RE: Regulatory Fee Increases for Regulated Water Companies, Docket U-220963

TO ALL REGULATED WATER COMPANIES:

During the 2022 session, the legislature passed Senate Bill 5634, which amended Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 80.24.010 to update the level at which the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) assesses regulatory fees for utility companies, including investor-owned water companies.¹ Specifically, the statute increased annual regulatory fees to 0.1 percent of the first \$50,000 of gross operating revenue plus 0.4 percent of any gross operating revenue in excess of \$50,000. To implement this change, the Commission will consider proposed regulatory fee increases for water companies at its regularly scheduled open meeting on January 26, 2023. **Regulatory fees will not increase for water companies with gross operating revenue of \$50,000 or less.**

Commission staff (Staff) recognize that current water company rates do not reflect any fee increase the Commission may approve. Accordingly, Staff intends to propose that the Commission, on its own motion, authorize water companies to establish deferral accounts to track the difference between the regulatory fees currently recovered in rates and any approved increased fee amounts for a period of up to three years, which will preserve the companies'

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ability to seek recovery of the fee difference in a future general rate case.² Companies do not need to file an accounting petition to take advantage of this option. If the Commission adopts Staff's recommendation, companies that wish to seek recovery of the fee difference should create a deferral account before January 31, 2023, to track these amounts for potential recovery in their next general rate case. Staff are available to discuss how accounting deferral accounts operate and provide technical assistance to create a deferral account. In the alternative, water companies may file individual accounting petitions to preserve their ability to seek recovery of the fee difference in a future proceeding. Any such petition should be filed prior to January 31, 2023, to preserve deferred amounts for the full calendar year 2023.
