On 05/20/21 at approximately 1731 hours, I, Ofc. C. Withrow, was advised by dispatch of a train vs pedestrian accident on the railroad tracks near W. Chestnut Street. Dispatch advised that the BNSF train was traveling north to south. I arrived at the listed located at approximately 1733 hours and observed a person laying on the ground in the rocks on the west side of the railroad tracks, approximately 1 block south of W. Chestnut St near the S. Tower Viaduct.

I immediately went to the person and saw it was an older white unknown male. The male did not appear to be breathing. His eyes were open, and he appeared to have a fractured left leg and possibly left arm. I checked for a pulse on the male and did not feel one. I did not manipulate the male any further, or check his outer clothing. At this point, the identity of the male was unknown.

Lewis County Dispatch had already summoned medical personal to the scene prior to my arrival. Riverside Fire Authority (RFA) arrived shortly after I did and checked the male who they determined to be deceased. Commander Clary summoned the LC Coroner and Centralia PD Detectives for further investigation. I obtained evidentiary photographs of the scene which are attached to the case file. See the attached photographs for further.

Commander D. Clary responded to my location while Ofc. A. Miller responded to the front of the train, which was located near E. Van Buren St. I contacted Ofc. Miller and requested he obtain statements from the BNSF Conductor, video evidence from BNSF, and photographs of the train where the impact occurred. Ofc. Miller advised me that per the BNSF Conductor, only 1 male was seen. Ofc. Miller's description of the male matched that of the deceased male. See Ofc. Miller's report for further.

The Lewis County Coroner and Detective W. Phipps arrived on scene a short time later and took over the investigation. I briefed Detective Phipps on what had occurred prior to his arrival. I departed shortly thereafter.

On 05/20/21 at approximately 1731 hours I, Officer A. Miller, responded to 101 W Chestnut St for the report of a train versus pedestrian.

The train was travelling southbound on the west track. The train came to stop near Van Buren St. I contacted the train engineers, Enrique L Mendoza and Joseph R Holman. They both told me that they observed an older male, wearing jeans and a tan jacket cross the tracks in front of the train. Enrique said it looked like the man was on something. The man then stumbled or fell back towards the track. The man was walking from the east to the west.

Enrique and Joseph both thought the male made it across the tracks. I was told they lose sight of anything approximately 50 feet in front of the train. I asked how they knew the man got hit. I was told it makes a very distinct sound and they could hear it inside the train. The train brakes were applied and the train came to a stop near Van Buren St. Enrique said the train was going approximately 40 miles per hour. Enrique said he has seen the man who was hit numerous times in the past crossing over the tracks.

I was told the train has video. The video can requested by contacting the train master at 253-591-2556. The train Symbol is V MINPTS1 14B. The engine number is BNSF 7591%.. Enrique provided me a sheet with the train information which I have attached in Spillman.

This ends my involvement.

On 20 May 2021 at approximately 1741 hours I, Det. W. Phipps was contacted by Interim Commander Clary who advised of a freight train vs pedestrian collision near the 100 block of W. Chestnut St, under the Kresky Ave viaduct. I responded to the PD where I picked up a digital SLR camera then responded to the scene of the body.

On my arrival I contacted OIC Withrow and Deputy Coroner Stephen Wilson (M-51) (Coroner case #21-0348). The decedent was covered by a white blanket on the ground. The scene was actually located approximately 55.66 meters east of the Jefferson St/S. Tower Ave intersection and approximately 64.77 meters north of 816 S. Tower Ave. Using my duty cell phone and the maps app, I took screen shots of the location for the decedent and later the front of the train. I have attached these screen shots to the case.

OIC Withrow explained that the train crew, Joseph Holman and Enrique Mendoza, saw the male decedent walking unsteadily from east-to-west across the train tracks. The decedent was also pointing randomly into the air. The train crew had stated to Ofc Miller that they were traveling around 40 mph at this time. Holman and Mendoza stated that the decedent had crossed the tracks as they lost sight of him. They thought the decedent was clear of the tracks when they heard a "thump" and realized they hit the decedent and they brought the train to a stop approximately 476 meters to the south. I asked DC Wilson to remove the blanket so I could observe the decedent which he did. I noted that there were no major lacerations or loss of blood visible. I also noted that the decedent's left femur appeared to be broken near the hip and the left upper arm appeared to be broken. With DC Wilson's assistance I photographed the decedent and documented abrasions to the left side of his back. DC Wilson located a plastic grocery store bag that contained a broken glass smoking device which I collected for destruction. A short time later morticians arrived and removed the body.

I then went to the train engine (#7591) at the head of the train which was located east of 202 Van Buren St. I contacted Ofc Miller who explained what the train crew had told him. He also advised that the engine had a video camera that was operating. The train crew was cooperating with the investigation but declined to provide a recorded statement because of BNSF policy.

I photographed the front of the train engine and the area that would have struck the decedent. I will note that there were no obvious signs of impact. A short time later a BNSF inspector arrived and we discussed my being able to view the camera footage and possibly get a copy of the video. He stated that he would contact me next week. I provided him with my business card and left the scene.

At 2100 hours I received a phone call from DC Wilson who advised that he located what appeared to be meth and heroin in the decedent's belongings. He added that he had tested the decedent for drugs and the test showed positive for meth. DC Wilson advised that he would secure the drugs at the Coroner's Office for the night and I could get them during business hours the next day.

At this time I am waiting for the Coroner's Office to identify the decedent and to conduct the autopsy for a cause of death.

This case remains under investigation.

On 05-20-07 at approximately 1730 Hrs. I, Sgt. Clary, was enroute to my residence and had just signed out of service when I heard dispatch advise of a train vs. pedestrian collision. In order to assist responding officers I signed back into service and responded priority to the location where the subject was struck, the intersection of the mainline railroad tracks and E. Chestnut St.

Prior to my arrival Det. Withrow arrived on scene and located the pedestrian about 150 yards to the south of E. Chestnut St. on the west side of the tracks. Det. Withrow advised that the subject was deceased. I responded to the east side the of the tracks to see if there were any witnesses or evidence there. I did not find either.

RFA personnel declared the male as deceased and I asked dispatch to call a coroner to the scene. I then attempted contact with Det. Sgt. Croy but was not able to reach him. I then called Det. Phipps, advised him of what had occurred

and directed him to respond to take over the investigation.

I changed my location to the west side of the tracks and made observations of the decedent. I noted that his body had been battered significantly by the train but that he did not appear to have bled prior to his death. I could not identify him by looking at his face but later learned that he was Johnathan Davis, a transient male I was very familiar with from having worked patrol.

Once the deputy Coroner, S. Wilson, arrived I left the scene and was out of service a short time later.

On 26 May 2021 I contacted Chief Deputy Coroner Dawn Harris at the Lewis County Coroner's Office. She showed me the drugs that DC Wilson had collected and told me about earlier. The items consisted of an empty syringe and two small bindles that contained trace amounts of what appeared to be Heroin. I explained to Harris that my only purpose in collecting these items would be for destruction only. Harris replied that the Coroner's Office could destroy the items through their resources and I agreed that this would be best.

We then discussed the results of the autopsy on 24 May. While the report is not complete yet, Harris told me that Johnathan Davis died as a result of blunt force trauma. She then showed me photographs of the autopsy (see attached) and noted that the aorta had been torn which would result in Davis bleeding out internally.

I have now placed the remnants of the glass pipe I collected on 20 May into evidence for destruction. I have messaged Ofc T. Duennes (BNSF Police) and inquired about his assisting me in viewing the train video.

SUBJECT: Apparent Cause of Death for UTC Pedestrian Accident 17188

Per a phone conversation on January 18, 2022, with Lewis County Medical Examiner's Office at (360) 740-1376, the cause and manner of the pedestrian vs. train death in Centralia, Lewis County (not at a crossing), on May 20, 2021, in UTC Accident 17188 were as follows:

Cause of death: Blunt force to torso and extremities.

Manner of death: Struck by train. No evidence of suicide.

Listed below are the recommended improvements at each of the three railroad crossings that would be a part of the proposed Quiet Zone.

Maple Street Crossing (USDOT 092521T)

- 1) Install 60 lineal feet minimum 6 inch vertical non-mountable concrete curb with delineators on the center line of the roadway on the west side of the intersection. Must be full height to the crossing arm.
- 2) Add curb, gutter and sidewalk on the north side of the crossing or use paint and reflective turtles to delineate the pedestrian walkway.
- 3) Add curb, gutter and sidewalk or use paint and reflective turtles to delineate the sidewalk on the southeast quadrant of the crossing.
- 4) Install 100 lineal feet minimum 6 inch vertical non-mountable concrete curb with delineators on the center line of the road way on the east side of intersection. Must be full height to the crossing arm.
- 5) Add one additional pedestrian bell to signal mast in the northeast quadrant.
- 6) Upgrade signal and gate arm lights to LED

Main Street Crossing (USDOT 092520L)

- 1) Install 60 lineal feet minimum of 6 inch vertical non-mountable curb with delineators on the center line of the roadway on the west side of the intersection. Must be full height to the crossing arm.
- 2) Install 100 lineal feet minimum of 6 inch vertical non-mountable curb with delineators on the center line of the roadway on the east side of the intersection. Must be full height to the crossing arm. If cannot install the full 100 feet of the curb then an exit gate would have to be added to the eastbound traffic movement.
- 3) Add one additional pedestrian bell to signal mast in the northeast quadrant.
- 4) Add curb, gutter and sidewalk or use paint and turtles to delineate the walkway on the southwest quadrant of the crossing.

Locust Street Crossing (092519S)

- Install 100 lineal feet minimum 6 inch vertical non-mountable concrete curb with delineators on the center line of the roadway on both sides of the crossing. Must be full height to the cross arm.
- 2) Upgrade signal and gate arm lights to LED
- 3) Need to add curb behind the sidewalk on the northeast quadrant of the crossing to prevent vehicle access across the sidewalk.
- 4) Add one additional pedestrian bell to the signal mast in the northeast quadrant.
- 5) Construct fencing on the east side of the railroad right-of-way from the end of the existing fence to Summa Street. Fence shall not be on the railroad right of way, unless authorized by the railroad.
- 6) Since curbing will prevent the left turn movement from eastbound Locust Street to northbound Railroad Avenue, the City of Centralia staff need to talk to Twin Transit regarding adjusting their route from Locust Street to Main Street.
- 7) Need to add additional asphalt surface on north and south side of crossing to allow pedestrian traffic around the backside of the signal masts.
