1 **Q. PLEASE STATE YOUR NAME AND BUSINESS ADDRESS**

2 **A.** Greg R. Meyer. My business address is 16690 Swingley Ridge Road, Suite 140,

4 **Q. PLEASE STATE YOUR OCCUPATION**

5 **A.** I am a Senior Consultant in the field of public utility regulation with the firm of Brubaker
6 & Associates, Inc. (“BAI”), energy, economic and regulatory consultants.

7 **Q. PLEASE SUMMARIZE YOUR EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND AND**
8 **EXPERIENCE**

9 **A.** I graduated from the University of Missouri in 1979 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in
10 Business Administration, with a major in Accounting. Subsequent to graduation I was
11 employed by the Missouri Public Service Commission. I was employed with the
12 Commission from July 1, 1979 until May 31, 2008.

13 I began my employment at the Missouri Public Service Commission as a Junior
14 Auditor. During my employment at the Commission, I was promoted to higher auditing
15 classifications. My final position at the Commission was an Auditor V, which I held for
16 approximately ten years.

17 As an Auditor V, I conducted audits and examinations of the accounts, books,
18 records and reports of jurisdictional utilities. I also aided in the planning of audits and
19 investigations, including staffing decisions, and in the development of staff positions in
20 which the Auditing Department was assigned. I served as Lead Auditor and/or Case
21 Supervisor as assigned. I assisted in the technical training of other auditors, which
22 included the preparation of auditors’ workpapers, oral and written testimony.

1 During my career at the Missouri Public Service Commission, I presented
2 testimony in nine electric rate cases, nine gas rate cases, seven telephone rate cases and
3 several water and sewer rate cases. In addition, I was involved in cases regarding service
4 territory transfers. In the context of those cases listed above, I presented testimony on all
5 conventional ratemaking principles related to a utility's revenue requirement. During the
6 last three years of my employment with the Commission, I was involved in developing
7 transmission policy for the Southwest Power Pool as a member of the Cost Allocation
8 Working Group.

9 In June of 2008, I joined the firm of Brubaker & Associates, Inc. as a Consultant.
10 The firm Brubaker & Associates, Inc. provides consulting services in the field of energy
11 procurement and public utility regulation to many clients including industrial and
12 institutional customers, some utilities and, on occasion, state regulatory agencies.

13 More specifically, we provide analysis of energy procurement options based on
14 consideration of prices and reliability as related to the needs of the client; prepare rate,
15 feasibility, economic, and cost of service studies relating to energy and utility services;
16 prepare depreciation and feasibility studies relating to utility service; assist in contract
17 negotiations for utility services, and provide technical support to legislative activities.

19 Arizona and Corpus Christi, Texas.

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
