1 **Synopsis:** *The Commission grants the company's request to withdraw the filing with leave to refile.*

2 **NATURE OF PROCEEDING.** On October 11, 2004, Iliad Water Services, Inc. filed a revision to its currently effective Tariff WN U-1, designated as Original Sheet No. W-104, establishing a one-time Treatment Assessment charge of \$3,265 to its Alder Lake Water System customers. The Commission suspended operation of the proposed tariff revision pending hearing concerning whether the proposed change is just and reasonable.

3 **APPEARANCES.** Richard A. Finnigan, attorney, Olympia, Washington, represents Iliad Water Services, Inc. (Iliad). Christopher Swanson, Assistant Attorney General, Olympia, Washington, represents the Commission's regulatory staff ("Commission Staff or Staff").

- 4 **BACKGROUND.** On May 23, 2005, the Commission convened a prehearing conference before Administrative Law Judge Dennis J. Moss. Among other things, the Commission invoked the discovery rule, entered a protective order, and established a procedural schedule. On May 24, 2005, Iliad filed a letter seeking to withdraw the filing and refile in the near future.
- 5 **REQUEST TO WITHDRAW FILING.** Iliad Water Services, Inc. filed its tariff revision on October 11, 2004, along with documentation supporting a one-time Treatment Assessment to its Alder Lake Water System customers. On May 24, 2005, Iliad requested that it be permitted to withdraw its filing in this docket. In support of its request, the Company represents that because of the age of the existing bid supporting its request in this docket, it will need to re-bid the project. Iliad intends to re-file its tariff with new supporting bid documentation information in the near future.
- 6 **DISCUSSION AND DECISION.** Based on our review of the record in this proceeding, we conclude that it is reasonable for the Company to re-bid the project and re-file its tariff revision with updated supporting bid documentation. Accordingly, the complaint should be dismissed, with leave to refile the tariff revision.

ORDER

- 7 THE COMMISSION grants the request of Iliad Water Services, Inc. to withdraw its tariff filing in Docket No. UW-041830. Accordingly, the complaint against Iliad Water Services, Inc. in Docket No. UW-041830 is dismissed. The Commission grants Iliad leave to refile its tariff revision and supporting documentation at a future date.
