IX. Comments
Event Summary:
On the evening of July 24, 2019, at approximately 4:00 p.m., multiple witnesses observed Jorge Alberto Lyon Mendez lay down between the track of an on-coming Sounder train. He reportedly sat up multiple times and looked back at the train, but continued to lay down. The engineer of the train sounded the horn multiple time and and made an emergency application of the air brakes. Jorge Alberto Lyon Mendez remained between the tracks and the train, which was traveling at approximately 70 miles per hour when it fatally struck him.
Site Description: The site is between crossings with two main tracks and one siding track.

At approximately 1800CT on the Seattle Subdivision, A 1511 1 24A reported striking a trespasser on main track 3 at MP 14.18X (S 212TH Street) between Orillia and James Street in Kent, WA which is approximately 19 miles northeast of Tacoma, WA. Currently we do not have a route around until main track 1 and 2 are released by local authorities. No injuries reported to crew or passengers. Local authorities report that the trespasser was fatally injured.

1929CT update: Good to operate trains on M1. First train operate at restricted speed over 212th street crossing. Main 2 and 3 will remain closed until investigation is complete.

On 7/24/2019 I was working as a member of the KPD traffic unit. I was just beginning a distracted driving									

emphasis when dispatch aired a train vs. pedestrian accident. I immediately went in route.

I arrived at the Burlington Northern/Santa Fe (BNSF) railroad tracks at S 212th St approximately 2 minutes later. It was immediately obvious to me the pedestrian was deceased. It appeared the deceased had been struck just

south of S 212th St. The force of the train striking the deceased caused catastrophic injury to the deceased, breaking the body into many large pieces, and many more small pieces. The pieces stretched for approximately a quarter of a mile. The train had stopped almost a half of a mile south of the point of impact.

I walked southbound along track #3 (farthest east) to the train. I contacted the assigned engineer (WIT) Shahraim C. Allen who was walking toward me. He stated he was in the back of the train while the relief engineer (WIT) Joseph L. Mcalister was in the engine. Allen stated he saw the body parts come out from under the train as it was slowing southbound. The train was a "Sounder" train belonging to Sound Transit, which carries commuters from Seattle to Lakewood. It had a full load of passengers at the time of the incident. The train was #1511A which had originally departed Seattle.

I walked to the engine and spoke with Mcalister. He stated he was operating the train southbound at approximately 70 miles per hour when he observed something on the tracks in front of the train. He said he was probably 1200' from the object, which he initially thought was a dog. As the train grew closer to the object, Mcalister realized it was a person. Mcalister stated the person was laying in between the tracks, head to the north-feet to the south. He stated the person would sit up, look back at the train, then lay down again.

Mcalister stated he activated the emergency brakes approximately 500' from the person. He believes the train was probably still traveling at approximately 70 mph when it struck the deceased.

Ofc. Brennan and I walked the entire train, inspecting every visible portion of the undercarriage for biological material. I found it did appear the deceased had been laying down, as there was no sign of an impact on the front of the train, rather it appeared the first set of wheels (trucks) of the engine impacted the deceased. We found small particles of biological material in multiple places under the engine and cars.

Ofc. Bateman attempted to use his AFIS scanner to obtain an identification on the deceased. He determined the prints were either not good enough or the deceased had no prints on file.

I again walked the scene attempting to account for most of the deceased. I found what appeared to be a pair of mens shorts. It appeared there may be something in the pocket, so I donned a pair of gloves and examined the shorts. I found a black wallet with a WA DL in it belonging to (DEC) Jorge Alberto Lyon-Mendez. It appeared the deceased possibly matched the physicals of the DL, but it was impossible to know for sure. I found no scars/marks/tattoos on the larger pieces. Ofc. Bateman had KPD records run a criminal history report for Lyon-Mendez, no criminal history was found.

The King County Medical Examiner's Office sent Forensic Medicolegal Death Investigator Alison Myrabo to the scene. When she arrived I briefed her on what I knew. She provided me KCMEO case #19-1566. We then spent the next 2 hours recovering parts of the deceased.

Kent Fire Department personnel arrived and used their apparatus to conduct a "wash down" of the immediate area.

BNSF Police Officer M. Stapleton was on scene, providing their case #1952003011.

This investigation was conducted for documenting purposes only.

This incident occurred in the City of Kent, Washington.

On 07/24/2019 at approximately 1600 hrs I responded to a train vs pedestrian incident at S. 212th St and the BNSF rail crossing. By the time I had arrived Officer Clay had already advised that the pedestrian that was hit by the train was deceased. As I walked up to the tracks I could see that force of the high speed southbound commuter train's impact on the victim's body caused it to break apart into a few large, and numerous small pieces. Based on the debris field left by the body, it appeared that the probable point of impact was just south of the S. 212th crossing, on the eastern most track. From that point there were pieces of the victim's body strewn around the tracks for about a quarter mile south.

I initially began taking photos from the ground, but due to the sure size of the scene, I decided to use my issued DJI Mavic Pro drone to take aerial photos from the point of impact to where the train had stopped on the tracks. The photos were later downloaded to our Department's secure evidence server (VERIPIC). A copy of the photos were also provided to the Medical Examiner that responded.

It should be noted that the victim was identified by his WA CDL that Officer Clay had found in a wallet that was among the debris. I attempted to use my mobile AFIS scanner to confirm his identity, but no match was found by AFIS. I also had Kent Records run his criminal history, and nothing was found. This would explain why no print matches were found.

Once the Medical Examiner was done recovering the body, and Kent Fire had washed down the tracks closest to the S. 212th St crossing, I cleared the scene. This concluded my assistance with this case.

Narrative

On 7/24/19, about 1603 hours, I was dispatched to the BNSF railroad tracks at 77 Ave S and S 212 ST in the City of Kent, County of King, State of Washington in reference to a train vs pedestrian collision.

Upon arrival, I observed that a SB Sounder train was stopped on the eastern most track south of the intersection. The pedestrian was obviously deceased as his body had been obliterated and was strewn down the track SB from the intersection. Officer Clay and I walked the debris field to the where the train was at. I then checked under each train car to make sure there were no body parts stuck under them, which there weren't. While I was doing this, Dispatch advised that two witness had called 911 to report they saw the impact and were still onscene. I advised to get contact info and advise the witnesses I would be called them.

After finishing up at the train, I called WIT Pat Roegele. She stated that she was riding in the back seat of an EB car that had been stopped at the crossing. The car was driven by her husband and her grandchild was in the front seat. She stated that she saw the pedestrian laying on the tracks and several times he sat up, looked back, and laid back down. When the train reached him, Roegele stated that the pedestrian was "sucked up" into it. I asked her if she, her husband, or grandson would like a chaplain to call or meet them and she said no as they were doing ok.

I then called WIT Baylee Williams. He stated that he was stopped at the crossing facing WB. He said the pedestrian had been walking EB, walked onto the tracks, and laid down. Williams said he yelled at the pedestrian to get up. He too stated that the pedestrian sat up and looked back several times before the train hit him. Williams said he became physically ill after witnessing the incident and was having a hard time processing it. I told him I would have a chaplain call him, which Chaplain Fors did.

After speaking with the witnesses I assisted other officers and the ME with cleaning up the scene.

At the time of the this incident I was wearing my body camera which was uploaded per policy.

This ends my involvement in this case.
