On May 9, 2012, Prothrive Operations, LLC d/b/a Rubbish Works (Rubbish Works), filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) an application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate motor vehicles in furnishing solid waste recyclable collection service limited to temporary drop boxes to residential customers in the following territory:

Puget Sound to the west, north of Federal Way and Auburn, and south of Everett. The eastern boundary is bounded by State Route 18 and Federal Way through Auburn to Snoqualmie, State Route 202 from Snoqualmie to Fall City, State Route 203 from Fall City to Monroe and State Highway 2 from Monroe to Everett.

Notice of the Application was published in the Commission's weekly Docket on May 31, 2012.

- STATUTORY AUTHORITY: The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under RCW Title 81, and has legal authority to regulate persons seeking to furnish solid waste collection services under RCW 81.77 and WAC 480-70. The statutes that apply to this matter include RCW 80.01, RCW 81.04, RCW 81.28, and RCW 81.77, including but not limited to RCW 80.01.040, RCW 81.04.020, and RCW 81.77.040.
- The Commission will hear this matter under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), particularly Part IV of RCW 34.05 relating to adjudications. The provisions of the APA that relate to this proceeding include, but are not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.422, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452. The Commission will also follow its procedural rules in WAC 480-07 in this proceeding.

The issues in this proceeding include whether the issuance of a certificate to Rubbish Works for the service it proposes is necessary and is otherwise consistent with the public interest, and whether any other carriers authorized to serve in the territory requested are serving to the satisfaction of the Commission.

- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That it will hold a prehearing conference in this matter at 1:30 p.m., on August 13, 2012, in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington.
- The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider requests for intervention, resolve scheduling matters including establishing dates for distributing evidence and workpapers, to identify the issues in the proceeding and determine other matters to assist the Commission in resolving the matter, as listed in WAC 480-07-430.
- INTERVENTION: Persons who wish to intervene should file a petition to intervene in writing at least three business days before the date of the prehearing conference. See WAC 480-07-355(a). The Commission will consider oral petitions to intervene during the conference, but strongly prefers written petitions to intervene. Party representatives must file a notice of appearance with the Commission no later than the business day before the conference. See WAC 480-07-345(2). Any party or witness in need of an interpreter or other assistance should fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission. The Commission will set the time and place for any evidentiary hearings at the prehearing conference, on the record of a later conference or hearing session, or by later written notice.
- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.
