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#### Item 10 – Application of Rates

The rates contained in this tariff cover the utilization by a medical waste generator of Stericycle of Washington's transportation service and medical waste management program waste generator of Stericycle's collection, transportation, treatment and disposal services for the specified regulated wastes identified in this tariff, as provided in Chapter 480-70 WAC.

Unless otherwise specified, the rates include the following:

- 1. Use of Stericycle's unique containers
- 2. Copies of shipping documentation Medical waste tracking and documentation
- 3. Collection
- 4. Transportation
- 5. Treatment; and
- 4. End disposal.

Unless otherwise provided herein, rates contained in this tariff apply to the transportation of biohazardous or biomedical waste, as defined in WAC 480-70-041, in Steritubs or other containers provided by Stericycle of Washington.

#### <u>Item 14 – Charges for Lost or (C)Damaged Containers</u>

Customers will be charged for lost or damaged containers. The charge will be:

(A)\$8.50 per cardboard Box

(A)\$55.00 per Tub

(A)\$55.00 per Pharma Container

(N)\$95.00 for each Cart

The charge per container will be: \$30.00 for a small tub; \$5.00 for a cardboard box (any size); (N) \$40.00 for a 17 gal. small/med container; \$30.00 for a small/medium container; \$30.00 for a medium tub; \$30.00 for a medium tub; \$30.00 for a large tub; and \$30.00 for a large container.

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#### Item 20 – Limitations of Service

- 1. **Schedules.** A company's schedule will meet reasonable requirements and will comply with local service level ordinances.
- 2. <u>Due care.</u> Other than to offer reasonable care, the company assumes no responsibility for articles left on or near solid waste receptacles.
- 3. <u>Liability for damage.</u> When a customer requests that a company provide service and damage occurs to the customer's driveway due to reasons not in the control of the company, the company will assume no responsibility for the damage.
- 4. **Refusal of service.** (Except as set forth in Section 5, Missed service due to unsafe weather conditions road conditions, natural disaster or when government authority restricts access to local roads.)

A solid waste collection company may refuse to:

- Collect solid waste from points where it is hazardous, unsafe, or dangerous to persons, property, or equipment to operate vehicles due to the conditions of streets, alleys, or roads.
- Drive into private property when, in the company's judgment, driveways or roads are improperly constructed or maintained, do not have adequate turn-arounds, or have other unsafe conditions; or
- Enter private property to pick up solid waste while an animal considered or feared to be dangerous is not confined. The customer will be required to confine the animal on service days.
- 5. Missed service due to unsafe weather conditions, road conditions, natural disaster or when government authority restricts access to local roads. A company is not required to collect solid waste when the company determines that it is unsafe to operate due to weather conditions, road conditions, natural disaster, or when government authority restricts access to local roads. The company will collect on the next scheduled service date on which the company deems it is safe to operate, and will take other reasonable actions to resume or provide alternative service as soon as reasonably practicable.
  - a. The company is not obligated to extend credit to customers for missed service if the company collects the customers' accumulated solid waste on the next scheduled service date on which the company deems it to be safe to operate. The company will not charge for extra waste set out in addition to customers' normal receptacle(s), if the amount of extra waste does not exceed the amount that reasonably would be expected to accumulate due to missed service.

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6. <u>Improper packaging.</u> Stericycle will not accept shipments, including containers, which are not properly packaged or identified. <u>This includes, but is not limited to:</u>

- a. Containers with bag liners that are not tied or sealed;
- b. Containers that are not properly closed;
- c. Containers that are improperly labeled;
- d. Containers that are damaged;
- e. Containers that are overfilled;
- f. Containers that are overweight;
- g. Containers with non-conforming waste according to the applicable Stericycle Waste Acceptance Policy for the service; and
- h. Containers with waste that has not been appropriately identified, profiled or characterized.

In the event Stericycle inadvertently accepts a container described in paragraph 7, Item 70 shall apply.

- 7. Obstructed pickup areas. Stericycle may refuse to accept shipments not immediately available for pickup at designated pickup areasadjacent to a loading dock or otherwise immediately accessible to Stericycle vehicles, including where the pickup area is blocked or obstructed. A mutually agreed upon designated pick-up area will be determined between Stericycle and the customer as appropriate.
- 8. **Shipping documentation.** All manifesting paperworkshipping documentation must be properly completed by the generator, verified, appropriately signed and available at the time of pickup including certifications/signatures, at the time of pickup.
- 9. Stericycle may refuse to pick up materials from points where the pickup area is obstructed at the time of pickup.
- 10. <u>Wear and tear.</u> Rates include normal wear and tear on reusable containers. Charges for replacement of reusable containers lost or damaged by the generator are shown in Item 14.
- 11. <u>Stericycle property.</u> Reusable containers provided to the generator for the storage of biomedical wasteshall remain the property of Stericycle.
- 12. <u>Modified sizes.</u> Stericycle reserves the right to modify its container sizes in the future provided the rate per gallon equivalent remains the same and unless and until rate changes per gallon are approved by the WUTC.

Note 3: The service limitation previously contained in this note has been deleted.

Note 34: A minimum of \$10.00 per month will be charged for on-call or less-than-monthly service per Item 80.

Note 45: A Reinstatement Charge will be assessed in accordance with Item 85, when applicable.

(N)Note 5: Any unlisted container type must be approved by Stericycle and will be billed at \$0.65 per gallon (based on container capacity) and will not have a tiered price. The minimum pickup fee will apply. Stericycle reserves the right to reject any unlisted container.

\*\*\*All other container sizes previously offered under Item 30 have been removed.

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### <u>Item 60 – Delinquent Fees</u>

In addition to the rates and charges shown herein, a late charge in the amount of (A)1.5% will be added to any account which remains unpaid at the time of the next regular billing.

#### Item 70 – (C)Special Handling Charges

The following special handling charges will be assessed in addition to all other rates and charges shown hereinwhen the carrier is required to provide special handling or packaging because of the improper packaging of the material shipped by the generator, the shipment of improper waste materials, overweight containers or the generator's special loading requirements:

- 1. For any containers that are not properly packaged (containers with bag liners that are not tied or sealed; containers that are not properly closed; containers that are improperly labeled; containers that are damaged; containers that are overweight): (A)\$27.50 per container.
- 2. (N)For any containers with unacceptable waste (containers with non-conforming waste according to the applicable Stericycle Waste Acceptance Policy; containers with waste that has not been appropriately identified, profiled or characterized): \$80.00 per container. Stericycle may periodically update the Waste Acceptance Policy and the current versions are posted at https://www.stericycle.com/en-us/about-us/policies-positions.
- 3. (N)Customers requesting a cardboard box when a reusable box is available will be assessed a fee of \$8.00 for each box purchased.
- 4. (N)A No Waste Fee of \$63.47 will be charged in the event that Stericycle is dispatched to a customer's location and there is no waste upon arrival.

(N)Overweight 31 gal. or 43 gal. containers: \$12.00 per container
(C)Other overweight or special handling or packaging: \$2.00 per gallon for each container requiring special handling

#### Item 80 – On-Call Services

Stericycle offers on-call (<u>less-than-monthly</u>) service or less-than-monthly service for a minimum charge of \$10.00 per month. Stericycle provides a container or containers for the generator's use. Stericycle will schedule a pickup within a reasonable time after a request for pickup is received from the generator. A minimum charge of \$10.00 per month applies in any calendar month in which no pickup is performed. This minimum charge applies in any calendar month in which no pickup is scheduled. 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# <u>Item 90 – (C)Rates for Incineration Services</u> <u>Pathological Waste, Chemotherapy Waste and Pharmaceutical Waste</u>

Rates under this Item 90 are for wastes subject to treatment by incineration. Stericycle requires that certain Biomedical Wastes (including Pathological Waste) be incinerated. Stericycle accepts certain other wastes (including Trace Chemotherapy Waste and State-Only Dangerous Waste Pharmaceuticals) for incineration services.

# For purposes of this Item 90:

- "Pathological Waste" means human or animal tissues, organs, limbs, surgical specimens and other body parts, except complete human remains (including heads, full torsos and fetuses).
- "Trace Chemotherapy Waste" means any waste contaminated through contact with, or having previously contained, chemotherapeutic agents.
- "State-Only Dangerous Waste Pharmaceuticals" has the meaning ascribed to it in WAC 173-303-555.

The rates stated in this Item 90 are flat rates per container and do not vary with the number of containers tendered for pickup.

There is a minimum pickup fee of \$63.47, which will be charged if the total cost of all containers picked up falls below that amount. If the total cost of the containers exceeds \$63.47, the minimum pickup fee will not apply.

For purposes of this Item 100, SharpsRx Pro refers to services for Sharps Waste that has been comingled with State-Only Dangerous Waste Pharmaceuticals in the same container.

Rates under this Item 100 are for wastes subject to treatment by incineration. Stericycle requires that State-Only Dangerous Waste Pharmaceuticals be subject to incineration services.

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#### (N)Item 105 – Hazardous Drug Disposal Services

For purposes of this Item 105:

"Hazardous Waste Pharmaceuticals" refers to State-Only Dangerous Waste Pharmaceuticals in addition to any drug waste that is classified as "hazardous" by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

"Hazardous Drug Disposal Services" ("HDDS") refers to collection, transportation, treatment and disposal services for services for Hazardous Waste Pharmaceuticals that is performed by a Stericycle vendor.

Rates under this Item 105 are for wastes subject to treatment by incineration. Stericycle requires that Hazardous Waste Pharmaceuticals be subject to incineration services.

The rates stated in this Item 105 are flat rates per month and are billed regardless of number of stops realized.

Note 1: Additional HDDS container charge outside annual allotment: \$200.00/container.

Note 2: Additional HDDS stop charge outside annual allotment: \$700/stop.

Note 3: Additional containers can be added to the monthly fee for \$200 each. Example, if the annual allotment is 1 stop and 4 containers, you can calculate the monthly fee by taking (\$200/12) + \$75.90 = \$92.57 per month.

Note 4: HDDS is an On-Call Program serviced through Clean Earth. Customers must call 866-783-7422 to schedule a pickup.

Note 5: Customers will be required to complete a qualifying Waste Characterization form provided by Stericycle prior to scheduling a pickup.

Note 6: Customers may be required to obtain a Generator ID number prior to completing the waste characterization checklist and scheduling a pickup.

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#### (N)Item 110 – Controlled Substance Wastage (CsRx) Services

For purposes of this Item 110:

"Controlled Substance Wastage" refers to controlled substance waste from institutional practitioners generated after the controlled substance has been administered to a patient on behalf of a registrant at the registrant's location.

"CsRx Services" refers to collection, transportation, treatment and/or disposal services for Controlled Substance Wastage, which is performed by a Stericycle vendor.

The rates stated in this Item 110 are flat rates per month based on container size as listed below.

Note 1: Containers must be replaced every 12-16 weeks to aide in the mitigation of diversion risk and to ensure the solution is properly saturated with water.

Note 2: CsRx should be sold in conjunction with HDDS or another disposal solution depending on the characterization of the client's formulary. The rates listed above are in addition to the rates listed in Item 105.

Note 3: This is not for disposal of controlled substances that are in a client's inventory, brought in by patients, or for Schedule 1 drugs.

Note 4: CsRx includes the collection container, a mounting bracket, a deterring solution, a solidifier, online training and auto replenishment as noted above in "Shipping Frequency."

Note 5: Monthly fee is based on qty of container shipped every 16 weeks. (1) 1.4 Qt container is \$25.00/month and (2) 1.4 Qt containers is \$50.00/month.
