I have just received and reviewed Household Goods Rulemaking Docket No. TV-971477, July 15, 1998 Draft 4C. I was pleased to see the proposed definition of household goods found at proposed WAC 480-15-020(11). Specifically:

Household goods, when the term is used in connection with transportation, means personal effects and property used or to be used in a residence when it is part of the equipment or supply of such residence, and is transported between residences or between a residence and a storage facility with the intent to later transport to a residence. This term excludes transportation of customer packed and sealed self-storage type containers when no accessories services are provided by the carrier in connection with the transportation of the container.

As Division Counsel for Shurgard Storage To Go I have attended several of the drafting sessions involving the above referenced rulemaking. The above definition was fully discussed at these sessions, with all interested parties given ample opportunity to participate.
