To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is to ask for mitigation for a portion of the penalty assessed against Monroe Transportation LTD, dba Chinook Charter Service.

Needless to say, as a result of the survey, we have worked hard to both improve our maintenance and record keeping. The suggestions that the inspectors had for our maintenance record keeping have been instrumental in improving our operation.

We would though, like your organization to examine a few of our violations, to determine if some mitigation can occur. In the past, if we had violations that were fixed on site at the time of the examination, no monetary fine occurred. The violations that we repaired on site included a flat tire [it was inspected earlier in the day and was fine], and the push out windows. [enclosed please note copies of the write ups.]

What generated the majority of violations for one incident was the fact that we received 17 violations for not keeping records for a bus we no longer owned. As background, we donated a bus to a youth group in Poulsbo. In advance of their towing the bus to their location, we removed windows, lights and seats. The group then used the engine and transmission for one of their youth buses, and scrapped the hulk. At that time, we then discarded the maintenance records as the bus could never be put in service again. [Our insurance company also recommended that this be done.] As of this date, I now understand that we were supposed to keep the maintenance records for six months after the bus was scrapped. If possible, I would hope that a reduction in the number of violations for one incident could be considered, or the fine portion reduced.

We do understand and appreciate the work of the Washington Utilities and Transportation in these matters. We will continue to work with your inspectors to provide save and reliable transportation.

<sup>&</sup>quot;Perjury in the first degree. (1) A person is guilty of perjury in the first degree if in any official proceeding he makes a materially false statement which he knows to be false under an oath required or authorized by law. (2) Knowledge of the materiality of the statement is not an element of this crime, and the actor's mistaken belief that his statement was not material is not a defense to a prosecution under this section. (3) Perjury in the first degree is a class B felony."

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
