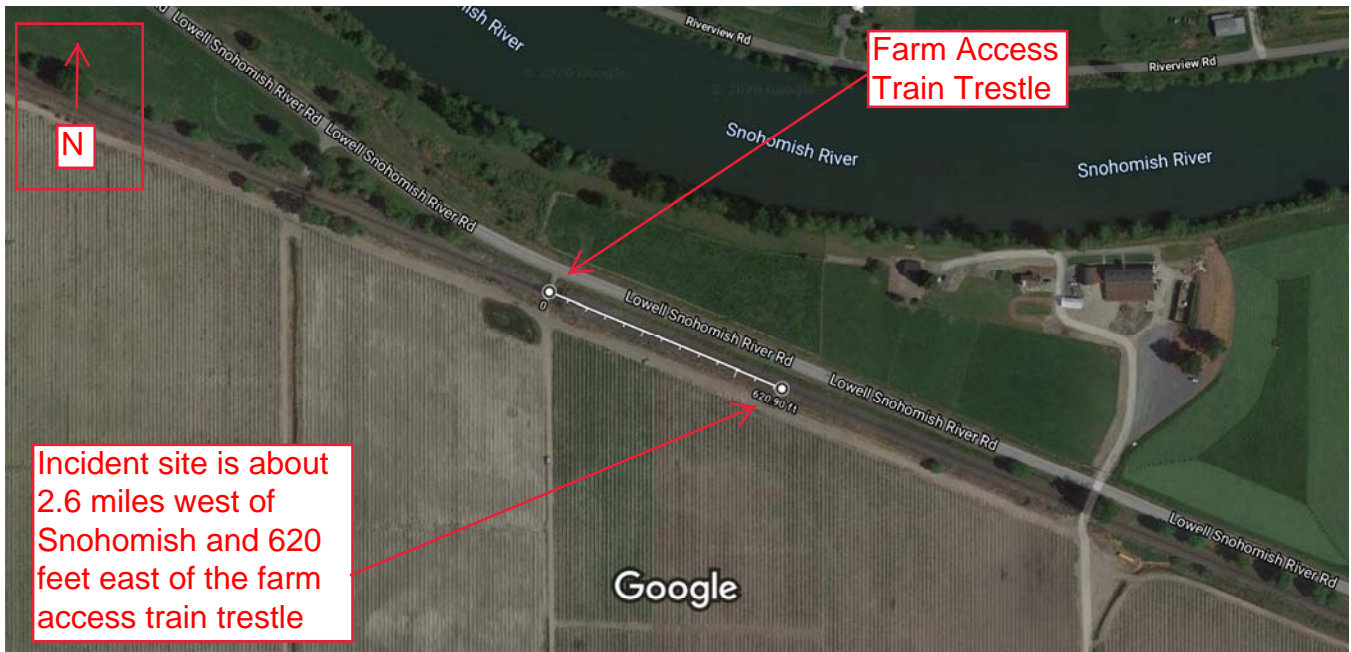

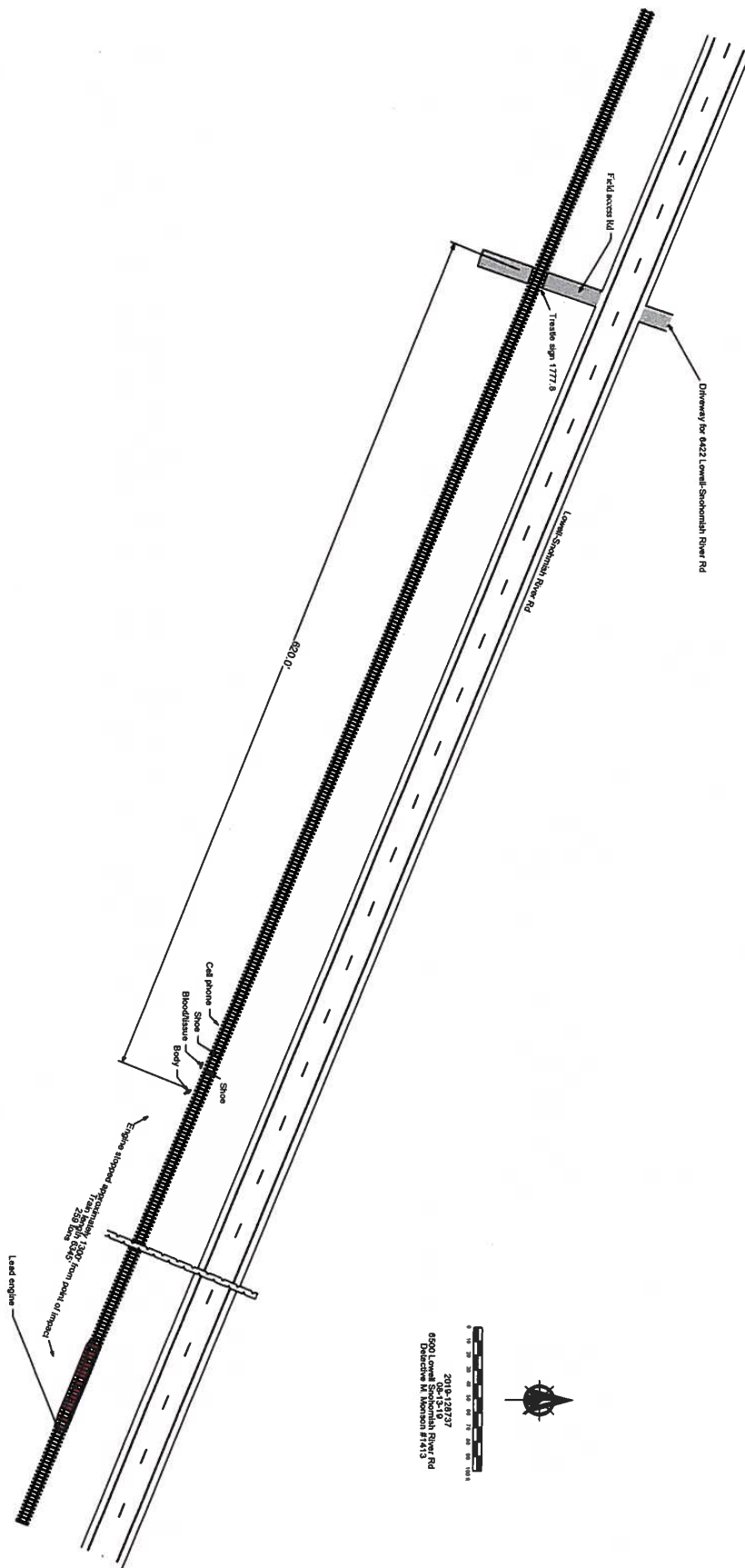

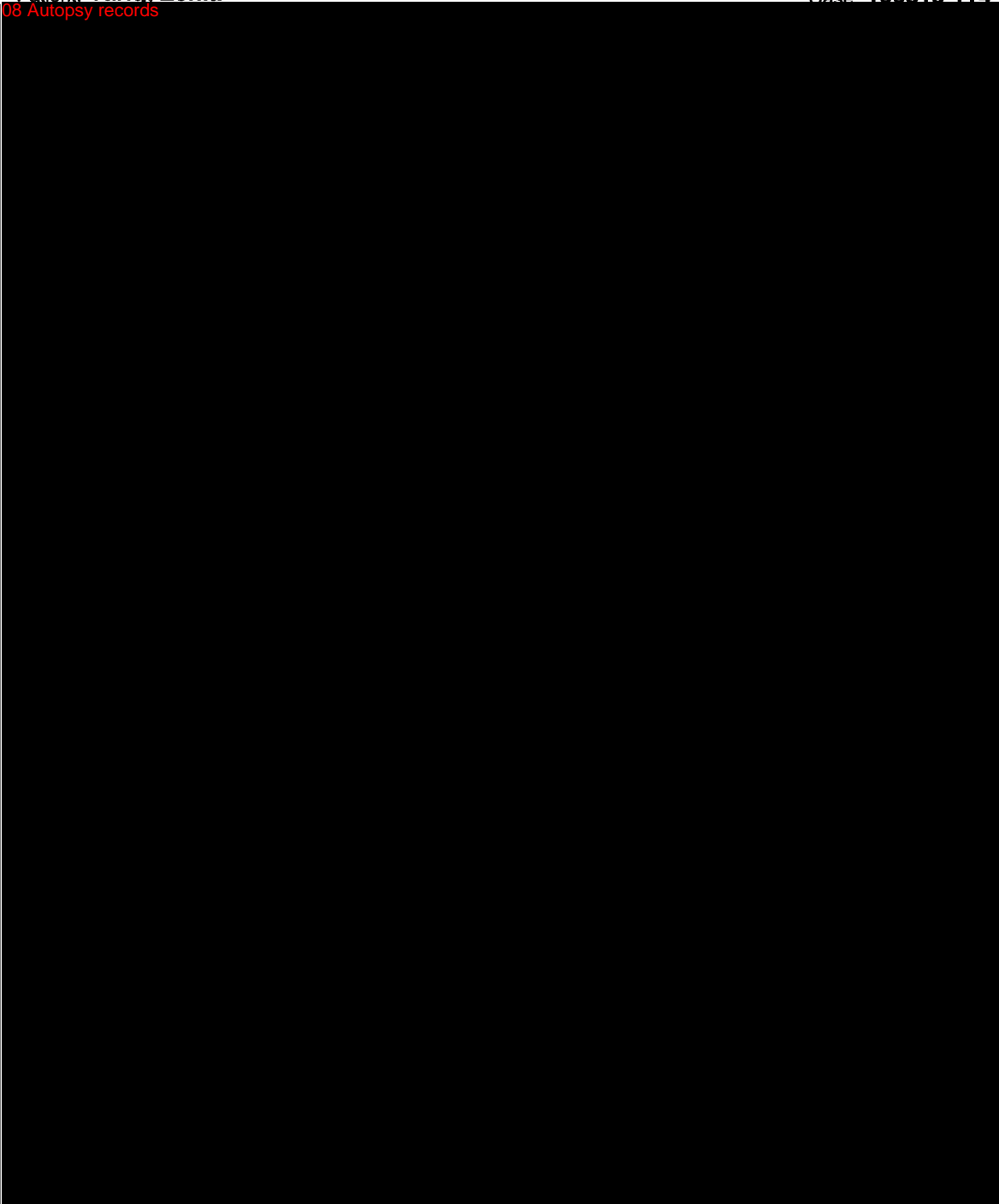

On 08-13-19 at approximately 0543 hours I responded to the 7400 block of Lowell Snohomish River Rd. for a reported train vs pedestrian collision. I was advised that a BNSF employee was reporting that the train had stopped at this location after reportedly striking a pedestrian near this location.

When I arrived I saw that an eastbound BNSF freight train was stopped on the tracks near the 7400 block of Lowell Snohomish River Rd. Several SCSO units and fire department personnel had already arrived and were searching the tracks for the pedestrian that had been struck. After several minutes a severely injured teenage female was found lying in the gravel south of the tracks approximately 1300' west of the lead engine. The female was unresponsive and had significant head and leg injuries consistent with being struck by the train. Fire department personnel attempted to administer CPR and first aid but were unable to revive the female and ultimately pronounced her deceased.

After learning that this was a fatality I examined the tracks to determine where the female had been when she was struck. I located two red shoes west of the female on the tracks between the rails. The shoes had come to rest under train cars that were stopped on the tracks approximately thirty feet west of the female. In addition to the shoes a cell phone was found in the rocks on the south side of the tracks approximately fifty feet west of the female. I saw that there were several places along the south side of the tracks between the cell phone and final rest position of the female where drops of blood and tissue were observed on the rocks. The blood and tissue on the rocks showed the post impact path of the female after she was struck by the train. I determined that the female was likely struck at or very near the location where the cell phone was located.

The female was struck in an area that is not easily accessible by foot. I noted that there were no crossings anywhere near this location and a person would have to intentionally either access the tracks by climbing up a steep embankment or walking a significant distance from the nearest crossing.

After examining the area where the female was found I walked to the front of the train to examine the lead engine. The lead engine was stopped approximately 1300 feet east of the area where the collision occurred. I examined the front of the train and saw that there was a small piece of tissue on the lower edge of the metal guard (pilot) between the railroad rails. I also saw that there was what appeared to be blood, tissue and a human tooth on the top side of the coupler at the front of the train. The coupler is located at the center of the front of the locomotive directly above the metal guard. The blood, tissue and tooth found on the coupler showed that the female had been walking or standing near the center of the tracks between the rails when she was struck.

After viewing the front of the train I contacted the conductor and engineer of the train. The engineer was identified as Jerry Ngoma and the conductor was James Olsby. Ngoma told me they were traveling eastbound towards Wenatchee when he observed a person walking on the railroad tracks towards the train. He told me he sounded the horn to warn the person but they didn't respond and continued walking directly at the train. Ngoma said the person appeared to be aware the train was approaching and didn't make any attempt to move off the tracks. Ngoma said he began an emergency stop of the train but was unable to stop in time to avoid the collision. Ngoma told me he believes the train was traveling at approximately 35 mph as they had just passed the speed limit sign. After speaking to Ngoma I contacted Olsby. He told me they were traveling east and had just passed MP 1777.6 when they saw a person standing on the tracks between the rails. Olsby told me the person didn't move off the tracks as they approached and they began an emergency brake application. Olsby told me after striking the person they brought the train to a stop and notified their dispatcher. Olsby completed a written statement that he later handed to me before eventually moving the train so that the female could be removed from the scene. Prior to moving the train I verified that the headlights and horn were functioning.

The scene was photographed and traffic paint was applied to mark the location of the lead engine, final rest position of the female, cell phone and blood on the rocks near the female.

The Snohomish County Medical Examiner's Office was contacted and Amy Kelly responded to the scene to conduct her investigation. Once Kelly arrived I stood by while she completed her investigation and removed the female from the scene. Kelly told me she had checked the female but was unable to locate any type of identification for her. I was told that during a visual examination evidence of prior self-mutilation was observed. I was told that scarring and burn marks were observed on the female's wrists and arms. I was provided with the SCMEO case number which was 190813-114 and advised that her office would attempt to identify the female through fingerprints or information found in the cell phone.

Once the female had been removed from the scene and all personnel were clear from the tracks I cleared the scene.

At 1443 hours I received a follow up request to contact Uzma Tariq regarding this incident. I called Uzma who told me her daughter, Zenia Tariq, was the female who had been struck and killed by the train this morning. Uzma told me she had been notified of the death by the Snohomish County Medical Examiner's Office after calling her daughter's cell phone. She told me Zenia was last seen on 08-12-19 when the family had dinner together. I asked Uzma if her daughter had made any statements or suicidal threats or if there had been any significant events recently that would have caused her daughter to become upset or depressed. Uzma told me she wasn't aware of any recent events that would have upset her daughter but she has had a history of depression and suicide attempts in the past. She told me Zenia seemed to be acting normal and had helped the family clean up after dinner last night. Uzma told me she wasn't aware of any substance abuse or relationship problems that may have caused Zenia to become upset or depressed.

Based on the location where Zenia was struck, her history of depression and previous suicide attempts, and her failure to take any action to avoid the approaching train I believe Zenia walked onto the railroad tracks with the intention of being struck by a train. On 09-25-19 I received a copy of the SCMEO Postmortem Examination report. I reviewed the report and saw that the injuries discovered during the examination were consistent with a train versus pedestrian collision. The cause of death was multiple blunt force trauma and the manner of death was listed as suicide.

**NARRATIVE**

On 08-13-19 at approximately 0543 hours I responded to the 7400 block of Lowell Snohomish River Rd. for a reported train vs pedestrian collision. I was advised that a BNSF employee was reporting that the train had stopped at this location after reportedly striking a pedestrian near this location.

When I arrived I saw that an eastbound BNSF freight train was stopped on the tracks near the 7400 block of Lowell Snohomish River Rd. Several SCSO units and fire department personnel had already arrived and were searching the tracks for the pedestrian that had been struck. After several minutes a severely injured teenage female was found lying in the gravel south of the tracks approximately 1300' west of the lead engine. The female was unresponsive and had significant head and leg injuries consistent with being struck by the train. Fire department personnel attempted to administer CPR and first aid but were unable to revive the female and ultimately pronounced her deceased.

After learning that this was a fatality I examined the tracks to determine where the female had been when she was struck. I located two red shoes west of the female on the tracks between the rails. The shoes had come to rest under train cars that were stopped on the tracks approximately thirty feet west of the female. In addition to the shoes a cell phone was found in the rocks on the south side of the tracks approximately fifty feet west of the female. I saw that there were several places along the south side of the tracks between the cell phone and final rest position of the female where drops of blood and tissue were observed on the rocks. The blood and tissue on the rocks showed the post impact path of the female after she was struck by the train. I determined that the female was likely struck at or very near the location where the cell phone was located.

The female was struck in an area that is not easily accessible by foot. I noted that there were no crossings anywhere near this location and a person would have to intentionally either access the tracks by climbing up a steep embankment or walking a significant distance from the nearest crossing.


After examining the area where the female was found I walked to the front of the train to examine the lead engine. The lead engine was stopped approximately 1300 feet east of the area where the collision occurred. I examined the front of the train and saw that there was a small piece of tissue on the lower edge of the metal guard (pilot) between the railroad rails. I also saw that there was what appeared to be blood, tissue and a human tooth on the top side of the coupler at the front of the train. The coupler is located at the center of the front of the locomotive directly above the metal guard. The blood, tissue and tooth found on the coupler showed that the female had been walking or standing near the center of the tracks between the rails when she was struck.

After viewing the front of the train I contacted the conductor and engineer of the train. The engineer was identified as Jerry Ngoma and the conductor was James Olsby. Ngoma told me they were traveling eastbound towards Wenatchee when he observed a person walking on the railroad tracks towards the train. He told me he sounded the horn to warn the person but they didn't respond and continued walking directly at the train. Ngoma said the person appeared to be aware the train was approaching and didn't make any attempt to move off the tracks. Ngoma said he began an emergency stop of the train but was unable to stop in time to avoid the collision. Ngoma told me he believes the train was traveling at approximately 35 mph as they had just passed the speed limit sign. After speaking to Ngoma I contacted Olsby. He told me they were traveling east and had just passed MP 1777.6 when they saw a person standing on the tracks between the rails. Olsby told me the person didn't move off the tracks as they approached and they began an emergency brake application. Olsby told me after striking the person they brought the train to a stop and notified their dispatcher. Olsby completed a written

statement that he later handed to me before eventually moving the train so that the female could be removed from the scene. Prior to moving the train I verified that the headlights and horn were functioning.

The scene was photographed and traffic paint was applied to mark the location of the lead engine, final rest position of the female, cell phone and blood on the rocks near the female.

The Snohomish County Medical Examiner's Office was contacted and Amy Kelly responded to the scene to conduct her investigation. Once Kelly arrived I stood by while she completed her investigation and removed the female from the scene. Kelly told me she had checked the female but was unable to locate any type of identification for her. I was told that during a visual examination evidence of prior self-mutilation was observed. I was told that scarring and burn marks were observed on the female's wrists and arms. I was provided with the SCMEO case number which was 190813-114 and advised that her office would attempt to identify the female through fingerprints or information found in the cell phone.

Once the female had been removed from the scene and all personnel were clear from the tracks I cleared the scene.

At 1443 hours I received a follow up request to contact Uzma Tariq regarding this incident. I called Uzma who told me her daughter, Zenia Tariq, was the female who had been struck and killed by the train this morning. Uzma told me she had been notified of the death by the Snohomish County Medical Examiner's Office after calling her daughter's cell phone. She told me Zenia was last seen on 08-12-19 when the family had dinner together. I asked Uzma if her daughter had made any statements or suicidal threats or if there had been any significant events recently that would have caused her daughter to become upset or depressed. Uzma told me she wasn't aware of any recent events that would have upset her daughter but she has had a history of depression and suicide attempts in the past. She told me Zenia seemed to be acting normal and had helped the family clean up after dinner last night. Uzma told me she wasn't aware of any substance abuse or relationship problems that may have caused Zenia to become upset or depressed.

Based on the location where Zenia was struck, her history of depression and previous suicide attempts, and her failure to take any action to avoid the approaching train I believe Zenia walked onto the railroad tracks with the intention of being struck by a train.

On 09-25-19 I received a copy of the SCMEO Postmortem Examination report. I reviewed the report and saw that the injuries discovered during the examination were consistent with a train versus pedestrian collision. The cause of death was multiple blunt force trauma and the manner of death was listed as suicide.
