1 The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission), on its own motion, and through its regulatory staff (Staff), alleges as follows:

I. PARTIES

- The Commission is an agency of the state of Washington authorized by statute to regulate the rates, services, facilities, and practices of public service companies, including household goods carriers.
- American Moving Co., Inc., (American) is an Idaho corporation that engages in business as a household goods carrier under Commission-issued permit HG-064423.

II. BACKGROUND

- Each household goods carrier must remit to the Commission regulatory fees intended to cover the cost of regulating the household goods industry. The fee is fixed by rule as a percentage of a household goods carrier's annual intrastate gross operating revenues. Each carrier must remit these fees to the Commission every year by May 1.
- 5 Staff conducted its 2022 annual compliance review of the payment of regulatory fees by household goods carriers holding permits from the Commission. This review generated a list of companies that have failed to pay regulatory fees.
- 6 American did not pay regulatory fees by May 1, 2022, nor has it since paid those fees.

III. JURISDICTION

The Commission has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this complaint under chapter 34.05 RCW, RCW 80.01.040, RCW 80.01.060, RCW 81.01.010, RCW 81.04.010, RCW 81.04.020, RCW 81.04.080, RCW 81.04.110, RCW 81.04.460, RCW 81.80.321, WAC 480-07-610, WAC 480-15-450, and WAC 480-15-480.

III. APPLICABLE LAW

- The Commission regulates public service companies pursuant to a delegation of authority from the legislature. See RCW 80.01.040(2); RCW 81.01.010.
- 9 Household goods carriers are common carriers. RCW 81.04.010(11). Every common carrier is a public service company. RCW 81.04.010(16).
- Each household goods carrier must pay a regulatory fee of 0.25 percent of its gross income from intrastate operations for each calendar year. RCW 81.80.321; WAC 480-15-480(3), (4). Carriers must pay regulatory fees by May 1 based on the prior year's operations. WAC 480-15-480(4).
- Failing to pay regulatory fees subjects a household goods carrier to cancellation of its permit. WAC 480-15-450(1)(a); WAC 480-15-480(4)(b).

IV. CAUSE OF ACTION

Staff alleges that by failing to pay regulatory fees by May 1, 2022, American violated RCW 81.80.321 and WAC 480-15-480.

V. REQUEST FOR RELIEF

- Staff requests that the Commission find that the American failed to comply with RCW 81.80.321 and WAC 480-15-480 by failing to pay regulatory fees due May 1, 2022.
- Staff requests that the Commission cancel American's household goods carrier permit pursuant to its authority under WAC 480-15-450(1)(a) and WAC 480-15-480.

VI. PROBABLE CAUSE

Based on a review of the Declaration of Rachel Stark, and consistent with RCW 80.01.060 and WAC 480-07-307, the Commission finds probable cause exists to issue this Complaint.

VII. NOTICE OF BRIEF ADJUDICATIVE PROCEEDING

Pursuant to RCW 34.05.482 and WAC 480-07-610, the Commission schedules a hearing on its own initiative and determines that a brief adjudicative proceeding is appropriate to

determine whether the Commission should cancel American Moving Co., Inc.'s household goods carrier permits.

- Written notice of any other stage in the proceeding or other formal proceedings that the Commission may deem appropriate will be given during the course of this case. The Commission will provide at its offices in Lacey, Washington, copies of documents in the current record for use by the parties or others who may want to review them.
- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the brief adjudicative proceeding set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.
