MEMORANDUM

- On March 17, 2006, Qwest Corporation (Qwest) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a request for arbitration pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 252(b) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996, Public Law No. 104-104, 101 Stat. 56 (1996) (Act). The parties to the arbitration are Qwest Corporation, Pacific Electronics, Inc., and Advanced Paging and Communications Inc.
- The Commission gave notice of a prehearing conference to be held on April 12, 2006, at its offices in Olympia, Washington.
- On April 11, 2006, Qwest filed its Motion to Dismiss, stating that:

a. Pacific Electronics Inc. has entered into a Wireless Type 1
Agreement with Qwest Corporation, filed with the Washington State
Commission on April 10, 2006 under Docket No. UT-063026.

b. Advanced Paging and Communications, Inc. has entered into a Type 1 and Type 2 Paging Connection Service Agreement with Qwest, filed with the Washington State Commission on April 10, 2006 under Docket No. UT-063025.

Qwest states that in light of these fully negotiated agreements having been entered into and filed with the Commission, the Petition for Arbitration is no longer necessary and Qwest requests that this matter be dismissed.

The Commission takes administrative notice of the filings in Dockets UT-063025 and UT-063026. The Commission finds that the issues raised by Qwest's request for arbitration in Docket UT-063023 are made moot by the subsequent filings in Dockets UT-063025 and UT-063026. Accordingly, the Commission grants Qwest's Motion to Dismiss and closes Docket UT-063023.
