






Notes/Narrative

On 07/24/17 at 0450 hours Officers were dispatched to the intersection of N Edison St/W Metaline Ave. for a report by Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railroad (BNSF) that a male had just been hit by a train on the tracks near that location.

Upon arrival I contacted a BNSF crew member who was with the male about 50 yard to the east of Edison St. on the north side of the tracks. The male, who I knew to be Travis Lepoidevin from an earlier contact, was lying about four feet from the tracks on his back. Lepoidevin was bleeding from a gouge to the upper head.

KFD Medics arrived and transported Lepoidevin to Trios ER.

Photographs of Lepoidevin's position the train were taken by Officer Rosser. (See attached photographs.)

I contacted the following crew that was aboard the engine:

Student Engineer - Evan Steven Kunk

Engineer - Russell E Gohl

Conductor - Jay R Lewis

Brakeman - Aaron J Thompson

Kunk was driving the train under the supervision of Gohl.

Thompson was the only one of the three not to witness Lepoidevin getting hit by the train.

The three who did witness all said they saw Lepoidevin sitting on the north track with his feet on the outside of the track. He did not appear to be reacting to the train coming toward him. At the very last moment before being hit they said he turned his head toward the train.

I had contacted Lepoidevin at about 0300 hours at 5605 W Metaline #9 for a disturbance in which he was having an argument with his brother, Brian Lepoidevin. Travis appeared highly agitated at the time and was speaking very fast. Brian requested Travis leave the location. I last observed Travis walking north on N Edison St from W Metaline Ave.

I contacted Lepoidevin's residence and advised them of the accident and Travis's location.

On 07/24/17 at approximately 0610 hours I recieved a phone call from Sgt Blosser regarding this collision. I responded and arrived at approximately 0645 hours.

I spoke with Sgt. Blosser, who provided a disposition regarding the collision. I was introduced to Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) supervisor Josh Robinson. Robinson is the Terminal Manager for BNSF railroads in Kennewick.

Traffic Officer Banner, Robinson and myself walked the scene. Two other BNSF supervisors were also on scene with us.

Officer Banner tooks additional photographs of the scene. He also painted several key locations and/or evidence items.

I created a handwritten sketch of the scene. I later used this sketch to indicate locations of marked GPS points with the City of Kennewick Public Works Dept (Survey crew).

Officer Banner and I were able to locate the most likely point of impact. Interviews with the BNSF employees driving the train at the time of the collision indicated that the male victim (identified as Travis Lepoidevin) was sitting on or immediately next to the north rail of the track. We were able to follow a trail of blood from Lepoidevin's final resting place back (west) to the tracks. It appears that after being struck, Lepoidevin was knocked to the east approximately 50 feet. His body came to rest on the north side of the tracks.

We continued walking to the east. Approximately 1/4 mile east, we came to the front of the train. I noticed the welded, metal stairway affixed to the exterior of the front engine (along the north side) had a significant amount of blood on it. This stair "ladder" extends from engine by a few inches, and it most likely the part of the train that made contact with Lepoidevin first. If Lepoidevin was sitting on the tracks (or just adjacent to the north rail), the height of the stair ladder would have been about the height of Lepoidevin's head.

We made contact with the crew who had been in the engine at the time of the collision. They tested the horn for us (it worked appropriately). There was no indication of impairment by any of the BNSF employees.

Once the scene was appropriately documented (photos and markings), Officer Banner and I responded to Trios Medical Center to check on Lepoidevin's condition. Once in the ER at Trios, we learned that Lepoidevin was in surgery. Doctors and nurses in the ER

I heard that

We never met with Lepoidevin, as he was in surgery during our time at Trios. We met with several family members in the waiting room and provided the best update we could at the time. Prior to leaving, staff in the operating room wanted to give us the clothing that Lepoidevin had been wearing when he arrived at the hospital. Officer Banner collected those clothes items. **It should be mentioned that a glass pipe commonly used to smoke marijuana was found in his pants pocket.

At 0900 hours, I recieved a phone call from the Benton County Coroner (John Hansens). I was told that Lepoidevin had passed away due to the head and internal injuries he recieved. I was advised that no autopsy would be completed due to obvious injuries sustained. I concurred with this decision. Coroner Hansens requested that the body be released to family members unless it was needed for evidentiary reasons. I agreed that Lepoidevin could be released.

A press release was drafted and sent out via email.

At 1245 hours, Officer Banner and I met with COK Engineering survey crew (Scott Szendre, Matt Garrity, Steven Gross). Several locations were captured using GPS technology. A map detailing these locations will be created at a later time and added to this report.

At this time, this collision does not appear to be criminal in nature (aside from the fact that Lepoidevin was trespassing on marked private

About 0515 hours this morning I was contacted by Sgt Newton and informed KPD patrol officers were working a train versus pedestrian collision. I was told that the victim was deceased and that I needed to respond to the area of Edison and Metaline to assist.

I arrived about 0540 hours and contacted the on duty patrol officers who had been working the scene. I was told that the victim was identified as TRAVIS LEPOIDEVIN and had been taken to Trios ER and that he hadn't expired and was still being treated. I was told that he had been sitting on or near the R/R tracks just east of the crossing. Ofc Salter walked me to the location where they thought TRAVIS had been sitting and showed me the small scene. Patrol officers had taken photos of the area and had collected the victim's shirt. They found and pointed out his two shoes that had been thrown off.

It appears TRAVIS was sitting on or near the north track as the train approached. He was struck by the train and cast off northwest of the impact point. I was told by a BNSF manager that the engineer said as the train neared the crossing it activated its horn and bells as normal. This is done mile from the crossing which is listed at 40 mph. As the engineer started with the horn/bells he thought he saw a large bag on the tracks but the sun was coming up and light was dim. As they got to the crossing they realized the object on the tracks was a person which was sitting about 50 yards east of the crossing. The emergency brakes were activated but it still took the train mile to come to a stop after striking the person (TRAVIS). I was told that just as the train approached TRAVIS he turned to look at the train but didn't respond any other way. He didn't appear startled and didn't try to get out of the way. The Mgr said that the train was equipped with video but it would be several days before we could request a copy. He provided me his name as a point of contact for the video. (Josh Robinson - Terminal Manager, 546-3219/435-1375)

I painted the area where we thought TRAVIS had been sitting along with his final resting place and where his shoes had been discovered. I also found blood spatter on the rocks where it is assumed TRAVIS' body tumbled from impact. This area was painted as well. In looking at the pattern in the rocks we adjusted TRAVIS' point of impact a little further west than originally thought.

I then photographed the area and points of interest. I walked with BNSF personnel to the waiting engine roughly 1/4 mile away. We looked over the front of the train (cattle guard area) and didn't see anything indicating where TRAVIS had been struck. We did see and photograph the ladder of the train where blood was found. With the engineers help he activated both the air horn and bells to show us they were working.

COK Street dept had arrived and closed off Edison on both sides of the sitting train to relieve the off going patrol units. We kept the road closed until we finished with the scene and then opened it up for regular traffic.

Sgt Newton and I then went to Trios ER and tried to get a status on TRAVIS. We were told by the ER staff that
. They led us to the OR front desk and we were met by the Lead Nurse. She
handed us a bag with TRAVIS' boxers and pants that had been removed from the body. She told us that they found "a pipe" on the gurney when
they transferred him to the operating table. She also said "there was something hard in his pant pocket". These items were taken back to KPD,
along with his shirt and shoes and placed into evidence. As I unrolled his pants I found "the pipe" but it was just a broken piece of a glass pipe.
Inside the pant pocket I found the rest of the pipe, broken into pieces and a small amount of GVM that was still in the pipe bowl.

Sgt Newton and I contacted the COK Survey crew and arranged to meet them at 1230 to survey the scene. I went back to Trios to check on TRAVIS' status and was told he had expired about 0845 hours. I was told that the body was being moved to ICU so the family could view it then it would be released to the Coroner.

When it was time, Sgt Newton and I met the survey crew and the collision scene. They recorded the items we asked them to. Sgt Newton completed a field sketch while I instructed the survey crew the points we needed (items recorded and painted earlier). I returned to KPD and downloaded all the pictures to the "N" drive and completed this report.

As we made it to where the male subject was located on the north side of the railroad tracks I observed that the male subject was Travis Lepoidevin. I identified Lepoidevin from previous contacts including a contact earlier in the shift.

It should be noted that at approximately 0300 hours Officer Peterson and I had contacted Lepoidevin at 5605 W Metaline Ave #9. Lepoidevin had been involved in a verbal disturbance with his brother at the location and had been requested to the leave the residence prior to our departure. When Lepoidevin had departed the residence he appeared to be highly agitated and was last observed walking north bound on Edison St when we departed the location.

I assisted the medics in placing Lepoidevin on a flexible stretcher and transporting Lepoidevin to the ambulance which was parked on Edison St near the railroad tracks.

After Lepoidevin was loaded into the ambulance I obtained photographs of the overall scene. While doing so I obtained photographs of the location in which Lepoidevin had been located, the location where Lepoidevin's shoes had been located, blood and blood splatter that was present in the area where Lepoidevin was located and where it is believed the point of impact with the train was, as well as photographs of the train and where blood splatter was observed on the train.

The photographs that were obtained during the incident were downloaded onto the "N" drive and attached to the incident under an additional supplement report "Photos."

On 08/10/17 at 1300 hours I met with BNSF Sr. Claims Representative Joshua Gore.

Gore showed me video footage of this collision. The footage was from a digital camera mounted in the engine compartment of the train that struck Travis Lepoidivin.

The video clearly shows a person sitting on the tracks (the north rail). The video included sound. I could distinctly hear a loud locomotive horn blast. In conjunction, I could see the warning arms in the down and lighted position as the train crosses Edison Street. I could hear the bell tone of the crossing arms. From Lepoidivin's location, he should have seen and heard the crossing signal. He also should have heard the locomotive horn, as it was very loud.

As the train approaches Lepoidivin does not appear to make any movement to stand up or otherwise get off the track.

No other persons can be seen in the video.

This video corroborates the information that we had up to this point.

On 08/25/17 I obtained a scale drawing created by the COK traffic engineers. I have placed a copy of the CAD drawing on a CD and placed it into evidence at KPD.

I am recommending that this case be closed as no further investigation is necessary.
