While I will find out more later here is the current information. The person killed was a woman, last name possibly Kinkaid. As I understand she lived in an apartment a few blocks from the tracks. According to people who knew her she was "not right in the head" and that she had "problems." The indications are it was suicide.

I might know this person, though not well. IF it is who I think it was, she did indeed have a number of problems. In addition the body was intact, not in pieces.

There is nothing visible on the right of way indicating what happened. Will contact you later if I find out more. CJ

UPDATE-11-20-2019. At the city council meeting last night more details about the fatality emerged. The incident happened about 200 yards WEST of Jefferson which is the westernmost crossing in Ritzville. This means it happened in the area behind Harvest Foods. The store was closed. There is a NO TRESPASSING sign which is very easy to see. Nothing was said about any witness. The bars were all closed.

There is a frequently used shortcut through the weeds, not a real walking path, but used enough that you can see it as it goes across the tracks, RIGHT BY THE BNSF NO TRESPASSING SIGN. The nearest auto-pedestrian crossing is about 200-250 yards east.

At the City Council meeting the Chief of Police did say the woman had "issues" but did not elaborate.

Several persons in town knew her, typical small town. I was told who knew her that she was not married, and no children. She had worked at Subway and at McDonalds here in Ritzville. Anyway I guess that is about it, but it is sad. Even more sad if it was indeed suicide.

On 11/19/19 at approximately 0153 hours I received a radio transmission from Adams County Dispatch advising of a train vs pedestrian collision at the Jefferson St grade crossing. While en-route dispatch toned fire and ambulance.

I arrived at the Jefferson St crossing and was contacted by Donald Sluder (BSNF train conductor). Donald stated the collision occurred west of the grade crossing. I followed Donald approximately 407 feet west of the crossing finding a deceased female subject, later identified as Heidi Kinkade, lying face up on the north side of the tracks.

I notified dispatch of the collision location. I notified Chief McCormick of the situation. Moments later the ambulance and fire department personnel arrived. Heidi was confirmed deceased by medical personnel at approximately 0209 hours.

Heidi's head was Heidi's head was Heidi was wearing head. I observed Heidi had impact trauma to her face on her nose and above her right eye. I observed additional impact trauma to the center of her forehead near the hairline. Walking right side/lower right shoe lying of Heidi of Heidi and the left shoe lying between the tracks adjacent to where Heidi was located.

When asked what occurred, Donald stated the train was traveling east bound at approximately 20 PH in dense fog. Donald stated Heidi was observed in the middle of the tracks at the last minute and the train's breaks were applied. Donald stated he wasn't able to tell if Heidi was crossing over the tracks or walking down the center of them. When asked where the impact occurred Donald stated it was near where she was lying.

Chief McCormick, SGT Cameron, and WSP Trooper Romaneski arrived on scene. I requested SGT Cameron contact the train crew and obtain their information. SGT Cameron advised he would also mark the location of the train's front axle.

While processing the scene dispatch advised they received a call from Darcy Stephen who had an ID card and suicide notes left by her upstairs neighbor (Heidi). Chief McCormick responded to Darcy's location. After returning with the ID Heidi's identification was confirmed. Chief McCormick advised he would make a death notification to Heidi's relatives.

I contacted Peter in the Coroner's office at approximately 0301 and advised him of the situation. Peter confirmed my plan to contact Danekas Funeral Home and obtain fluid for potential toxicology examination.

I photographed the scene and measured 407.6 east from Heidi's final resting spot to the west edge of the Jefferson St crossing. I later measured 360.8 feet from the west edge of the Jefferson St crossing center of the train's front axle for a total length of 768.4 feet.

Danekas Funeral Home personnel arrived and took possession of Heidi at

approximately 0430 hours.

I provided BNSF personnel with Heidi's information and the evidence it was an intended suicide.

Heidi left three letters. One to her neighbor Darcy, one to her sister Kristy, and one to Dr Beck.

In her letter to Darcy Heidi began with "I don't know what to say except that I'm sorry. I tried so hard, but it has all become too overwhelming. They took away my unemployment and said I owe them \$800.00! There's nothing left to do". The letter went on to talk about other hardships Heidi was facing before listing requests she had for Darcy including caring for her cats and delivering the letter she wrote to Kristy. The letter also stated "I'm leaving you my truck. Sell it and make a few bucks. Place is unlocked. Take anything you want and tell Cindy I'm sorry".

In her letter to Kristy Heidi expressed her feeling that no one loves her. Heidi then stated "Oh well live will continue as if I was never here. I'm sure I won't be missed. I'm not the same person that I used to be". Heidi then states she has a final request and asks Kristy to put her cats down.

In her letter to DR Beck Heidi thanks him for his service over the years. Heidi then goes on to state "I want you to know that this isn't your fault....things just got to be too much".

With the three letters there was a notice from WA State Employment Security Dept dated 11/06/19 advising Heidi her unemployment was discontinued and she owed \$752.00.

On 11-19-19 at 0153 hrs, while I was off duty, Adams County Dispatch paged the Ritzville Fire Department and the Ritzville Ambulance to a train verses pedestrian collision near the Jefferson St. crossing. I knew due to the nature of that call, I would need to respond. I responded from my residence.

When I arrived, the Ritzville Fire Department and ambulance as well as Officer Gracie were already on scene. I contacted Officer Gracie who told me the female subject, later identified as Heidi K. Kinkade (dob (b)) has passed away from her injuries. I recognized Kinkade but couldn't immediately recall her name. As I looked at Kinkade, I could see some trauma to her head and some blood. Her body was in tact.

Officer Gracie asked me to contact the train crew at the head of the train and obtain what information I could from them.

The train's lead locomotive, a Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) locomotive, had stopped just east of the Adams St crossing. It had been eastbound at the time of the collision. The weather conditions at that time were foggy with visibility approximately a mile or less. The temperature was in the high 30s to low 40s. Due to the fog, there was a mist in the air.

I contacted the train crew in the lead locomotive. Engineer Tyler C. Morrision (dob (dob)) and Conductor Donald E. Sluder (dob (dob)) were the crew on the train. I advised the crew I knew they had certain rules they had to follow and if they didn't want to provide their information or what happened until their company representatives arrived, I understood. They advised they would talk to me before the company representatives arrived.

Engineer Morrision said the train was traveling at approximately 26 MPH. When asked why he was traveling at a slower speed than the trains normally go through town, he said the train was coming up a grade and they were conserving fuel. Engineer Morrision said he had started sounding the horn as he was approaching the Jefferson St crossing. He said after the first or second sounding of the horn, he saw something in between the rails. He stood up from his seated position and saw it was a human, standing between the rails, facing southbound. Engineer Morrision said the person, Kinkade, looked up at the train and the she turned her torso away from the train, towards the east. He said he immediately put the throttle into the natural position and put the train into emergency break mode. Engineer Morrision said he heard the train hit Kinkade but because of how high they sit, he didn't see the impact.

Conductor Sluder said as soon as the train came to a stop, he exited the cab and started back towards the site of the collision. He said he found Kinkade unresponsive.

Both Engineer Morrision and Conductor Sluder said they would provided statements if needed.

I re-contacted Officer Gracie. By this time Chief McCormick had arrived and through investigation we were able to identify Kinkade. As soon as the name was told to me her name, I knew it to be her. I've has several contacts with Kinkade over the years of her living in Ritzville. Officer Gracie was processing the scene of the impact. He asked me to process the front of the train. I returned to the lead locomotive, #4059. With marking paint, I marked where the front left axle came to a stop, I marked where the front of the train stopped, and I photographed the front of the train, the marks I made and the sand that had been deposited on the rail by the locomotive when it was put into emergency mode. I didn't locate any evidence of the collision on the front of the train.

Chief McCormick returned to the scene and advised Kinkade had left three suicide notes, one to her sister, one to her neighbor and one to her doctor. The notes were left outside her neighbor's front door. The notes didn't say she was going to walk in front of a train but left instructions as to what she wanted done with her cats and to tell people it wasn't their fault. Refer to Chief McCormick's report for further on that.

When Danekas Funeral Home personnel arrived, Officer Gracie and I assisted in getting Kinkade's body onto the gurney and out of the scene. After the body was removed, Danekas Funeral Home personal cleared the scene. Officer Gracie, Chief McCormick and I cleared the collision scene as well.

I made contact with the BNSF management personnel who had arrived on scene as well as Engineer Morrision and Conductor Sluder and advised them what the situation was. I provided them with Officer Gracie's card as he was the lead investigator in the case. I advised them there were no units left at the scene. They asked to be walked back to where it happened. Officer Gracie and I walked them back to the scene and then cleared the rail road's right of way shortly there after.
