NOTICE OF INTENT TO CANCEL

NOTICE OF BRIEF ADJUDICATIVE PROCEEDING; SETTING TIME FOR ORAL STATEMENTS (Set for June 22, 2022, at 1:30 p.m.)

- Pursuant to RCW 81.80.130, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) regulates the safe operation of motor freight carriers, including household goods carriers.
- Four Seasons Moving & Storage LLC, (Four Seasons or Company) engages in business as a household goods carrier under Commission-issued provisional permit number THG-069635.
- Between April and May 2022, the Commission's staff (Staff) reviewed Four Seasons' compliance with the requirements of Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 480-15-560 and WAC 480-15-570, which adopt, among other provisions, Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.) Parts 391, 392, 395, and 396. Staff also reviewed the Company's compliance with WAC 480-15-550 and WAC 480-15-555.
- In May 2022, Staff completed an investigation of Four Seasons' compliance with the safety requirements in WAC 480-15. As a result of the compliance investigation, Staff documented 68 violations of Commission rules, including 37 acute or critical violations. On May 11, Staff notified the Company that the investigation resulted in a proposed unsatisfactory safety rating based on the acute and critical violations discovered and provided the Company a copy of the investigation report.
- A carrier may request a change in its safety rating based on evidence that it has taken corrective actions to address the identified violations and that company operations currently meet the safety fitness standard specified in 49 C.F.R. § 385.5 and § 385.7.

¹ An acute violation is a violation of a regulation where "noncompliance is so severe as to require immediate corrective actions by a motor carrier regardless of the overall safety posture of the motor carrier." 49 C.F.R. Part 385, Appendix B.II.b; WAC 480-15-560; WAC 480-15-570; WAC 480-14-999. A critical violation is a violation of a regulation where "noncompliance relates to management and/or operational controls. These are indicative of breakdowns in a carrier's management controls." 49 C.F.R. Part 385, Appendix B.II.c; WAC 480-15-560; WAC 480-15-570; WAC 480-14-999.

The Commission will grant permanent operating authority to a carrier that successfully completes its provisional period. Successful completion requires, among other things, that the carrier receives a satisfactory safety rating based on a review conducted by Staff.² If a carrier fails to receive a satisfactory safety rating within 18 months of obtaining its provisional permit, the Commission will cancel the carrier's provisional permit and dismiss the company's application for permanent authority unless the Commission finds good cause to extend the provisional period. WAC 480-15-305(3).

- The Commission will afford Four Seasons an opportunity to provide evidence, in the form of an approved safety management plan, showing that it has taken corrective action to address the identified violations. Four Seasons must come into compliance with applicable laws by obtaining a Commission approval of a safety management plan no later than July 8, 2022. If the Company fails to come into compliance by that date, the Commission will cancel its household goods carrier permit effective July 11, 2022. Thereafter, as an unregistered company, Four Seasons would be prohibited from providing household goods carrier services in the state of Washington.
- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That it intends to cancel the permit and authority of Four Seasons to provide services as a household goods carrier effective July 11, 2022, for cause, following a hearing on the factual allegations set out above, unless Four Seasons obtains Commission approval of a safety management plan prior to that date.
- Pursuant to RCW 34.05.482 and WAC 480-07-610, the Commission schedules a hearing on its own initiative and determines that a brief adjudicative proceeding is appropriate to determine whether the Commission should cancel Four Seasons' household goods carrier permit.
- THE COMMISSION GIVES FURTHER NOTICE That it will hold a virtual brief adjudicative proceeding in this matter at 1:30 p.m. on June 22, 2022. - 11 The record in this case will consist of any documents regarding the matter that are considered by or prepared for the presiding officer for the brief adjudicative proceeding and a transcript of any oral statements given at the hearing, which statements will be given under oath.
- Written notice of any other stage in the proceeding or other formal proceedings that the

Commission may deem appropriate will be given during the course of this case. Such documents are available on the Commission's website, www.utc.wa.gov. The Commission will provide at its offices in Lacey, Washington, copies of documents in the current record for use by the parties or others who may want to review them.

- 13 Four Seasons must submit its proposed safety management plan no later than 5 p.m. on June 8, 2022. Parties wishing to submit any other documents for consideration at the brief adjudicative proceeding must file with the Commission a list enumerating and describing any such documents no later than 5 p.m. on June 15, 2022, and provide any such documents to Staff counsel and the presiding offer by email by 5 p.m. on June 15, 2022.
- 14 THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the brief adjudicative proceeding set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.
