Also, The Columbian newspaper had an article Feb. 18, 1998 about this as well (triggering the TV coverage)

- Estimates must be reasonable and the final cost must not exceed 10% over the estimate without signed authorization of the consumer. Low balling protection is unethical let alone illogical--the UTC and legislature must not allow this to occurr anymore.
- 2) invoices must clearly spell out costs in common language--most consumers are confused when reading invoices of household movers and are unable to understand what exactly is being charged (must like car leases.) In our case, I still do not know exactly how Blue Bird Transfer cheated us...low balling? padding the bill? both?
- 3) household movers must not be allowed to advertise vaguely under parent companies such as Mayflower and Allied--when our family had a problem (low balling) with our intrastate move (Blue Bird Transfer, Vancouver, WA). Allied said that they were not responsible for what had transpired. Yet I had hired the local moving agent because they were listed under the parent. I had no idea that parent companies are not responsible for intrastate moves. I believe that this is false advertising. In the yellow pages ad, there is no distinction between local and interstate moves.
