IX. Comments
Event Summary:
The 17 year old boy was walking on the railroad tracks from Wapato to Toppenish with a friend when he stopped to rest and potentially fell asleep. The eastbound freight train transporting empty grain cars was traveling at 47 miles per hour when the train crew saw an object between the rails on the tracks. The train crew realized the object was a human as the victim was jumping up from the tracks and applied the emergency braking system but the train failed to stop in time and struck the boy. The boy was pronounced dead at the scene.
Site Description:
The location of the incident is on a tangent section of track with more than 1500 feet of sight distance in both directions. There is a main track and a siding track that run in a northwest/southeast direction. This location of the incident is outside the city limits of Toppenish and is surrounded by farm land. The tracks run parallel to and are directly between North Track Road and Washington Avenue.
Inspector Recommendations:
I have no recommendations as this appears to be an accident and there are no obvious signs of trespassing.



TOPPENISH, Wash. — A BNSF Railway official says one of its trains struck and killed a 17-year-old boy Saturday morning in Toppenish.


The boy, identified as Brian Kalama, was walking with a friend from Wapato to Toppenish when he stopped to rest and fell asleep partly on the train tracks, said Yakima County Coroner Jack Hawkins.



BNSF Railway spokesman Gus Melonas said the eastbound train with empty grain cars was traveling 47 mph when the crew saw the boy between the rails on the tracks.

He said the crew applied the emergency braking system but failed to stop in time. The boy

was pronounced dead at the scene.

Upon arrival, I was flagged down by a male wearing a reflective vest near N. Track Rd and E. McDonald Rd. The male who was later identified as was walking from the area of the train that was stopped just north of the intersection. I also observed a male along the roadway with wearing a backpack and dark clothing. The male in the reflective vest was identified as the conductor for the train and I was told that the guy we were out with just come out of no where. This male was identified as who stated that was his friend that got hit.
