IX. Comments

Event Summary:

On 07/08/2017 at approximately 1720 hours Stephani Moser was struck by an Amtrak train at Milepost 49.5 on the Stillaguamish Bridge. At the time of the incident Moser was in the process of crossing the bridge, so she could climb down to the Stillaguamish river when Amtrak train 978 (Rocky Mountaineer) approached from the east. The engineer sounded the horn and placed the train in emergency braking. Moser was unable to clear the bridge in time and was struck by the left front section of the locomotive. Moser was killed on impact. The manner of death was classified as an accident.

Site Description:

The Stillaguamish bridge is a popular swimming destination for local teens. People trespass on the bridge to get to a swimming area and routinely jump from the bridge into the river. The area is marked with "no trespassing" signs on both of the bridge approaches. There is a trespass trail leading from Pioneer Highway near Hevly Road that accesses the north end of the long bridge approach and the area under the bridge. BNSF Resource Protection has made contact with many individuals at this location and has erected cable gates with "No trespassing signs that have been vandalized and removed.

Recommendations:

On May 5, 2015 a similar incident occurred that resulted in a fatality. This site should be assessed to determine if additional trespass abatement measures can be taken.

On 09/22/2017 I received a copy of the Snohomish County Medical Examiner's Office Examination Report. The report was signed by Chief Medical Examiner Daniel Selove, M.D. and was dated July 10th, 2017.

The report listed Stephani L. Moser's cause of death as blunt force injuries to the head, trunk and extremities. The manner of death was classified as an accident.


Attached to the Examination Report was the Washington State Patrol Toxicology Report. The report advised that Moser's blood alcohol was 0.020 +/- 0.0016 g/100mL. The report also advised that Moser's blood was presumptive positive for cannabinoids with a Carboxy-THC level of 18ng/mL and a THC level of 130 +/- 36ng/mL.

It should be noted that the legal limit to operate a motor vehicle in Washington State while under the influence of marijuana is having a THC concentration of 5.0 or higher. To put that in perspective, Moser's THC was between 18 and 26 times the legal limit.

On 07/08/2017 at approximately 1720 hours, Stephani Lucile Moser (4b) was struck by an Amtrak train in the 600 block of Pioneer Hwy. East, Arlington, Washington. Moser had been on a bridge belonging to Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway that crosses over the Stillaguamish River. This particular area is a popular recreation area for people to jump off the bridge and swim. In order to access the bridge to jump off, people trespass on the live tracks/bridge owned by Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway. At this time Moser was in the process of crossing the bridge so she could climb down when Amtrak train 978 (Rocky Mountaineer) enroute to Vancouver, British Columbia approached from the east. The train emergency braked to try and give Moser time to clear the bridge and get out of the way but she was not able to do so. Moser was struck by the left side of the train and was killed at the scene.

COLLISION SCENE CHARACTERISTICS

NARRATIVE

On 07/08/2017 at approximately 1728 I was contacted by Sgt. Kahler and asked to respond to the 600 block of Pioneer Hwy. East, to investigate a fatality collision involving an Amtrak train and a pedestrian on a bridge that crosses over the Stillaguamish River near the Silvana, Washington area. This particular train bridge is in the 600 block of Pioneer Hwy. East.

When I arrived, Sgt. Kahler was already on scene and briefed me about the incident prior to my arrival. He advised that Moser was with other subjects who had been jumping off of the bridge into the river below. He told me that Moser had been sitting on the bridge for a period of time and was hesitant to jump. Moser decided to not jump and was in the process of getting off of the bridge when the Amtrak train approached. The train was not able to stop and Moser was not able to clear the bridge in time and was struck. Moser was pronounced dead at the scene.

Sgt. Kahler told me that the Amtrak train engineer, conductor, train manager and another employee had all provided written statements about the incident. A friend of Moser's who was in the river at the time of the incident also provided a written statement. I responded to the area next to and below the bridge and met with fire/aid personnel. They directed me to two areas below the train tracks where they had located parts of Moser's lower extremities. In one location was Moser's entire right leg and the other was Moser's left leg from her foot to about the midway portion of her calf. I then ascended a ladder to get up to the bridge deck. Lying just to the west of the bridge on the south side of the train tracks was where Moser had come to rest. She came to rest face down with her head towards the south. The only clothing she had on was a two piece swimsuit.

I began examining the bridge looking for any evidence to indicate the area where Moser was located when she was initially struck. I located some hair and blood on the southwest side of the bridge railing. Based on the direction that Moser and the train were moving in, Moser was struck in the area just prior to where I located the blood and hair. I also walked all the over to the east side of the

bridge and observed a clearly posted sign which read, "DANGER NO TRESPASSING KEEP OFF BRIDGE BNSF RWY CO". There was also a mile post sign under the warning sign which read, "49.5". Using a roller wheel, I measured the following distances. I later constructed a diagram of the collision scene using these measurements.

1. 19' from the blood and hair to the west end of the bridge.
2. 32'10" from the blood and hair to Moser's final place of rest.
3. 203' length of bridge over the river.
4. 1464' from Moser's final place of rest to front axle of front locomotive.

I then walked down to where the train had come to a stop to inspect it. I did not see any indication that Moser was struck by the front portion of the train. I was able to find body tissue and fluids on the front axle to the locomotive on the left hand side. The fluids and tissue extended down the left side of the locomotive including the fuel tank. There was also some fluids and tissue on the left side of the second locomotive as well. Given the location of the tissue and fluids, Moser was struck by the left side of the locomotive which flung her into the side railing of the bridge deck before she cleared the bridge and came to rest.

After walking through and examining the collision scene, I retrieved my camera and took digital photographs of the scene. I later transferred the digital photos onto 2 DVD's and placed the DVD's into evidence. After I finished photographing the scene, the Snohomish County Medical Examiner's Office was contacted and asked to respond to the scene.

Investigator Tawn Midkiff arrived a short time later to complete her investigation and take custody of Moser. Investigator Midkiff provided me with her case number #17SN1012.

While Investigator Midkiff was finishing up her investigation, I looked over all of the written statements which had been taken and given to me.

STATEMENT OF OSB Child witness

(4b) advised that Moser had been up on the bridge and was the only one up there as everyone else had already jumped. (4b) said Moser had just been sitting up on the bridge because she was scared to jump and decided to walk back to the area where she climbed up. (4b) said as Moser was walking a train passed over the bridge and (4b) yelled if anybody saw Moser, but no one did. (4b) ran to climb up to the tracks but another friend climbed up instead and discovered that Moser had been struck by the train.

STATEMENT OF ENGINEER JOHN R. JONES

Engineer John Russell Jones (4b) advised that he was operating train 978 (Rocky Mountaineer) northbound at track speed (60 MPH) through the curve at approximately milepost 49.5 when he observed a female walking northbound away from him about the midpoint of the bridge. Jones said he sounded the horn and applied a set to the brakes with the hope of warning her to move and giving her time to move. At that point Jones said she began running straight down the tracks and it was apparent to Jones the female would be moving out of the foul. At this point he placed the train into emergency braking. The locomotive struck the female on the left side, approximately ¾ of the way over the bridge. Jones immediately called emergency on the radio to alert people in the vicinity and get emergency services enroute. The Conductor went back to assist once they had come to a stop and law enforcement and fire/aid arrived quickly.

STATEMENT OF CONDUCTOR DAVID M. HOWELL

Conductor David Michael Howell (4b) advised that at milepost 49 the train went into emergency and that the engineer called out a "Trespasser strike". He advised that he was in the crew car and walked back to see if the person struck could be helped. Howell advised that his responsibility on the train is Amtrak Conductor and that he rides in the middle of the train calling out speed to the engineer who drives.

STATEMENT OF HARVEY R. DYCKE

Harvey Russell Dycke (4b) advised that he was riding on the Rocky Mountaineer he heard the head call, "Emergency, emergency, emergency", and the train went into a pull set emergency. When the train came to a stop he went to the back of the train and was told by the head end that the train had struck someone on the bridge. Dycke said he got off the train and ran back to the bridge and found a body lying beside the tracks. He said there was also a male subject around 20 years of age on the tracks as well who said the female had been up on the bridge.

STATEMENT OF TRAIN MANAGER WENDY L. McMICHAEL

Train Manager Wendy Louise McMichael (4b) advised that the train stopped at milepost 49.5 at around 1720 hours after the emergency braking system was activated. McMichael advised she was seated in the crew car which is six cars back from the locomotive and initially moved forward through the train to figure out what had happened. Once McMichael was aware that someone had been struck on the tracks on the bridge behind them, she made her way to the tail end of the train. McMichael had her crew remove all passengers from the rear of the train and asked for 1st aid equipment be brought to the car. McMichael said that Harvey Dycke had already gone to the scene and let her know that 1st aid equipment would not be needed. McMichael moved forward to the scene with blankets and 1st aid equipment but did not fully view it and stayed approximately 30 feet away.

Before clearing the scene, I made telephone contact with Detective Steven Travers with the Amtrak Police Department to brief him about the collision. I asked Detective Travers if it was possible to view the onboard video from the train. He advised he would send me a secure link to do so.

I received an email from Detective Travers on 07/13/2017 with a secure link to view the video. The video shows what Engineer Jones had described in his statement. Moser was on the running on the left side of the train tracks about ¾ way across the bridge trying to get out of the way when she was struck by the left side of the train. The camera view does not show Moser being struck or what took place after she was struck. The BNSF case number is #1752002228.

CONCLUSION


In closing, this is yet another avoidable incident which ended in tragedy. The bridge where the incident occurred has clearly posted no trespassing signs which unfortunately people continue to fail to obey. There are a couple of intersections east of the bridge where Moser was struck. Trains passing through those areas sound their whistles at those locations to alert people to stay clear of the tracks

and those whistles are loud enough that they can be heard from a long distance away. The fact is that trespassing on train tracks can be a dangerous thing in and of itself. This is made even more dangerous on train bridges as your avenue for escape or to get clear of the path of the train is greatly reduced or completely taken away. Whether it is a train hauling freight which travel at slower speeds, weighs millions of pounds and can be a mile in length or a passenger train which travel at higher speeds, weighs less and is much shorter, neither train is able to slow down or stop very quickly. Also trains do not have the ability to make any evasive maneuvers to avoid collisions as their only option is to brake. In this case the train alerted Moser by sounding its horn and attempted to slow down to give her time to clear the tracks. Unfortunately Moser was not able to clear the bridge in time and avoid being struck. This case is ruled an accident and is hereby closed.

NARRATIVE
On 07/08/2017 at approximately 1728 I was contacted by Sgt. Kahler and asked to respond to the 600 block of Pioneer Hwy. East, to investigate a fatality collision involving an Amtrak train and a pedestrian on a bridge that crosses over the Stillaguamish River near the Silvana, Washington area. This particular train bridge is in the 600 block of Pioneer Hwy. East.
When I arrived, Sgt. Kahler was already onscene and briefed me about the incident prior to my arrival. He advised that Moser was with other subjects who had been jumping off of the bridge into the river below. He told me that Moser had been sitting on the bridge for a period of time and was hesitant to jump. Moser decided to not jump and was in the process of getting off of the bridge when the Amtrak train approached. The train was not able to stop and Moser was not able to clear the bridge in time and was struck. Moser was pronounced dead at the scene. Sgt. Kahler told me that the Amtrak train engineer, conductor, train manager and another employee had all provided written statements about the incident. A friend of Moser's who was in the river at the time of the incident also provided a written statement.
I responded to the area next to and below the bridge and met with fire/aid personnel. They directed me to two areas below the train tracks where they had located parts of Moser's lower extremities. In one location was Moser's entire right leg and the other was Moser's left leg from her foot to about the midway portion of her calf. I then ascended a ladder to get up to the bridge deck. Lying just to the west of the bridge on the south side of the train tracks was where Moser had come to rest. She came to rest face down with her head towards the south. The only clothing she had on was a two piece swimsuit.
I began examining the bridge looking for any evidence to indicate the area where Moser was located when she was initially struck. I located some hair and blood on the southwest side of the bridge railing. Based on the direction that Moser and the train were moving in, Moser was struck in the area just prior to where I located the blood and hair. I also walked all the over to the east side of the bridge and observed a clearly posted sign which read, "DANGER NO TRESPASSING KEEP OFF BRIDGE BNSF RWY CO". There was also a mile post sign under the warning sign which read, "49.5". Using a roller wheel, I measured the following distances. I later constructed a diagram of the collision scene using these measurements.
1. 19' from the blood and hair to the west end of the bridge.
2. 32'10" from the blood and hair to Moser's final place of rest.
3. 203' length of bridge over the river.
4. 1464' from Moser's final place of rest to front axle of front locomotive.

I then walked down to where the train had come to a stop to inspect it. I did not see any indication that Moser was struck by the front portion of the train. I was able to find body tissue and fluids on the front axle to the locomotive on the left hand side. The fluids and tissue extended down the left side of the locomotive including the fuel tank. There was also some fluids and tissue on the left side of the second locomotive as well. Given the location of the tissue and fluids, Moser was struck by the left side of the locomotive which flung her into the side railing of the bridge deck before she cleared the bridge and came to rest.

After walking through and examining the collision scene, I retrieved my camera and took digital photographs of the scene. I later transferred the digital photos onto 2 DVD's and placed the DVD's into evidence. After I finished photographing the scene, the Snohomish County Medical Examiner's Office was contacted and asked to respond to the scene.

Investigator Tawn Midkiff arrived a short time later to complete her investigation and take custody of Moser. Investigator Midkiff provided me with her case number #17SN1012.

While Investigator Midkiff was finishing up her investigation, I looked over all of the written statements which had been taken and given to me.

STATEMENT OF 03B Child witness

(4b) advised that Moser had been up on the bridge and was the only one up there as everyone else had already jumped. said Moser had just been sitting up on the bridge because she was scared to jump and decided to walk back to the area where she climbed up. said as Moser was walking a train passed over the bridge and yelled if anybody saw Moser, but no one did. ran to climb up to the tracks but another friend climbed up instead and discovered that Moser had been struck by the train.

STATEMENT OF ENGINEER JOHN R. JONES

Engineer John Russell Jones (4b) advised that he was operating train 978 (Rocky Mountaineer) northbound at track speed (60 MPH) through the curve at approximately milepost 49.5 when he observed a female walking northbound away from him about the midpoint of the bridge. Jones said he sounded the horn and applied a set to the brakes with the hope of warning her to move and giving her time to move. At that point Jones said she began running straight down the tracks and it was apparent to Jones the female would be moving out of the foul. At this point he placed the train into emergency braking. The locomotive struck the female on the left side, approximately 3/4 of the way over the bridge. Jones immediately called emergency on the radio to alert people in the vicinity and get emergency services enroute. The Conductor went back to assist once they had come to a stop and law enforcement and fire/aid arrived quickly.


STATEMENT OF CONDUCTOR DAVID M. HOWELL

Conductor David Michael Howell (4b) advised that at milepost 49 the train went into emergency and that the engineer called out a "Trespasser strike". He advised that he was in the crew car and walked back to see if the person struck could be helped. Howell advised that his responsibility on the train is Amtrak Conductor and that he rides in the middle of the train calling

STATEMENT OF HARVEY R. DYCKE

Harvey Russell Dycke (4b) advised that he was riding on the Rocky Mountaineer he heard the head call, "Emergency, emergency, emergency", and the train went into a pull set emergency. When the train came to a stop he went to the back of the train and was told by the head end that the train had struck someone on the bridge. Dycke said he got off the train and ran back to the bridge and found a body lying beside the tracks. He said there was also a male subject around 20 years of age on the tracks as well who said the female had been up on the bridge.

STATEMENT OF TRAIN MANAGER WENDY L. McMICHAEL

Train Manager Wendy Louise McMichael (4b) advised that the train stopped at milepost 49.5 at around 1720 hours after the emergency braking system was activated.

McMichael advised she was seated in the crew car which is six cars back from the locomotive and initially moved forward through the train to figure out what had happened. Once McMichael was aware that someone had been struck on the tracks on the bridge behind them, she made her way to the tail end of the train. McMichael had her crew remove all passengers from the rear of the train and asked for 1st aid equipment be brought to the car. McMichael said that Harvey Dycke had already gone to the scene and let her know that 1st aid equipment would not be needed. McMichael moved forward to the scene with blankets and 1st aid equipment but did not fully view it and stayed approximately 30 feet away.

Before clearing the scene, I made telephone contact with Detective Steven Travers with the Amtrak Police Department to brief him about the collision. I asked Detective Travers if it was possible to view the onboard video from the train. He advised he would send me a secure link to do so.

I received an email from Detective Travers on 07/13/2017 with a secure link to view the video.

The video shows what Engineer Jones had described in his statement. Moser was on the running on the left side of the train tracks about 3/4 way across the bridge trying to get out of the way when she was struck by the left side of the train. The camera view does not show Moser being struck or what took place after she was struck. The BNSF case number is #1752002228.


CONCLUSION

In closing, this is yet another avoidable incident which ended in tragedy. The bridge where the incident occurred has clearly posted no trespassing signs which unfortunately people continue to fail to obey. There are a couple of intersections east of the bridge where Moser was struck. Trains passing through those areas sound their whistles at those locations to alert people to stay clear of the tracks and those whistles are loud enough that they can be heard from a long distance away. The fact is that trespassing on train tracks can be a dangerous thing in and of itself. This is made even more dangerous on train bridges as your avenue for escape or to get clear of the path of the train is greatly reduced or completely taken away. Whether it is a train hauling freight which travel at slower speeds, weighs millions of pounds and can be a mile in

length or a passenger train which travel at higher speeds, weighs less and is much shorter, neither train is able to slow down or stop very quickly. Also trains do not have the ability to make any evasive maneuvers to avoid collisions as their only option is to brake. In this case the train alerted Moser by sounding its horn and attempted to slow down to give her time to clear the tracks. Unfortunately Moser was not able to clear the bridge in time and avoid being struck. This case is ruled an accident and is hereby closed.
