RE: Tariff Revision to Recover Incremental COVID 19 Costs – Harold LeMay Enterprises, Inc., dba City Sanitary, Joe's Refuse, White Pass Garbage G-98, Revised Tariff No. 10

Dear Mr. Johnson:

We respectfully ask that the Commission accept this filing to recover incremental COVID 19 costs, as explained below.

#### Overview

The Company proposes recovering \$61,600 of incremental COVID-19 costs, over a two-year period, beginning August 1, 2021. The two-year period is requested to minimize the monthly impact to customers. These costs include supplemental payments to all hourly employees, sanitary cleaning, and building and property expenses needed to maintain a safe work environment. The Company proposes the costs be recovered via an increase to each tariff rate, similar to a dump fee filing.

The combined Lewis and Joe's increase is proposed as follows: Residential garbage service \$12,400, 0.36%; residential recycling service \$5,200, 0.36%; residential yard waste \$300, 0.36%; commercial service \$10,400, 0.36%; multi-family recycling \$70, 0.36%; and roll-off service \$3,400, 0.36%. There are approximately 16,700 residential; 4,300 commercial; 740 roll-off; 14,500 residential recycling; 450 yard waste, and 300 multi-family recycling customers affected by this change.

### **Rate Calculation**

The Company tracks COVID-19 expenses in dedicated general ledger accounts. The regulated portion of those accounts for the period of April 1, 2020 – March 31, 2021 is \$61,600, or 0.72% of regulated revenue for the same period. Half of that percentage, as to allow for a two-year recovery, is \$31,500 or 0.36% of revenue. Each tariff rate will be increased by 0.36%. The Company has provided work papers with this filing, including a Price Out, to support the calculation and prove appropriate recovery of incremental COVID-19 costs.

#### **Tariff Pages**

The Company is submitting a new set of "COVID-19 cost recovery" tariff pages, separate from existing tariff pages, in order to clearly state the expiration date of the COVID-19 recovery rates. If subsequent rate increases occur, such as a dump fee increase, the Company will update both sets of tariff pages for the approved increase. When the two-year recovery period ends, the Company will start billing the rates on the current "non-COVID-19 cost recovery" tariff pages.

#### Filing Considerations

We request an exemption from the workpapers rules in WAC 480-07-520, and the 30 day customer notification in WAC 480-70-271(a), as this is a pass-through of known incremental COVID-19 costs.

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similar to a dump fee filing. We will notify customers of this increase on the first bill reflecting the change.

## CONCLUSION

The company respectfully requests the Commission issue an order authorizing the Company to recover \$61,600 of COVID-19 incremental costs over a two-year period. The requested two year period begins August 1, 2021 and ends July 31, 2023.
