On July 14, 1994, LCI International Telecom Corp. (LCI) filed a petition to amend the company's registration authority to provide alternate operator services. LCI was registered as a telecommunications company in Docket UT-920034. The order authorizing registration was based upon LCI providing resold direct dial interexchange voice message telecommunications services. LCI is classified as a competitive telecommunications company.

LCI seeks statewide authority to provide alternate operator services. LCI will contract with hospitals, hotels, motels, universities, truck stops, and other organizations to the transient public as well as to customers who are presubscribed to LCI.

LCI has submitted information showing that it is technically competent to provide the services proposed. LCI is wholly-owned by one corporation which in turn is owned by one limited partnership and one corporation each owning more than five percent interest. LCI has no subsidiaries. LCI has provided balance sheet and income statement information showing it has adequate financial resources to provide the proposed services.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission is an agency of the state of Washington vested by statute with the authority to regulate rates, rules, regulations, practices, accounts, securities, and transfers of public service companies, including telecommunications companies.
- 2. LCI International Telecom Corp. is a public service company subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission under the provisions of chapter 80.36 RCW.
- 3. LCI International Telecom Corp. has provided sufficient information to show that it is financially and technically capable to provide the services proposed.

4. Proposed rates and services for AOS services are for the public convenience and advantage as defined by WAC 480-120-141.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

1. The petition of LCI International Telecom Corp., as supplemented and amended, for an amendment to its application for registration to provide alternate operator services should be approved.

<u>ORDER</u>

- 1. After the effective date of this Order, and subject to its conditions, the petition of LCI International Telecom Corp. for an amendment to its application for registration to provide alternate operator services is granted.
- 2. This order shall in no way affect the authority of this Commission over the rates, services, accounts, evaluations, estimates, or determination of cost, or any matters whatsoever that may come before it, nor shall anything in this order be construed as an acquiescence in any estimate or determination of cost or any valuation of property claimed or asserted.
