



Brief Narrative of Incident:

0445CT – at MP 41.3 on the Bellingham Subdivision, the ROC received reports from Marysville PD that a vehicle struck U FYNFTE1 97T, line 4. This incident occurred at a road crossing (104th Street N.E.) equipped with gates, lights, and bells. Marysville PD is reporting the occupant of the vehicle to be fatally injured. There are no injuries to the crew.

Lead Locomotive (BNSF 7009) is camera equipped.

Division officers are responding, ETA 0520CT.

0633CT: Update from Trainmaster Elgin Hawkins: All responding groups on-site. First Responders conducting investigation and waiting for Medical Examiner to arrive. Crew reports to be OK...working on plan to swap out...SHPX 213334 will be set-out at Stanwood once Train has been released.

0738CT: Update from Roadmaster Paul Farley: Two private crossings were damaged. Mobilizing repair crews to replace crossing surface.

0923CT: Update from Trainmaster Elgin Hawkins: Coroner / Fire Department personnel have completed their work at scene.

Assignment: At the time of this incident, I, **Officer Kelly Pitts**, am a fully commissioned Police officer assigned to the Marysville Police Department, Patrol Division. I was wearing an authorized Marysville Police Department Patrol uniform complete with patches and badge. I drive a fully marked Marysville

Police Department Patrol vehicle equipped with emergency lights, siren and decals.

Actions: On 09/25/18, at approximately 0228 hours, I was dispatched to the report of a collision at the listed address. The call reported that a vehicle had been struck by a train and there was a person still trapped in the vehicle. The call additionally reported there was a possible death. Other Officers additionally went in route.

On my arrival, I observed a train on the tracks crossing the 104th St crossing with the train stopped. There were 2 males standing looking at the car which was smashed up and behind the crossing arm pinned into the pole for the crossing arm. The 2 males appeared surprised and in a little disbelief. I continued my way to the car and found a male subject in the driver's seat. His knees were up to his chest, and his head lay toward the right. He had one eye still open but was not blinking. I believed there was no sign of life and checked for a pulse but did not get one.

I took some initial photos of the vehicle. The rocks spread across the road there indicated the vehicle had been drug from south to north. I continued check for further sing of where the vehicle had been initially struck. Officer Wiersma had been collecting statements from the 2 males initially there and a 3 male that had walked over from the other side of the train, who lived in the neighborhood off 104th St. Officer Wiersma walked the west side of the tracks while I walked the east side of the tracks looking to see if there was not some other person in the vehicle when it was struck. I walked to the end of the train and met up with Wiersma, approximately 200 yards south of the crossing. We began to see marks on the track indicating it might be shorting out or a ground vault or arcing as there were white marks on it the track every 20 feet or so, and just on the east side rail, on the inside of the track. We then spotted a few car parts which appeared to have been fresh with a little oil on them. We got to a crossing near the back side of Grocery outlet and could see drag marks across the crossing indicating the vehicle got drug across that point. We continued south on the tracks.

Officer Wiersma and I continued to find more car parts and each of the private crossings found drag marks on the east side of the tracks and gravel spread across it. We also would find various car parts,

gears, windshield wipers, lighting equipment, etc. I had not found a location where there appeared to be an initial impact where a lot of car parts would have been lost on initial contact. We continued south and just past the Pilchuck Rentals store, located a spot on the track that appeared to be the initial point of contact with the train as there were vehicle parts strewn about. This is approximately 75-100 yards north of the 88th St crossing. There were tire marks in the grass between the tracks and State Ave.

I was able to ascertain 2 points where it appeared the vehicle heading southbound struck the curb and the wheels exited the road. The tire tracks then went through the grass and continued toward the ballast of the support around the tracks leading to the impact area of the debris of car parts.

Sgt. Davis met Officer Wiersma and me at the location. I pointed out to him the tracks in the grass and marks on the curb which he marks with paint. I received a ride back to the initial location on 104th St. The collision investigation team had arrived on scene and took over.

I cleared the call. When I returned to the department, I transferred the photos I took to our department media storage drive.

This document was submitted on a device that is owned, issued or maintained by the Marysville Police Department, which is an identified criminal justice agency in Washington State.

INVESTIGATIVE PROCESS

On 9/25/2018 at approximately 0300 hours I received a call out notification for a train vs. car collision at the rail road crossing at 104th St. NE and State Ave. Marysville, WA. 98270.

Officer Pitts had been the first responding Patrol officer on scene.

I arrived on scene at approximately 0403 hours and received a briefing regarding the collision:

The driver of Vehicle 1 (a passenger car) was fatally injured after driving southbound on State Ave and leaving the roadway in the approximately 9000 block, driving into Vehicle 2 (a northbound BNSF freight train) and striking the train. Vehicle 1 became lodged under the train and was dragged northbound on the tracks for approximately 14 blocks where it apparently dislodged from the train after making contact with the raised pavement at the 104th St. NE railroad crossing.

Vehicle 1 came to rest off the tracks in front of the crossing arm post for west bound traffic.

Driver 1 was deceased at the scene.

The train had been northbound and came to rest north of 116th St. NE. after sensors indicated that the train was dragging something.

Officer Pitts, Officer Wiersma, Officer Lawrenson, Sgt. Davis, Officer Riches, and Detective McShane had arrived ahead of me.

Officer Pitts and Officer Wiersma walked the track prior to my arrival, checking for potential additional vehicle 1 passengers and debris. The Officers located the point where Vehicle 1 left the roadway in the approximately 9000 block of State Ave. and the point of impact with the train, which was the 4th car in the train lineup.

Officer Riches was in the process of taking photos.

Det. McShane was in the process of scanning the scene with Faro 3D scanner.

Upon my arrival I observed Vehicle 1 at its resting position just in front of the crossing arm pole on 104th St. NE.

The driver was still in the vehicle and the train was still across the roadway and stopped.

I started to try to find next of kin and located a phone number for Faith Fadden (425) 357-5612. There was no answer.

I then learned that a coworker of Craig Fadden, Stephanie from Amazon (at (253) 221-8275) had called 911 on 9/21/2018 to have Fadden's welfare checked, due to a text message Fadden had sent her, saying he had "been compromised and to send help". See incident # 2018-00052919.

I called Stephanie's phone number but there was no answer. I located possible next of kin names William Fadden, Wendy Gendron and Frank Fadden.

Sgt. Franzen and Detective Bartl attempted to contact next of kin at 12407 48th Dr. NE. but there was no answer at that time.

Medical Examiner Mike Ashton arrived on scene at approximately 0623 hours and processed the scene.

In preparation to extract Fadden from the vehicle I called for the fire department.

Fire arrived at approximately 0643 hours and began to cut the vehicle apart in order to remove Fadden from the vehicle.

Ashton took custody of Fadden's body and personal items such as his wallet, and some light sabers. ME Ashton provided ME case # 180925-62 and later transported Fadden to the ME's office.

A backpack located in Fadden's vehicle contained some cologne, neatly packed clothing, several rolled up charging cables, and a dog barking collar. The backpack appeared to have been packed for a short overnight trip.

I later booked the backpack into the evidence room for safe keeping.

Dick's towing was called to remove the vehicle. The tow truck arrived on scene at approximately 0710 hours and towed the vehicle with a flat-bed truck.

BNSF resumed normal traffic at approximately 0804 hours.

AMBIENCE

Dark and approximately 47 degrees Fahrenheit.

ROADWAY DESCRIPTION

The roadway where Vehicle 1 came to rest was the Rail road crossing on 104th St. NE. just west of State Ave. This street is a 2 lane street, 1 lane in each direction, running east/west from State Ave. into a neighborhood. This street is the only entry/exit to this neighborhood.

The roadway was dry.

WITNESS STATEMENTS

Hicks DOB 12/10/1994) did not witness the collision itself but observed Vehicle 1 at its resting position post collision at 104th St. NE. and called 911. All three provided written statements. Sam and Jim stated at the scene to Officer Wiersma that they had been southbound on State Ave. and observed the train traveling northbound.

Sam and Jim stated they went to turn westbound on 104th St. to drop off Sam at his house. When they turned onto 104th St. they saw the train stopped and they saw the car (Vehicle 1). They stated they hoped nobody was in the car.

Jim and Sam walked up to the car, they saw the driver inside and called 911.

Officer Wiersma then spoke to Marc, who had been on his way to work and was parked on the west side of the tracks at the 104th St. crossing.

Marc stated he thought he heard something while he was still at his house, but was not sure. Marc stated he pulled up to the train crossing and saw the train going northbound, thinking to himself "crap, it's a long one".

Marc stated the train then began to slow down and stopped.

Officer Xiong contacted the train conductor, Darren J. Brian DOB 9/1/1981. Brian was located in the front engine which was stopped in the 12000 block of Smokey Point Blvd (State Ave,).

Brian told Officer Xiong he was not aware they struck anything until the train sensors alerted him to the fact that the train was dragging something. Brian immediately activated the brakes to bring the train to a stop.

Brian stated the alert notified him exactly where something was dragging. Brian got out of the train and walked to the area indicated on the alert.

Brian stated there was a car door attached to the oil car and it looked like it had hit at a fast speed.

Brian stated they received the alert at mile post 40.6 and estimated it was south of the bridge which is past the McDonalds (9720 State Ave) and out of sight from State Ave.

Brian stated he did not know where the impact with the vehicle occurred but stated the vehicle impacted with the 4th (train) car back from the engine.

Brian stated he did not know if the alert notified him immediately upon the impact or if there was a delay. Brian further stated he is fairly new to the job.

Officer Xiong walked to the 4th car of the train and saw what appeared to be parts from a vehicle and a Seahawks hat wedged between two metal wheels.

Officer Xiong then spoke with a track tech who informed him that there is a sensor at the private railroad crossing at 92nd St. which would have alerted the conductor if something was dragging. Officer Xiong was informed that more than likely that is where the alert was triggered.

The driver was Craig J. Fadden DOB 6/17/1987. Fadden's vehicle was a silver 2004 Dodge Neon coupe, bearing WA plates AWN8228, registered to Fadden..

BNSF train engineer at the time of the collision was Darren J. Brian DOB 9/1/1981.

OCCUPANT KINEMATICS

Fadden was in the driver's seat. The front end crush damage of the car was so severe that Fadden's knees were pushed and pinned up against his chest by the dash board and steering wheel. Fadden was pinned between the dash board and the back of his seat so tightly that the car had to be cut in half to extract Fadden from the vehicle.

SCENE ANALYSIS

I observed a pair of tire and scrape marks on the railroad crossing at the start of the pavement, leading from the south side of 104th St. NE. from the area of the railroad tracks, towards the north side of 104th St. NE. and eastward to where Vehicle 1 came to rest next to the crossing arms east of the tracks. It is my conclusion that the vehicle was dislodged from under the train when it struck the raised pavement of the RR crossing at 104th St. NE.

VEHICLE ANALYSIS

The contact damage on the vehicle was on the front and the sides near the front end, as well as the roof, with induced damage in the rear end and rear sides.

Contact and induced damage indicates an approximately 1 o'clock PDOF off center on the right half of the front end. A 1 o'clock PDOF is consistent with the fact that vehicle 1 was traveling southbound and was hit by the train traveling northbound, then rotated around (rear end towards the left) and being pinned under the train, which caused the rest of the front end to also suffer extensive damage.

Vehicle 2 sustained some contact damage.

The vehicle became wedged under the train and was dragged northbound to the 104th St.NE. rail road crossing, where the vehicle was dislodged from under the train by the impact with the pavement at the railroad crossing. Fadden's vehicle came to rest just east of the tracks and north of 104th St. NE.

PRE-COLLISION

Driver 1/ Vehicle 1 left his grand parents' residence where he was temporarily staying around 0200 hours. Driver 1 was southbound on State Ave. According to video footage Sgt. Davis was able to view from a business in the 9200 block of State Ave. Driver 1 appeared to be traveling at a normal speed, which is 30-35 mph in that area (Speed limit is 30 mph)

Vehicle 2 was northbound on the rail road tracks.

COLLISION DYNAMICS

Vehicle1 collided with Vehicle 2 (4th car of the train) at approximately a 65 degree angle, causing an approximately 1 o'clock PDOF. This means Vehicle 1 made initial contact with Vehicle 2 with the right half of the front end. Vehicle 1 was then rotated clockwise, causing the rest (left portion) of the front end to make contact with Vehicle 2.

The front end damage overall was so severe that I determined Vehicle 1 must have gained speed after hitting the curb and traveling uphill towards the train.

Had Vehicle 1 not gained speed the impact with the curb prior to the collision and the fact that Vehicle 1 was traveling uphill towards the tracks would naturally have slowed down Vehicle 1 and the impact would not have been lessened.

Both vehicles came into contact on the train tracks in the approximately 9000 block of State Ave.

POST-COLLISION

Vehicle 1 became dislodged from under the train by the impact with the pavement at the railroad crossing at 104th St. NE. After being dislodged Vehicle 1 came to rest just east of the tracks and north of 104th St. NE.

I was advised that next of kin had been notified later at 12407 48th Dr. NE. after a family member or friend had recognized Fadden's vehicle on the news.

Sqt. Davis and I went to 12407 48th Dr. NE. Marysville, WA. 98270 and contacted Faith Fadden, who lives there and is Fadden's grandmother.

Faith stated she lives there with her husband Frank Fadden who is Fadden's grandfather.

Faith was home alone at this time and we offered to give Faith information about the scene, to answer questions she had and asked if she was willing to give us some background on Fadden and his recent history.

Faith told us the following about Fadden:

Faith stated Fadden had recently started to change. Fadden was a very nice family man and good son and grandson.

Fadden had a girlfriend of 7 years, Katie Simmons, and two young daughters, 1 and 3 years old.

Recently Fadden and Katie had argued a lot and were starting to have problems with their relationship.

Katie had told Faith that Fadden had changed ever since he "changed his hairstyle". Faith did not know when exactly that was, but stated it was recently.

Faith stated Fadden went from being very mellow and easy going to sometimes being like 2 different people, sometimes having episodes of extreme anger, like she had never seen him before.

Faith stated she had often told Fadden to "crap or get off the pot" about marrying Katie, since they were

obviously a nice family and loved each other and had been together long enough to make it official.

Faith stated after Katie and Fadden started having relationship issues Fadden suddenly told Katie on 9/20/2018 (Thursday) that he just wanted to leave and that he wanted to move out from his and Katie's house at 4916 Sunnyside Blvd. Marysville, WA. 98270.

Fadden packed up all his belongings and the 1 year old daughter and one of their dogs and showed up at Faith's house, asking to move in with his grandparents.

Faith agreed and Fadden moved all of his things in a room they had available for him.

Faith stated since that day is when she noticed a drastic change in Fadden.

Faith stated Fadden would suddenly turn into another person, very angry and/or worried and paranoid. Faith stated it was obvious to her that Fadden was trying to hide this other side of him from her and Frank whenever it started surfacing.

Between Thursday and Sunday sometime Fadden suddenly packed up all his things again and went back to his house and asked Katie to elope with him to Vegas.

Katie did not say no, but voiced concern for not being able to just up and leave, having responsibility for 2 small children, told Fadden we can't just leave.

Fadden suddenly got very upset and devastated, apparently taking Katie's comment as rejection to his marriage proposal.

Fadden once again packed all his things, the 1 year old daughter and the dog, and went back to his grandparents' house.

Faith stated Fadden was acting odd and on Sunday night he packed up his daughter and the dog and drove to Seattle.

Faith stated Fadden was obsessed with speaking to one of his Amazon supervisors who had offered him a promotion and he was going to go interview with him Sunday night.

Faith stated very early Monday morning she got a phone call from the Tulalip Police department. Fadden had ended up out of gas at the Tulalip Casino, with his daughter and dog, and told the staff at the hotel reception desk to call 911, that people are trying to kill him, and to please call help.

Faith stated the Police Officer advised her Fadden was confused, paranoid, and had a hard time answering questions.

The Officer told Faith that he had to call CPS due to Fadden's state of mind while having a 1 year old in his charge, but since the child did look healthy and well taken care of he thought it was best to release

the child to Faith.

The next day, Monday, around 2130 hours Fadden was determined again to drive to Seattle with his daughter to talk to his boss about his promotion.

Faith knew something wasn't right, especially after the phone call she had gotten from the police, and that no one interviews or talks to their boss about a promotion after 2130 hours at night.

Being careful not to trigger anything in Fadden Faith simply offered to go with them, that way she could make sure her granddaughter was safe and she could keep Fadden from getting into a situation like the night before.

Faith asked Fadden which car they should drive, hoping he would agree to taking her van instead of his "souped up" modified sports car, also to have more control of the night.

Fadden was very distracted and frantic going back and forth about which car to take, in and out of the house, needing this and that to take with them, and changing his mind several times.

Faith finally suggested for them to just go in her van. They then left for Seattle. While in Seattle Fadden acted strange and very back and forth and erratic, wanting Faith to turn here and there and trying to lead her down wrong way streets. During this time Fadden kept talking about his promotion at Amazon. Faith thought it was odd but went along with everything until around 2330, when they still hadn't arrived at wherever it was Fadden was trying to go, so she suggested "let's just go home and come back tomorrow".

Fadden calmed down and agreed.

They arrived home around midnight, put the baby to bed and put the dog away.

Faith and her husband Frank got ready for bed. Faith later learned from her son (Fadden's father Trent) that Fadden called him after they arrived back home wanting to talk, and acting very strange.

Around 0200 Monday morning Faith stated Frank heard the distinct sound of Fadden's engine of his car starting up.

Knowing that Fadden had been acting strange and something seemed off Frank hurried to the driveway to check on Fadden and talk him into going to bed. By the time Frank got outside Fadden had already left in his car.

Fadden did however not take his daughter or dog with him this time.

Faith stated Fadden never drank alcohol or used drugs and didn't smoke. He was a very health

conscious person, only buying organic food, and always making sure not to consume anything that was bad for you.

Faith stated Fadden was never diagnosed with anything since he hadn't shown any signs of anything wrong until very recently. Fadden's behavior change was so new to them that they hadn't come to the conclusion anything was wrong yet.

Frank and Trent and one of Fadden's uncles arrived and we filled them in on our conversation and asked if anyone had questions.

A few questions were asked regarding if we thought Fadden suffered or if he died immediately and about locations of impact and the car.

I then made arrangements for the next day to get Fadden's backpack released to them.

9/27/2018 Today I brought Fadden's backpack to Fadden's family and released it to them. Fadden's mother Wendy signed the property room release form.

CONCLUSION

Driver 2 was northbound on the railroad tracks. Driver 1 was southbound on State Ave. in the 9000 block of State Ave. with light to no traffic on State Ave. Driver 1 left the roadway, hit the curb and drove uphill towards the train, apparently gaining speed as he drove towards the tracks.

Vehicle 1 was pinned under the train and dragged for approximately 14 blocks. The driver was deceased at the scene.

Due to Driver 1's recent state of mind it is unknown if Driver 1 intended to collide with the train or if something else caused him to leave the road way and collide with the train. No criminal intent is suspected.

I (<u>Officer A.D. Wiersma 0052</u>), am a fully commissioned Police officer assigned to the Marysville Police Department, Patrol Division located within Snohomish County, in the State of Washington. I was wearing a full police uniform with patches and driving a fully marked police car.

On Tuesday 9/25/2018 at about 02:30 hours Officers were dispatched to a car train collision at 104th St NE and State Ave NE in Marysville, WA. I arrived on scene after several other officers. I saw that the train was stopped and that there was a silver car next to the train on the east side of the crossing. The car was severely damaged and there was male in the driver's seat that was obviously deceased.

I contacted Samuel Smith and Jimi Hicks on the east side of the tracks. They stated that they were south bound on State Ave and saw the train which was north bound. They stated that they went to turn west on 104 Street so they could go to Sam's house to drop him off. They stated that the train was stopped and they saw the car. They stated that they hoped that nobody was in the car and they walked up to it and saw the body in the car and called 911. They did not see the collision.

I then contacted Marc Stitsel who was parked on the west side of the tracks right at the crossing. Marc lives at 3821 104th St NE and was on his way to work. Marc stated that he thought he heard something while he was in the house but was not sure. He stated that he pulled up to the tracks and saw the train going northbound and thought, crap it's a long one. He stated then it started to slow down and stopped. He stated that he did not see the collision.

I collected a statement from Samuel, Jimi, and Marc. I gave the statements to Sgt. Davis. I then helped Samuel and Jimi cross the tracks so they could walk to Sam's house.

Officer Pitt's and I walked the tracks from 104th St southbound to see if we could find a point of impact and or any signs of anyone else being in the vehicle. I walked the west side of the tracks and Officer

Pitts walked the eastside. We located car parts along the tracks from 104th St to about 75-125 yards north of 88th St NE. We found were the vehicle had left State Ave and entered the ditch and then up onto the tracks. It appeared that the vehicle was going southbound on State Ave in about the 8800 block left the road and went up onto the tracks colliding with the side of the train as the train was passing northbound. From what we were seeing and the drag marks it appears that the car was dragged by the train from just north of 88th ST NE to 104th ST NE.

I returned to my vehicle and then blocked the southbound outside lane of State Ave in about the 8800 block while Marysville's Collison Investigation Team investigated the collision.

On Tuesday, September 25, 2018, at approximately 0230 hours, officers responded to the railroad crossing at 104th ST and State AVE, for a vehicle versus train collision. Dispatch advised it is a fatality collision.

I arrived and observed a silver vehicle on the east side of the railroad tracks to the right of 104th ST. I noticed the vehicle had significant damages and was unrecognizable. I could see parts of what looked like a body in the driver's seat crunched in between vehicle parts.

I was asked to contact the conductors to see if they knew what happened. I drove northbound on State AVE past 116th ST and near the 12000 block of State AVE, I observed the engine car stopped.

I contacted conductor Darren J. Brian DOB 9/1/1981 who stated he was not aware they struck anything until he got an alert that the train was dragging something so they immediately proceeded to stop the train. Brian said the alert notified them exactly where something was dragging so he went back and checked the area where it was alerting. Brian said it looked like a car door was attached to the oil car which looks like it hit at a fast speed.

I later asked Brian where about they received the alert. Brian said they got the alert at mile post 40.6 and estimated it was south of the bridge which is past the McDonalds and out of site from State AVE. Brian again said he has no idea where the vehicle hit the train car since it did not strike the engine car so he wouldn't have known if anything struck the train. Brian said the vehicle hit the 4th car back from the engine.

I asked Brian if the alert is notified right at the time of impact or if there is a delay which he did not know exactly and mentioned he is fairly new to the job.

I walked back to the 4th car and observed what appeared to be parts from a vehicle that must have been caught and dragged until the train stopped then fell off. Brian pointed out to a blue Seahawks baseball type hat wedged stuck in between two metal wheels.

I returned to the front by the engine cars and spoke with a track tech who advised me there is a sensor by the private crossing around 92nd ST which would have alerted the conductor if something was dragging. I was informed more than likely that is when the alert was triggered. The sensor will detect if anything is dragging along the tracks. We concluded the accident must have occurred somewhere between 88th ST and 92nd ST.

This vehicle has been impounded either because it is an unauthorized vehicle within the meaning of RCW 46.55.010(14), the driver was arrested and the vehicle was impounded per RCW 46.55.113, the driver was driving or had physical control of the vehicle while under the influence of intoxicants, the driver had no valid driver's license, or the driver's license is suspended by the Department of Licensing.

VEHICLE RELEASE: Only the legal owner, the registered owner, a person authorized in writing by the registered owner or the vehicle's insurer, a person who is determined and verified by the operator to have the permission of the registered owner of the vehicle or other item of personal property registered or titled with the department, or one who has purchased a vehicle or item of personal property registered or titled with the department from the registered owner who produces proof of ownership or written authorization and signs a receipt therefore, may redeem an impounded vehicle. In addition, the vehicle may be released only to a person with a valid driver's license and proof of insurance. The cost of impoundment and administrative fees must be paid before the vehicle may be released. If the driver had a suspended driver's license and was the registered owner of the vehicle when it was impounded, all of his or her outstanding fines must be paid before the vehicle may be released to any person.
