GRADE CROSSING PROTECTIVE FUND 2021 – 2023 GRANT APPLICATION IMPROVEMENTS AT PASSIVE RAILROAD CROSSINGS

The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (UTC), through the Grade Crossing Protective Fund (GCPF), provides grants for projects that eliminate or reduce public safety hazards at railroad crossings and along railroad rights-of-way in Washington State. As part of this emphasis the UTC is also committed to improving safety at passively protected railroad crossings in Washington.

GCPF funds may be used for purchasing stop signs¹, yield signs, retro-reflective tape, posts (if required), retro-reflective cross buck signs, private crossing signs, and emergency notification signs to a maximum of \$600 for each crossing. Under this program, GCPF funds may not be used for labor costs if labor is provided by the applicant with current staff. All installations must comply with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, 2009 edition.

To apply for a grant to improve safety at a passive railroad crossing, complete the following information and submit it and attachments to the UTC.

The CCRM updated and verified all required safety signage on the Railroad's ROW was in place two years ago, including remediating a faulty installation performed by prior owners of the Rails to Trails crossing of the Willapa Hills Trail.

In addition, the CCR&M is a partner with WSDOT in a major replacement/upgrade of the rail crossing of Highway 6 at Adna, Washington this summer. The existing signaled crossing will be replaced with all new hardware and circuitry, including crossing gates that are not now in place.

Research in records of the railroad indicate exploratory evaluation of additional public crossing signals at other locations. These will need to be investigated for eligibility as Section 130 projects.

Railroad Consent

If the applicant does not own the railroad crossing, the applicant must submit the attached Railroad Consent form signed and completed by the railroad owning the crossing.
