Re: Avista Utilities Tariff WN U-28 Revisions, Schedule 90 – Electric Energy Efficiency Programs

Dear Ms. Hunter:

Attached for electronic filing with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) are the proposed tariff revisions of Avista Corporation, dba Avista Utilities (Avista or the Company), requesting modifications to the following electric tariff sheets, WN U-28:

<b>Eleventh Revision Sheet 90A</b>	Canceling	<b>Tenth Revision Sheet 90A</b>
<b>Eighth Revision Sheet 90B</b>	Canceling	<b>Seventh Revision Sheet 90B</b>
Fifth Revision Sheet 90C	Canceling	Fourth Revision Sheet 90C

The purpose of these requested tariff revisions is to update existing verbiage to adequately reflect various energy efficiency program modifications for the 2024 program year onward, as well as to add clarification and make housekeeping changes to the remaining tariff language. More specifically, the Company is removing overly prescriptive language regarding cost-effectiveness – in favor of a direct reference to the Total Resource Cost (TRC) and exception for low-income programs and those supporting populations identified within RCW 19.405.020 – as well as broadening the language contained within the tariff's non-monetary assistance provisions, to avoid potential restrictions for how Avista may best provide educational or outreach assistance to its customers. The overall intent of these changes is to allow Avista to further invest in the

communities it serves and to address barriers that exist when considering energy efficiency

projects.

These proposed tariff changes were provided to the Energy Efficiency Advisory Group

(EEAG or Advisory Group) on October 2, 2023, with further presentation of the verbiage

modifications provided at the Company's October 18, 2023 EEAG meeting. No objections or

additional feedback was received from EEAG members regarding these proposed tariff changes.

The Company and its Advisory Group continue to agree that, although the tariff allows for

considerable flexibility in how programs are designed and delivered, there remains the occasional

need for modifications to help meet current and future market conditions and opportunities. This

continuous improvement and cost-effective adaptive management of energy efficiency programs

will allow Avista to continue to best serve its customers with efficiency services and to maximize

energy savings within its portfolio.

This filing is being made concurrently with the Avista's 2024-2025 Biennial Conservation

Plan (BCP), which includes the Company's electric and natural gas Annual Conservation Plans

(ACPs) as Appendices B and C, respectively, as well as these proposed tariff revisions within

Appendices H (electric Schedule 90) and I (natural gas Schedule 190). Avista respectfully requests

that these proposed tariff revisions become effective January 1, 2024.
