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**RE: Advice No. 2023-58
Puget Sound Energy's Electric Tariff Revision**

Dear Executive Director Hunter:

Pursuant to RCW 80.28.060 and WAC 480-80-101 and WAC 480-80-105(1)(c), please find enclosed for filing the following proposed revisions to the WN U-60, Tariff G for electric service of Puget Sound Energy ("PSE"):

5th Revision of Sheet No. 26-B, Schedule 26 Large Demand General Service
5th Revision of Sheet No. 31-B, Schedule 31 Primary Demand General Service

The purpose of this tariff filing is to clarify that up to 15 Points of Delivery are allowed to be summed when determining a Conjunctive Maximum Demand Charge under the Conjunctive Demand Service Option ("CDSO") if the electric load of all these Points of Delivery is dedicated to electrified transportation ("ET"). The proposed tariff changes are designed to address customer concerns identified in PSE's survey of existing CDSO customers about the CDSO summary billing -- single billing statement including line details for all the CDSO Points of Delivery that have been summed to determine the Customer's Conjunctive Maximum Demand Charge.

Customers with ET-dedicated Schedules 26 and 31 Points of Delivery are allowed to enroll in the CDSO without limitations in term of their total electric load and the number of Points of Delivery since September 1, 2021, in order to increase the CDSO participation with dedicated ET load. The maximum of summation of 15 Points of Delivery does not change any of the specific ET conditions approved under Docket UE-210570 but will result in a manageable bill for an ET CDSO Customer.

The tariff sheets described herein reflect an issue date of December 14, 2023, and an effective date of January 14, 2024. Notice and posting of proposed tariff changes, as required by law and the Commission's rules and regulations, is being completed in accordance with WAC 480-100-193(1). The tariff changes proposed in the filing do not increase recurring

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charges nor restrict access to the optional services under Schedules 26 and 31. No notice is required under the provisions of WAC 480-100-194 or -195.
