Dear Mr. Johnson:

In an order issued on April 26<sup>th</sup>, 2000 in Docket UT-000453, the Commission approved WCI Cable, Inc.'s ("WCI's") application for registration as a telecommunications company and approved its petition to be classified as a Competitive Telecommunications Company. The purpose of this letter is to give you notice, as a courtesy, of a proposed indirect change in ownership in WCI.

ATN International, Inc. (Nasdaq: ATNI), acting through its majority-owned subsidiary Project 8 Buyer, LLC ("Project 8"), has entered into an agreement to acquire WCI's ultimate parent, Alaska Communications Systems Group, Inc. ("AC"). After the transaction closes, AC will be a direct, wholly owned subsidiary of Project 8, and an indirect majority-owned subsidiary of ATN. The transaction remains subject to receipt of certain regulatory approvals and is currently expected to close in the third quarter of 2021.

AC wholly owns Alaska Communications Systems Holdings, Inc ("Holdings"), Holdings wholly owns Crest Communications Corporation ("Crest") and Crest wholly owns WCI.

WCI's direct ownership will not be affected by the acquisition. WCI will remain a wholly owned subsidiary of Crest, and the acquisition will not otherwise affect WCI's operations in Washington.
