In accordance with the Order Requiring Filing By Eligible Telecommunications Carriers Receiving Federal High Cost Support, dated July 25, 2001, entered by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission in Docket No. UT-013047 ("Certification Order") and with WAC 480-120-399(2), enclosed herewith for filing on behalf of Pioneer Telephone Company ("Company") is a Certification of Use of Federal High-Cost Universal Service Support Funds. The Company hereby respectfully requests that, based upon the enclosed certification and pursuant to 47 C.F.R. ' ' 54.314(a), (c) and (d), the Commission make and file, not later than October 1, 2005, with the Administrator of the Federal High-Cost Universal Service Fund and the Federal Communications Commission the certification described in 47 C.F.R. §§ 54.314(a) and (c), and that the Commission include the Company in the list of carriers to which such certification applies.

In accordance with WAC 480-120-399(2)(d), the figure set forth in item (4) of the enclosed certification is the sum of the amounts received by the Company for those Federal universal service support components commonly referred to as "high cost loop support," "long-term support," "local switching support" and "interstate common line support." It is the Company's understanding that amounts associated with some of those components and included in that reported figure may not yet be final.

Lastly, the memorandum, dated May 13, 2005, from Bob Shirley of the Commission Staff to Eligible Telecommunications Carriers ("ETCs") requested that each ETC provide the Commission Staff with copies of the advertising conducted by each ETC in 2004 or 2005 to meet its obligations under Federal law with respect to the advertising of services supported by Federal High-Cost Universal Service Support Funds and the Federal Lifeline and Link-Up programs. Accordingly, enclosed with this letter are copies of the following materials:

- (a) Advertisement published in the Whitman County Gazette;
- (b) Informational brochures regarding the Washington Telephone Assistance Program which works with the Federal Lifeline and Link-Up available in several languages available in the office;

NOTICE

Pioneer Telephone Company ("Company") has filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission ("WUTC") certain revisions to the Company's Tariff WN U-3.

The tariff revisions modify the "Washington Telephone Assistance Program" schedule in Section IV of the Company's Tariff WN U-3. More specifically, the revisions incorporate into the tariff new enhanced support that, commencing on or about October 1, 2000, is expected to be available to certain participants in the federal Lifeline service program and new expanded benefits that, again commencing on or about October 1, 2000, is expected to be available to certain participants in the federal Link Up program. This tariff filing is being made principally in response to requirements established by the Federal Communications Commission.

The federal Lifeline program includes a retail local service offering ("Lifeline service") that is available only to qualifying low-income consumers and for which qualifying low-income consumers pay charges that have been reduced in certain respects. Under the Link Up program, qualifying low-income consumers (1) may receive a reduction in the Company's customary charge for commencing telecommunications service for qualifying connections at qualifying locations and (2) may have a deferred schedule for payment of qualifying charges assessed by the Company for commencing such service.

Included in the Lifeline program is Toll Limitation service in the form of Toll Blocking, which is available at no Company charge to subscribers who subscribe to Lifeline service provided by the Company. "Toll Blocking" is a service provided by carriers that lets a subscriber elect not to allow the completion of outgoing toll calls from the subscriber's telephone line.

The changes to the federal Lifeline and Link Up programs expand the classes of persons that may receive those benefits and increase the amount of reduction in the Company's charges that are available to qualifying low-income consumers in certain areas. Currently, in the State of Washington only participants in certain Department of Social and Health Services support programs may receive benefits under the federal Lifeline and Link Up programs. Commencing on or about October 1, 2000, in addition to those persons, persons participating in certain federal support programs and residing on "Tribal lands" will also be eligible for the Lifeline and Link Up programs. In addition, the Company's charges under the Lifeline and Link Up programs will be further reduced for all qualifying low-income consumers living on "Tribal lands." For these purposes, "Tribal lands" means tribal reservations and areas "near reservations" that have been designated as such by the federal Bureau of Indian Affairs.

The tariff sheets that comprise the tariff filing have an issued date of August 24, 2000, and a stated effective date of September 25, 2000. However, the Company has requested that the WUTC permit the revised tariff sheets become effective as soon as possible, and in no event later than August 31, 2000, by "L.S.N. Order" on less than statutory notice.

A copy of the proposed tariff sheets and the Company's present Tariff WN U-3 are on file in this office, and the public is invited to inspect them. If you wish, a member of our staff will be pleased to assist you in securing information from both the present Tariff and the proposed tariff sheets.
