Whidbey SeaTac Shuttle & Charter (WSS) currently holds the UTC Authority (Certificate #C-1077) to operate between Whidbey Island-to-Paine Field Airport (PAE), and Whidbey Island-to-SeaTac International Airport (SEA). WSS has provided limited direct service to PAE with limited success and is proposing to operate all Whidbey Island-to-SEA shuttle service runs though PAE to better serve customers. An approval of this application will allow a direct 24X7 "reservation only" shuttle service between Whidbey Island and both airports providing customers with a direct, fast and economical service that is currently unavailable. WSS current routes will be used.

State the conditions that demonstrate this proposed service is for the public convenience and necessity: Currently there is no direct scheduled non-stop service between Paine Field and SeaTac International Airport. Currently passengers must utilize taxis, TNC and other means to transfer between the two airports. Paine Field operators have stated that a direct service is needed to facilitate travel circumstances of canceled flights, tickets issued with different arrival/departure airports. We have been approached by airport management and customers requesting regular service between each airport.

State the applicant's prior experience and familiarity with the statues and rules that govern operations it proposes: WSS has been providing airporter shuttle services between Whidbey Island and SeaTac International Airport continuously since December 2003. In 2019 as soon as Paine Field Airport opened WSS initiated service to Paine Field Airport.



To better serve our passengers and partner airlines, we are asking for a transportation route between our airport terminal and SeaTac International Airport. When flights are canceled, the airline will often reticket passengers to fly out of SeaTac and sometimes the other way around. Currently, there are insufficient transportation providers in our area to handle the situation. In addition, people that wish to book bargain flights or 'saver fares', often have different departure/arrival dates between the airports and need the ability to shuttle between both airports in a cost effective manner.

The following proposal makes all the sense in the world as Whidbey SeaTac Shuttle & Charter drives past our terminal every day. Whidbey SeaTac Shuttle & Charter is proposing a shuttle service that would operate 7-days a week with a 24-hour reservation line. This would greatly enhance our passengers' travel needs. There is a demand for a more consistent, reliable and cost-effective means of mitigating this transportation challenge.
