 mph and as he was slowing down for a stop at the Mount Vernon Station. He said that the subject was walking towards him just outside the tracks on the railroad ties. He said that he blew the horn but the subject never moved so he applied the emergency break. He said he believes he and the subject made eye contact prior to impact. Morrisette indicated that the train had set out this morning from Vancouver BC at approximately between 6:30 and 6:50 AM and they had stopped at the border and in Bellingham prior to their scheduled stop in Mount Vernon with their ultimately destination being Seattle. Morrisette said that he got into British Columbia yesterday at about 12:30 and spent the day there before leaving this morning. He did indicate that the train was equipped with a camera that would have captured the event.

Morrisette said that he has been with Amtrak for ten years total, spending seven years as a conductor and the last three years as an engineer. He said this was the second subject in the three years as an engineer that his train has struck. Morrisette declined at this time to do a written statement as he still felt shaky but agreed to answer any questions I had.

I then went back and assisted other detectives with the collection of evidence after the coroner arrived on scene and then cleared the scene.

On 6/1/17, at approximately 0920 hours, MVPD units were dispatched to a train vs pedestrian collision in the area of Freeway Dr and Cameron Way on the rail road tracks in the city of Mount Vernon.

I arrived after patrol units and med units, where I learned that the subject was pronounced deceased by med crews. I was tasked with photographing the scene with my department issued camera. I viewed the scene, where the train had come to a stop underneath I-5 overpass. I observed the deceased underneath a sheet, approximately 20 feet away from the train tracks. There was a large debris field with personal belongings belonging to the deceased nearby the body.

I began by photographing the scene, going from the start of the scene on Cameron Way, following the train down Freeway Dr to the lead engine. I photographed the train numbers as I went along. On the lead engine, I observed an impact mark with flesh still on the train. I photographed this section of the engine. I then returned to the other end of the scene after completing initial photographs. I learned from Officer Gless that the deceased had been identified as Adam Sampson.

The items were then given placards by Patrol Officer Gless and Sgt. Martinez. I then photographed the items as they were numbered. This is a list of the placard numbers associated with the items:

#1: Premier cell phone charger

#2: Paper with Adam "Satan" Sampson on it

#3: Wrapper for Easy Touch Syringes

#4: Blood Splatter on Pillar

#5: Cell phone screen

#6: Black bandana

#7: A smiley face cigarette box

#8: Cell phone body

#9: Samsung back cover for Cell Phone

#10: Cell Phone charger cord

#11: Black back pack

#12: Deceased Body

#13: Syringe

#14: Human Tooth

The coroner arrived on scene and assisted in the investigation. I stood by while the Coroner uncovered the deceased and at that time, I photographed the deceased entire body. I observed a large trauma wound to the deceased's face and neck area consistent with the location of the impact mark on the train. See photographs for further details. I stood by with the coroner as the body was initially examined. After the initial examination, the body was placed into a body bag by the Coroner.

The Coroner took custody of the deceased and the evidence was later impounded into evidence by Detective Jones. Once back at the office, I took no further

action on this case.

On 06/01/2017 I spoke with Officer Steve Travers (206) 819-8446, from the Amtrak Police. Travers had been able to review the video and stated that the video indicated the decedent was walking northbound with his head down on the west side of the rail, walking on the railroad tie edges. Travers said you can clearly hear the horn sound on the train, giving the decedent plenty of opportunity to get off of the tracks. He said that the engineer hits the emergency brakes and then the decedent looks up just before being struck. He said the train was traveling at 43 miles an hour.

I provided Travares with my e-mail and he stated he would send me the link to officially request a copy of the video for the case file.

Investigation continues.

On 06/01/2017 at 0918 hours, I was advised of the train vs. pedestrian accident in the area of Freeway Drive and Cameron Way at the railroad track. Information provided indicated that a person had been struck by the train and it was unclear whether the male was conscious or breathing. Initial indication was there was possibly a fatality.

I was the first Officer on scene and as I came into the area of Cameron Way and Freeway Drive, I was flagged down by the train conductor and a couple witnesses who were directly underneath the I-5 overpass on the tracks. As I exited my vehicle, I could see that the deceased, who was later identified as Adam Sampson, had been struck and sent forward approximately 15-20 yards from the main line. He was next to an oil tanker that was parked on another line that is hardly used. Upon walking up to Adam Sampson, I could see that his body was twisted and that he was lifeless. I could see that he was clearly dead. His face had been struck and part of his jaw had been dislocated.

There were two females who were passengers on the train near Sampson. The conductor had asked anyone on the train who had medical experience to come out and hopefully provide some aid to Adam Sampson. I advised them to stand by, as we would need to speak with them and collect statements from them. I was able to figure out that the train was not blocking any roadways. I requested Officer Gless, who arrived on scene, to grab a blanket so the deceased could be covered after being photographed. Officer Gless was able to photograph him.

Paramedics and Firefighters did arrive on scene and concluded that Adam Sampson had passed from being struck by the train. They just confirmed that he was deceased and they did not attach any other instruments or anything on Sampson's body. I was able to obtain the name of Paramedic/Firefighter Bryan Luchi, Paramedic Jennifer Russell, and Paramedic Avis Bozeman. They were three of the Firefighters and Medics that were able to see the body and had a part in determining whether Sampson had passed away or not. There were a couple more Paramedics and Firefighters on scene; those names were collected by other Officers and Detectives on scene.

I spoke with the train conductor, who advised that the train was headed southbound and the train had struck the deceased right before going underneath the overpass. Detectives and Command Staff did arrive on scene.

The road, Cameron Way and Freeway Drive, was blocked off and also the road at Fir and First was blocked off to keep traffic and subjects from walking near the area. Officer Gless and I were able to walk the track, looking for any evidence left behind by the victim. We were able to identify several items which were later documented by Detectives. See their narratives for further. This concluded my involvement.

On Thursday, 06/01/2017 at approximately 0915 hrs, dispatch advised of a train/pedestrian accident in the general area of Lion's Park.

I proceeded to the area with Sergeant Don, Detective Jones, Detective Green, and Detective Shackleton to assist in investigating the accident. The train was found to be between a track intersection with Cameron Way and approximately the 300 block of Freeway Drive in the area of the old Valley Farm Center which is now an RV Repair lot.

On arriving, various aspects of the investigation were discussed and I proceeded to mark both the rear and the front of the train with orange paint on the railroad ties on the track. I also marked where the front axle of the front wheel of the train was on the track and near the rear of the train marked the front and back wheels of the rear engine which was the drive engine for the train, on both sides of the track, and the position in relation to those wheels of the sand dumping equipment that the rear engine was equipped with.

In an emergency braking situation, Amtrak trains are equipped with sand to be dumped on the tracks to increase traction and friction to aid in stopping the train faster. I then walked northbound on the tracks toward Cameron Way trying to determine when the sand had begun to dump on the tracks. It was a very small amount of sand but I believe I determined the beginning of the same dump and marked that location with orange paint on the rail.

While at the front of the train, I located the conductor and asked him to come down to speak with us to give us some idea what had happened. Detective Shackleton was with me and as I stood by, the engineer began to talk to Detective Shackleton, advising that the train had been southbound approaching where it was now stopped, when the engineer had seen a man walking northbound on the west side of the tracks, on the ties just outside the track. He stated that he had given a short blast on the horn at which point the subject had made eye contact with him and he had hit the emergency brake for the train. He stated the subject did not veer from the tracks or change his route at all but remained walking where he was until he was struck. The engineer was visibly rattled by the incident.

I took five pictures with my cell phone which I downloaded to PEP 2016. I will be going out at a future date with Detective Jones to assist in marking with a more permanent marker the locations that were marked with paint and to document distances on the tracks. We will need the assistance of the Burlington Northern Railway in order to make sure we can do so safely.

The photos I took are described below:

Image #26 depicts the east side of the train and where the sand dump is on the southernmost front or front wheel of the rear locomotive, there is orange pain below the sand dumping equipment on the side of the track.

Image #27 depicts the mark on the tracks in the same location and a closer view of the sand dumping equipment and a small amount of sand in front of, and under,

that train wheel.

Image #28 depicts the northernmost wheel on the rear drive locomotive on the west side and the corresponding markings on the track related to the wheel and the sand dumping equipment.

Image #29 is a closer view of that same northernmost wheel.

Image #30 depicts the southernmost wheel on the west side of the train on the rear drive locomotive. Both the mark on the track for the wheel and for where the sand dumping equipment is. It also depicts a larger amount of sand dumped on the track and on the rail by that wheel.

It should be noted that image #26 in addition to depicting one of the wheels of sand dumping equipment on the east side of the tracks, also was shot towards the north where sun glare washes out the rear end of the train. I took no photo of the north-easternmost wheel of the rear locomotive.

On June 1, 2017 at approximately 0910 hours detectives responded to reports of a pedestrian versus train collision in the area of Cameron way and Freeway Dr. in the city Mount Vernon.

This was an Amtrak train that was headed southbound at the time of the collision.

As I arrived Med crews were clearing and had declared the later identified Adam Sampson as deceased. The fire personnel that had been on scene were identified and later cleared the scene.

Their names include Steven Skilbeck, Bryan Luchi, Jennifer Russell, Michael Hammer, Avis Bozeman, and Danny Laine.

The train had been marked with paint at the front and rear to include the wheels at the front and rear.

I spoke with the conductor who stated that he was in charge of the train operations and identified himself as Larry Drawdy. Drawdy provided a written statement along with a verbal statement. In his verbal statement he said that the train went into emergency mode and that an announcement was made for anybody with medical training to assist a passenger and then he found the gentleman and he was obviously deceased.

Detective Shackleton spoke with the engineer of the train and obtained a statement. The information that had been provided by the engineer included the train heading southbound when they observed the male subject walking on the west side of the tracks going north and was struck by the train.

Ofc. Gless and Sgt. Martinez walked to the track and flagged any property that was believed to be Sampson's with number tents. This was later photographed and documented by Detective Green. Det. Green also photographed the entire scene.

The coroner was contacted and later arrived. Deborah Hollis provided the coroner case number of 17SK0184. The coroner later took custody of the deceased. Property of the deceased, to include a backpack, were transported back to the Mount Vernon Police department and held for safekeeping. After the coroner arrived I briefed her on the information that had been obtained during the initial investigation.

Hollis learned that Sampson had left the home that he had been staying in. He left the previous night around 11 pm. She also stated that he was bi-polar. She stated that the injuries he sustained are consistent with him walking north on the track.

The Oak Harbor Police Department had been contacted and it was confirmed that Sampson's father worked there and they would make notification of the incident.

Measurements will later be taken to include the location where the sand had been

believed to have started to be dropped from the train in the emergency process.

Ofc. Gless had spoken to the two witnesses who later provided written statements as to what they had observed and had done.

The property that had been obtained and taken for safekeeping included a notebook with a single piece of paper belonging to Sampson and also a cell phone that appeared to have been broken during the collision.

After the train had been marked and the coroner had been notified the train was released while the rest of the scene was documented.

BNSF employees had arrived on scene and were provided information regarding the investigation.

On Tuesday, 06/06/2017 at approximately 1230 hrs I went to the location of this incident with Detective Jones in order to more permanently mark the location of various items of importance in this incident.

Detective Jones and I were allowed on the railroad track but Burlington Northern employees, including Greg Beam, a Burlington Northern investigator at approximately 1315 hrs.

We located the furthest area on the tracks north of the incident where I could locate sand that had been dumped by the train braking system. We designated that point as zero and I drove a nail into the railroad tie on the outside of the tracks at that location. Then using Lidar which was calibrated at our office I measured from that point to the Cameron Way signal shed and it 376.8 feet. I then turned south to measure toward the incident, measuring first to the freeway support pillar closest to Cameron Way which was 483.1 feet south of my location. My location was north of the freeway support pillar. I then measured the freeway support pillar furthest from Cameron Way. That pillar was 536.4 feet away.

From the zero point to the back of the train we then measured using a wheeled measuring device. That distance was 604.5 feet. From the zero point to the back sand dump on the back car of the train was 611 feet. From the zero point to the back axle of the back car it was 613.25 feet. From the zero point to the front axle of the back car it was 664.75 feet and from the zero point to the front sand dump of the back car was 666.5 feet.

From the zero point to the front axle of the train was 1278 feet. From the zero point to the front of the train was 1284.25 feet. This made the train approximately 680 feet long. The train took 664.75 feet to stop from the zero point. The train had been traveling at approximately 43 miles per hour or 63.21 feet per second according to information provided by Amtrak.

I also was allowed to view a video maintained by Amtrak which clearly depicted the sound of the air dump from brake application occurring prior to impact with the pedestrian.

I documented all of these pieces of information in a word document which I printed out and placed in the case jacket.

For future reference, the Lidar used in this incident was Lidar #PL32924 and that Lidar was calibrated at the office within acceptable bounds at 84.7 feet. Acceptable bounds is any measurement between 83.9 and 84.9.

On 6/1/17 at approximately 0918 hours, I was dispatched to a Train Ped at Freeway Dr and Cameron Way by the railroad tracks. Amtrak called 911 to advise a person was struck by the train and unknown if the person was conscious or breathing. The 2nd hand conductor was at the back of the train with the victim and was across from Lions Park. It was updated to a possible fatality and the victim was unconscious and not breathing. The train had stopped and I arrived on scene at the same time as Sgt. Martinez. We approached the train and I could see it stopped just under I-5 overpass with an Amtrak employee and two females standing behind. I could also see they were standing near a body underneath an adjacent train tanker car to the west. I began to take a couple of initial photographs just before Paramedics arrived on scene and evaluated the body. They briefly examined the body and informed us the male was deceased. I returned to my patrol vehicle and obtained a blanket to place over the body. Sgt. Martinez and I were also able to initially identify the victim. After covering the body with the blanket I began to speak with the two females who were standing by.

I asked if both females would speak with me over by my patrol vehicle and I identified both females as Sarah Blackmon and Kim Hay. They had informed me the train conductor asked if anyone on board had medical training when they both acknowledged they did. They went outside with the conductor to then see the body. Blackmon said she had seen the body and stated it appeared he had been dead for a while. She had also mentioned it appeared as though something may have been eating at the mouth area of the victim. Hay did not have much further to add to Blackmon's information and I provided that information to Sgt. Don who had arrived on scene in addition the rest of CID. Det. Shackleton asked me to see if they were willing to fill out written statements. I returned to Hay and Blackmon and both were willing to fill out statements. Hay provided a statement and Blackmon initially wrote what appeared to be medical notes. I asked if she could elaborate from how she arrived to the body and she added some more to the statement. Upon completion of them finishing their statements, I located the conductor and had him bring them back on board the train.

I returned to Sgt. Don and both Sgt. Martinez and I proceeded to conduct a search of the area for possible evidence related to the incident. We performed a line sweep search and located numerous pieces of evidence that we flagged with yellow number triangles for detectives to examine and document. The coroner had also arrived on scene and upon completion of Detectives photographing the evidence I helped them bag the evidence. I then helped detectives and the coroner move and examine the body in addition to helping load the body into the back of the coroners van. After the coroner had custody of the body I cleared the call and ended my involvement.




