4. The petitioner has participated in the following UTC cases in the last two years:

None, other than to petition for intervention in the matter of the Application of PacifiCorp and Scottish Power; PLC, Docket No: UE-981627, which petition was denied.

- 5. The petitioner has the following interest in this proceeding:
  - (a) Columbia Rural Electric Association, Inc. is a non profit cooperative that is owned by its members. It provides utility products and services to those members in Columbia and Walla Walla Counties in the State of Washington and in Umatilla County in Oregon.

- (b) Columbia REA has a general transfer agreement that allows BPA power to be wheeled over parts of PP&L's lines to serve Columbia's members.
- (c) The service areas of Columbia REA and PP&L are generally intermingled, but particularly so in and around the cities of College Place, Dayton, Waitsburg and Walla Walla, Washington.
- (d) Columbia REA has received requests, initiated by the consumers, to provide electric energy to them instead of PacifiCorp for a variety of reasons, including quality of service and the cooperative way of doing business.
- (e) The instant application by PacifiCorp asks for exit fees to be imposed on a consumer for changing electric service from it to another utility, which would have the effect of limiting consumer choice and competition.
- (f) The direct testimony of William G. Clemens for PacifiCorp filed herein contains distortions, such as that found at page 2, lines 11 and 12 wherein he states, "CREA is soliciting PacifiCorp's current retail customers in an effort to provide retail electric service to these electric end users." Columbia REA has an interest in setting the record straight. It has not solicited present customers of PacifiCorp.
- (g) Columbia REA only learned of this proceeding May 3, 2001, but after the prehearing conference held May 1, 2001. Columbia REA's Board met May 22, 2001 and resolved that the Cooperative petition to intervene and, if allowed, present evidence concerning requests for service that it has received from existing PacifiCorp customers.
