- 3 Friedlander, the administrative law judge presiding
- 4 over this matter. We are here before the Washington
- 5 Utilities and Transportation Commission on Wednesday,
- 6 July 29th, 2009, for a prehearing conference regarding
- 7 a complaint filed by Qwest Corporation against
- 8 McLeodUSA Telecommunications Services, Inc., doing
- 9 business as PAETEC Business Services.
- 10 Qwest's complaint alleges that PAETEC has
- 11 been assessing a discriminatory wholesale service order
- 12 fee against Qwest when a PAETEC customer switches its
- 13 local service to Qwest.
- 14 The purpose of the prehearing conference
- 15 today is to take appearances of the parties, discuss
- 16 the schedule for the Commission's consideration of the
- 17 Complaint, and any other procedural matters that the
