I On May 29, 2002, Washington Independent Telephone Association (WITA) filed with the Commission a petition for declaratory order pursuant to RCW 34.05.240 and WAC 480-09-230. Specifically, WITA seeks an order of the Commission declaring that:

- 1. The use of VNXX-like services are not in the public interest and prohibiting their use, or in the alternative, use of VNXX-like services are appropriately classified as interexchange services subject to the assessment and payment of access charges where the call originates and terminates in two separate rate centers without a Commission approved extended area service arrangement between those rate centers.
- 2. Such service arrangements are an inappropriate use of numbering resources where that service uses a new NPA/NXX for each rate center, and prohibit such practice.
- 3. Where a single NPA/NXX is desired to be spread over several rate centers, such practice would violate standards needed to implement number portability, and is prohibited.
- 2 A more detailed account of WITA's request for a declaratory order is reflected in the petition which is available for inspection at the Commission's offices located at Chandler Plaza Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington.
- 3 On June 7, 2002, the Commission gave notice of receipt of the petition for declaratory order, and gave interested persons the opportunity to submit statements of fact and law in response to the petition. AT&T Communications of the Pacific Northwest, Inc., TCG Oregon and TCG Seattle, Focal Communications Corporation of Washington, Fox Communications Corp., International Telecom, Inc., Pac West Telecom, Inc., Time Warner Telecom of Washington, LLC, WorldCom, Inc., and XO Washington, Inc. (collectively Joint CLECs) filed a joint statement of fact and law. KMC Telecom, Sprint

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Spectrum LP, Verizon Northwest Inc., and Level 3 Communications, LLC (Level 3), filed individual statements of fact and law.

- In its response, Level 3 cites *RCW* 34.05.240(7), declares that it is a necessary party, and objects to determination of this matter through a declaratory order proceeding. Level 3 suggests that all local exchange carriers, both incumbent and competitive are necessary parties to this proceeding because the declarations WITA seeks would have a profound impact on the entire telecommunications industry.
- 5 It is appropriate that the matters raised in the pleadings be brought for hearing before the Commission.
- Hearing in this matter is being held pursuant to Part IV of chapter 34.05 RCW pertaining to adjudicative proceedings, including but not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.449, RCW 34.05.452, RCW 80.36.610, RCW 80.36.300, RCW 80.01.100, RCW 34.05.240 and WAC 480-09-230. The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under Title 80 RCW, having legal authority to regulate the rates, services, and practices of telecommunications companies providing service within the state of Washington. In addition to the foregoing, statutes and rules involved include those within chapter 80.36 RCW, chapter 480-09 WAC, and chapter 480-120 WAC. The issues involved are generally stated above and more specifically contained in the petition.
- 7 NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that a prehearing conference in this matter will be held at 1:30 p.m., on Thursday, July 18, 2002, in the Commission's Hearing Room, Room 206, Chandler Plaza Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington.
- The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider formulating the issues in the proceeding, including the issue of defining *necessary parties* referenced in RCW 34.05.240(7), and to determine other matters to aid in its disposition, as specified in WAC 480-09-460.
- 9 Petitions to intervene should be made in writing prior to the hearing date or made orally at the hearing. The time and place for the evidentiary hearing will be set at the prehearing conference or by later written notice. Appearances will be taken.
- 10 If any party or witness needs an interpreter or other assistance, please fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission.
