Attached are Puget Sound Energy's ("PSE's") revisions to its Energy Efficiency Exhibits 3 (Program Details) and Exhibit 4 (Measures, Incentives & Eligibility) for Q2 2018. The revisions in both exhibits demonstrate PSE's consistent application of continuous improvement to adaptively manage a dynamic marketplace, ensure that offerings meet customer expectations, and clarify participation qualifications. As part of its routine update practice, PSE made grammar improvements, and corrected spelling and punctuation errors (which for the most part, appear in the detailed measure tables, where acronyms are more likely to be used).

Other improvements and revisions include, but are not limited to:

## Exhibit 3

### In Q2, PSE:

- Clarified product classifications in the Single Family Existing measure types, and removed "electronics" from Section C of page 15, as this classification consisted only of the advanced power strip, which is only offered on a direct-install basis,
- Added clarifying language to the Home Energy Assessment and Contract Alliance programs,
- Clarified some Events Team terms and Education funding tactics, and
- Made significant revision to the Net Metering and Production Metering sections.

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# Exhibit 4

### In Q2, PSE:

- Adjusted incentive levels on various LED lamps in the Retail program and removed 0.95
  EF water heaters in the Single-Family Space/Water heat program, due to the products'
  cost-ineffectiveness,
- Corrected the EF (Efficiency Factor) value indicated for natural gas Tankless Water Heaters in the Space/Water Heat program,
- Removed retail advanced power strips, due to cost-ineffectiveness,
- Removed the electric line-voltage thermostat in the Multifamily Retrofit's natural gas offerings,
- Clarified and updated qualifications and incentives for the Commercial Upstream incentive pilot, and
- Completely revised eligibility and payment discussions in the Net Metering program.

Consistent with WAC 480-109-110(3), PSE provided its Conservation Resource Advisory Group ("CRAG") with mark-up versions (to enhance references to updates) of the Microsoft Word documents on July 13. As of the date of this filing, PSE has received no comments or questions.
