#### MEMO to File

July 28, 2020 – After two attempts in requesting public records for the incident and Snohomish County not cooperating, I made a telephone call to BNSF and got the following information:

The person involved in this incident and fatally injured was Alexander Stavros Tsircou, born May 8, 1997. The incident was investigated as a suicide. The train crew reported seeing the victim lying between the rails with his head positioned on the rails. The train crew reported the subject did not react to their horn and was fatally struck.

Andreas was given my contact information and asked to contact me if he discovered any information that may assist with determining why Alexander may have been on the tracks.

On 06-26-19 I created a scale diagram of the scene using CrashZone 10. The diagram was printed and attached with this report. On 06-27-19 I contacted the Snohomish County Medical Examiner's Office and was told that Tsircou's death had been classified as a suicide.

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


