                 And the company, can you please state your

- MR. BREWER: Yes, my name is Cameron Brewer
- 3 with Reliance Moving.
- 4 JUDGE CHARTOFF: And please state your
- 5 address.
- 6 MR. BREWER: Address is 4717 Bevan Street,
- 7 that's B-e-v-a-n, Bellingham, Washington 98226.
- 8 JUDGE CHARTOFF: And telephone number and
- 9 email?
- 10 MR. BREWER: Telephone number is
- 11 951-227-6705, and email address is
- 12 reliancemovingoffice@gmail.com.
- 13 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
- Okay. So I'll provide a brief roadmap for
- 15 today's proceeding. We are here today because the
- 16 Commission issued a notice of intent to deny the
- 17 company's application for permit and authority as a
- 18 household goods carrier. Mr. Brewer requested a hearing
- 19 to have the opportunity to respond to the allegations
- 20 contained in that notice and explain why the application
- 21 should be approved.
- So how we typically do this type of
- 23 proceeding is we start by having Mr. Roberson give a
- 24 brief overview of Staff's case, and then you can present
- 25 your case, Mr. Brewer, following which Mr. Roberson

- 1 presents Staff's case. And once all the witnesses have
- 2 testified, both parties will have a chance to make
- 3 closing statements.
- 4 Are there any questions or concerns about
- 5 that order?
- 6 MR. ROBERSON: No.
- 7 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Okay. So.
- 8 Mr. Roberson, you may proceed with an opening statement.
- 9 MR. ROBERSON: Good morning. As you
- 10 mentioned, this is an application for a household goods
- operating authority, WAC 480-15-302(8)(a) and WAC
- 12 480-15-305(2), provided that the Commission will deny
- 13 any application for operating authority where any named
- 14 person in the application has a certain type of
- 15 conviction within five years of the date of the
- 16 application.
- 17 In the course of processing Mr. Brewer's
- 18 application, Staff discovered a petty theft conviction,
- 19 excuse me, from California roughly a year before the
- 20 date of application and recommended denying the
- 21 application on that basis. As I understand it,
- 22 Mr. Brewer's here to present possibly evidence as to why
- 23 the Commission should grant him an exemption from that
- 24 rule, and Staff would just like to hear that evidence
- 25 before it offers a recommendation on whether or not to

- 1 grant the exemption.
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Okay. And -- okay.
- 3 So before you start speaking, I would like to swear you
- 4 in. So please stand and raise your right hand.
- 5 (Cameron Brewer sworn.)
- 6 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Please be seated. Okay.
- 7 So what would you like to tell us today?
- 8 MR. BREWER: So my wife and I moved up here
- 9 to Bellingham, Washington, from Corona, California,
- 10 about two years ago. I got a letter in the mail from
- 11 Riverside Court about a petty theft charge. So
- 12 basically, they put a warrant out for my arrest. I have
- 13 no knowledge of this -- this petty theft.
- 14 When -- I was trying to get my license at
- 15 the time so I could start obviously making money and
- 16 doing moving because that's what I was doing down in
- 17 California. I -- I had to plead quilty to this charge
- 18 because I can't go down to California. We moved up here
- 19 with \$2,000 into a room for rent so -- and my wife was
- 20 six months pregnant, so it just really wasn't an option
- 21 to go down to California to contest the case.
- So I pleaded guilty to it, which was a big
- 23 mistake now I'm finding out and -- yeah, that's pretty
- 24 much it. I -- I got the warrant dismissed, and I got my
- 25 license back. And now when I tried to apply for the

#### Page 8 permit, it's kind of coming back to haunt me. So yeah, 2 that's -- that's basically it. JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Okay. Let me make 3 sure I got all that. So you moved here two years ago 4 from Corona, California, you're living in Bellingham? 5 6 MR. BREWER: Yes. JUDGE CHARTOFF: You got a -- how were you 8 notified of the charge? 9 MR. BREWER: Through the mail. JUDGE CHARTOFF: And when -- what was the 10 date of the theft? 11 12 MR. BREWER: I really don't know. It was 13 kind of one of those things I had to hire a lawyer to go to court for me to plead guilty to get -- to start 14 paying on the fines so I could get my license back, 15 16 which was a mistake. 17 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Do you have any questions for Mr. Brewer? 18 19 MR. ROBERSON: May I have a second to confer with my client? 20 21 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Sure. 22 We can be off the record. 23 (Pause in the proceedings.) JUDGE CHARTOFF: We're on the record. 24 25 /////

- 1 EXAMINATION
- 2 BY MR. ROBERSON:
- Q. Good morning, Mr. Brewer. So do you remember
- 4 being arrested for this offense?
- 5 A. I was not arrested.
- 6 Q. So you were charged with something you weren't
- 7 arrested for?
- 8 A. Yes, sir.
- 9 Q. Okay. Do you have any idea what the underlying
- 10 crime involved with the charge is?
- 11 A. I think they said I stole a bottle of alcohol.
- 12 Q. So it was --
- 13 A. From a grocery store.
- Q. So this is petty theft?
- 15 A. Mm-hmm.
- 16 Q. Did they give you any idea as to the value of
- 17 the alcohol?
- 18 A. No.
- 19 Q. Okay. You hired an attorney to go to court to
- 20 get the warrant quashed?
- 21 A. Mm-hmm, that was the main reason for it.
- 0. Okay. The warrant is quashed?
- 23 A. Yes.
- Q. And you've paid off all the fines?
- 25 A. Yes, sir.

- 1 Q. And you are not -- you pled guilty, just for the
- 2 record?
- 3 A. Yes, sir.
- 4 O. You did not serve any time?
- 5 A. No.
- 6 Q. Were you placed on probation?
- 7 A. No, I don't think so.
- 8 Q. But you're not sure?
- 9 A. I'm not sure.
- 10 Q. Okay.
- 11 A. Probation for pleading guilty to this crime?
- 12 No.
- 13 Q. Yeah.
- 14 A. No.
- 15 Q. No.
- So the only, I guess, penalty to the extent that
- 17 there was for your guilty plea was that you paid fines?
- 18 A. Yes, sir.
- 19 Q. Can you give me an idea as to the size of the
- 20 fine?
- 21 A. It was 900-and-something dollars.
- Q. Okay. Are there any other convictions that
- 23 would be relevant? Any theft convictions, anything like
- 24 that?
- 25 A. No, no theft convictions, no.

- 1 Q. Any other convictions?
- 2 A. I have --
- 3 Q. Let me rephrase that.
- 4 Any for fraud, sexual assault, assault, drugs in
- 5 terms of manufacturer or sale?
- 6 A. No way.
- 7 O. None of those?
- 8 A. No way.
- 9 O. Okay. How old were those convictions?
- 10 A. These -- the ones -- the ones that I was going
- 11 to say right now?
- 12 Q. Yeah.
- 13 A. These were from when I was 17. I think my
- 14 last -- my last one was like 21, and these were DUIs.
- 15 Q. Okay. How old are you now?
- 16 A. I'm 26.
- 17 O. Okay.
- 18 A. 27, sorry.
- 19 Q. So it's been more than five years?
- 20 A. It's been more than five years.
- 21 O. Okay.
- 22 A. And I'm married with two children and completely
- 23 changed my life around, so kind of frustrating to have
- 24 this stuff keep popping up, but that's why I'm here.
- 25 Q. Understandable.

- 1 MR. ROBERSON: I don't think I have any
- 2 further questions.
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Okay. Do you have
- 4 anything further?
- 5 MR. BREWER: Yeah, I just wanted to say that
- 6 we're the moving company that you guys want to grant a
- 7 permit to. We take extreme care of our customers'
- 8 personal items, we're honest, reliable, hence the name
- 9 "Reliance Moving." And I just -- this is -- this is my
- 10 livelihood, this is what I do.
- I enjoy helping people when they're super
- 12 stressed out, that's why I started this moving company.
- 13 And I just think it would be a really good idea to grant
- 14 us this permit so we can do it the right way. We've
- 15 already invested so much money into this, and it's --
- 16 I'm not going to stop. If I have to wait five years for
- 17 this to pass, then I will. I'll be back. And yeah,
- 18 that's pretty much it. This is -- this is my life, and
- 19 this is what I do so...
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Thank you.
- 21 Does Staff want to present its case?
- MR. ROBERSON: Yeah. Staff calls Mike
- 23 Dotson.
- 24 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Please stand and raise your
- 25 right hand.

- 1 (Mike Dotson sworn.)
- 2
- 3 EXAMINATION
- 4 BY MR. ROBERSON:
- 5 Q. Would you please state your name and spell it
- 6 for the record?
- 7 A. Mike Dotson, M-i-k-e, D-o-t-s-o-n.
- 8 Q. And who employs you?
- 9 A. The Utilities and Transportation Commission.
- 10 Q. And in what capacity do you work for the
- 11 Commission?
- 12 A. Sorry. I work in licensing services.
- 13 Q. And --
- 14 A. I process the regulated company applications
- 15 that are come -- that come in.
- 16 Q. Can you describe any trainings or education that
- 17 you've had that enable you to carry out your duties?
- 18 A. I was trained by the prior employee that held my
- 19 position, my managers trained me, and lots of just
- 20 on-the-job training.
- Q. And you're familiar with the rules and statutes
- 22 that govern the licensing of household goods movers?
- 23 A. Yes, I am.
- 24 O. Okay. And you're familiar with Mr. Brewer's
- 25 application?

- 1 A. I am.
- Q. And you've heard Mr. Brewer testify today?
- 3 A. Yes, I have.
- 4 Q. And do you have any thoughts as to whether or
- 5 not the Commission should grant an exemption to
- 6 Mr. Brewer from the licensing requirements?
- 7 A. Based on the nature of the conviction, whether
- 8 it happened, whether he did it or not, it seems minimal
- 9 enough that I would not want to stop him from getting
- 10 his permit.
- 11 Q. And you found no other red flags when you were
- 12 processing Mr. Brewer's application?
- 13 A. No, there did not seem to be a history of this
- 14 sort of crime.
- MR. ROBERSON: I have no further questions.
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
- 17 Do you have any questions for Mr. Dotson?
- MR. BREWER: I'll have a lot of questions if
- 19 I get granted the permit on the rules and regulations.
- 20 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Okay. Does either
- 21 party have anything further before we go off the record?
- MR. ROBERSON: No, Your Honor.
- 23 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Thanks for coming
- 24 here today. I will -- I will issue an order within ten
- 25 days. We are off the record. Thank you.
