- Participate in meetings with key stakeholders that focus on company issues with the intention of gaining external support for the company's objectives.

Regional Advisory Board Member Roles and Responsibilities

Regional advisory board members serve as liaisons between opinion leaders within the region they represent and Pacific Power. They serve as both advisor and advocate. Their involvement will enhance regional communications mutually beneficial to Pacific Power and our customers. Regional advisory board members will work with regional community managers to accomplish the following:

- 1. Support the company's effort to develop and maintain constructive relationships with customers and communities:
- 2. Provide insight and communications regarding electric utility issues impacting the business community within the region;
- 3. Support issues mutually beneficial to Pacific Power and our customers related to system enhancements/operations, state/federal/local legislation, customer commitments, and regulatory requirements;
- 4. Evaluate the company's actions and proposals to ensure Pacific Power retains its relationships and commitments to its customers;
- 5. Maintain and enhance the company's image by communicating accurate and timely information impacting Pacific Power operations within the region. Communications with customers, elected officials, regulators, special interest groups, and charities is essential to maintaining positive regional relationships;
- 6. Consider and make recommendations on matters as requested through communications at bi-annual regional advisory board meetings as well as communications through the regional community manager:
- 7. Participate, with the regional community manager, in a minimum of two meetings annually with key stakeholders such as, local government officials, customers, etc. These meetings would be focused on presenting company issues with the intention of gaining external support and understanding of the company's business objectives.

Meetings

Regional advisory board members will be provided with accurate and timely information. Therefore, two meetings will be held each year in January and July. Meetings will be scheduled by the vice chairs. The agenda for all meetings will be submitted to the chair for approval. When necessary or advantageous, other information will be provided in the appropriate format.

Compensation

Regional advisory board members will receive \$2,500 per annum. Members will be reimbursed for actual reasonable travel expenses.
