1	Q.	Please state your name and business address.
2	A.	My name is Carla Patshkowski. My business address is 101 West 8 th Avenue, Spokane
3		WA 99204.
4	Q.	By whom are you employed and in what capacity?
5	A.	I am employed by Providence Medical Group as Finance Assistant.
6	Q.	Would you please describe your professional employment experience?
7	A.	I have worked for Providence Medical Group for twenty years. The main scope of my
8		work is and has been purchasing and accounts payable.
9	Q.	What are your primary responsibilities for Providence Medical Group?
0	A.	Among my duties, I am responsible for managing all vendors and purchasing needs,
1		including the collection and handling of Providence Medical Group's regulated
2		biomedical waste ("RMW").
3	Q.	What are the subjects of the testimony you are offering today?
4	A.	I will testify about the reasons why Providence Medical Group supports Waste
5		Management of Washington, Inc.'s application for statewide authority to provide RMW
6		services.
7	Q.	Please describe Providence Medical Group's facilities.
8	A.	Providence Medical Group owns and operates physician clinics and family medicine
9		centers in Chewelah, Colville, and Spokane. Providence Medical Group continues to
20		grow and expects to be adding additional facilities throughout the State of Washington.
21	Q.	Who provides Providence Medical Group's RMW service?
22	A.	For most of its facilities, Providence Medical Group's RMW services are provided by
23		Waste Management. However, the Providence Medical Group facilities in Chewelah
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and Colville are provided by Stericycle of Washington, Inc., the only available service provider.

- Q. Does Providence Medical Group support Waste Management's application for statewide authority?
- A. Yes.

- Q. Why does Providence Medical Group support this application?
 - Prior to Waste Management's obtaining authority to offer RMW services in its UTC territory, Stericycle provided all of Providence Medical Group's RMW services throughout the State of Washington. Providence Medical Group was dissatisfied with Stericycle's services because Stericycle charged (and still charges) a minimum monthly fee even when there is no RMW collected, because Stericycle charged (and still charges) for containers that were too large for the limited RMW some of the Providence Medical Group facilities generate, and because Stericycle required (and still requires) frequent pick-ups of RMW even where more infrequent ones would suffice based on the more limited quantity of RMW. Once Providence Medical Group had an alternative, it moved its RMW business to Waste Management because Waste Management does not charge a monthly minimum fee and Waste Management audited Providence Medical Group's various facilities and determined the most economical and efficient size of container and frequency of collection. Moreover, once Providence Medical Group terminated Stericycle's services in Waste Management's UTC territory, Stericycle continued billing Providence Medical Group for eight months for service in the Waste Management territory. Month after month of complaints yielded no resolution of Stericycle's improper billing and the billing was only corrected after
