NOTICE OF INTENT TO CANCEL

NOTICE OF BRIEF ADJUDICATIVE
PROCEEDING; SETTING TIME FOR
ORAL STATEMENTS

(Set for August 1, 2019, at 9:30 a.m.)

- 1 Pursuant to RCW 81.80.130, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) regulates the safe operation of motor freight carriers, including household goods carriers. WAC 480-15-450(1)(e) provides that the Commission may cancel a carrier's permit for good cause, which includes a carrier's failure to comply with applicable laws and Commission rules, including those governing the safe operation of household goods carriers.
- 2 Between April and June 2019, Commission staff (Staff) completed a review of Safe To Go Movers' (STG or Company) compliance with the requirements of WAC 480-15-555, and the safety requirements codified in WAC 480-15-560 and WAC 480-15-570. WAC 480-15-560 and WAC 480-15-570 adopt, among other provisions, Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.) Parts 390, 391, 393, 395, and 396.
- 3 In the course of its compliance investigation, Staff documented two acute violations of regulations codified in 49 C.F.R. Part 391; 122 critical violations of regulations codified in 49 C.F.R. Parts 395 and 396; 34 critical-type violations of WAC 480-15-555, three out of service vehicle violations of regulations codified in 49 C.F.R. Part 393 and 396; and various violations of 49 C.F.R. Parts 390, 391, 393, and 396, and WAC 480-15-900.
- 4 On June 13, 2019, Staff completed its compliance investigation and notified the Company that the investigation resulted in a proposed unsatisfactory safety rating for STG.
- 5 Federal law incorporated into the Commission's rules prohibits motor carriers like STG from operating beginning on the 61st day after the date of the notice of a proposed unsatisfactory rating. A carrier may request a change in its safety rating based on evidence that the company has taken corrective actions to address the identified violations and that company operations currently meet the safety fitness standard as specified in 49 C.F.R. 385.5 and 385.7.

6 STG must come into compliance with applicable laws by obtaining Commission approval of a safety management plan no later than August 13, 2019. If STG fails to come into compliance by that date, the Commission will cancel its household goods carrier permit effective August 13, 2019. STG would thereafter be prohibited from engaging in the business of a household goods carrier.

7 **THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That it intends to cancel the permit and authority of STG to provide services as a household goods carrier effective August 13, 2019, unless STG obtains Commission approval of a safety management plan prior to that date.**

8 The Company has the right to request a hearing in this matter. Due to the short time-frame determined by the upcoming deadline, and pursuant to RCW 34.05.482 and WAC 480-07-610, the Commission schedules a hearing on its own initiative and determines that a brief adjudicative proceeding is appropriate to determine whether the Commission should cancel STG's household goods carrier permit.

9 **THE COMMISSION GIVES FURTHER NOTICE That it will hold a brief adjudicative proceeding in this matter at 9:30 a.m., on August 1, 2019, in Room C-110, 621 Woodland Square Loop SE, Lacey, Washington.**

10 The record in this case will consist of any documents regarding the matter that are considered by or prepared for the presiding officer for the brief adjudicative proceeding and a transcript of any oral statements given at the hearing, which statements will be given under oath.

11 Written notice of any other stage in the proceeding or other formal proceedings that the Commission may deem appropriate will be given during the course of this case. The Commission will provide at its offices in Lacey, Washington, copies of documents in the current record for use by the parties or others who may want to review them.

12 **STG must submit its proposed safety management plan no later than 5 p.m. on July 26, 2019.** Parties wishing to submit any other documents for consideration at the brief adjudicative proceeding must file with the Commission a list enumerating and describing any such documents **no later than 5 p.m. on July 26, 2019**, and bring an original and three (3) copies of those documents to the hearing. Filing shall be in accordance with WAC 480-07-140 and -145.

13 **THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the brief adjudicative proceeding set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.**
