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- 1 PROCEEDINGS
- 2 JUDGE MACE: Let's be on the record in the
- 3 matter of the Washington Utilities and Transportation
- 4 Commission versus Kayak Estates Water, Docket No.
- 5 UW-051444. This is the date we are convened for a
- 6 prehearing conference on this matter. The date is
- 7 February 6th, 2006, and we are convened at the offices
- 8 of the Washington Utilities and Transportation
- 9 Commission in Olympia, Washington.
- 10 My name is Theodora Mace. I'm the
- 11 administrative law judge who has been assigned to this
- 12 case. I would like to have the oral appearances of
- 13 counsel now, and I'll begin with Staff.
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: I'm Jennifer
- 15 Cameron-Rulkowski, assistant attorney general,
- 16 appearing on behalf of Commission staff. My address is

- JUDGE MACE: Mr. Finnigan?
- 22 MR. FINNIGAN: Richard A. Finnigan appearing
- 23 on behalf of Kayak Estates Water, LLC. The address is

- JUDGE MACE: Thank you. Well, as usual, we
- 3 have a list of items to go through in a prehearing
- 4 conference, and I'm just going to run through them
- 5 quickly.
- 6 In terms of petitions to intervene, let the
- 7 record show that no petitions to intervene have been
- 8 filed in writing, and there are none orally today.
- 9 Just let me check briefly. Is there anyone on the
- 10 conference bridge? Let the record reflect there is no
- 11 one.
- 12 The next item is whether or not a protective
- 13 order should be activated in this docket. What are the
- 14 parties' preferences in that regard?
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: We have no position.
- MR. FINNIGAN: Yes, we request a protective
- 17 order.
- 18 JUDGE MACE: I will see that the standard
- 19 protective order is invoked. How about discovery? Do
- 20 you want to have the discovery rule invoked?
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Yes.
- 22 JUDGE MACE: The next item is the procedural
- 23 schedule. Unless you two have discussed a procedural
- 24 schedule beforehand, we'll take a few minutes now for
- 25 you to come up with one that we can propose to the

- 1 Commission. Let's be off the record for about ten
- 2 minutes.
- 3 (Discussion off the record.)
- 4 JUDGE MACE: We had lengthy discussions about
- 5 the schedule, and the parties are proposing this
- 6 schedule: A filing date for the Company and possibly
- 7 for Staff of February 28th; a settlement conference
- 8 possibly for March 16th depending on judge
- 9 availability; a date for response testimony of March
- 10 22nd; rebuttal on April 11th; a hearing May 11th;
- 11 briefs, June 9th; reply briefs, June 23rd; initial
- order, July 28th; petitions for review, August 18th;
- 13 replies to petitions, August 28th, and then the final
- 14 order coming out by September 27th, and the Company has
- 15 agreed to waive the suspension period until that date.
- MR. FINNIGAN: That is correct, Your Honor.
- JUDGE MACE: My understanding is that there
- 18 will be a total of approximately four witnesses, give
- 19 or take two, and that will be determined as time goes
- 20 on.
- 21 Since this is a relatively less intensive
- 22 type of case, I'm not certain we need a prehearing
- 23 conference to deal with exhibits. Likely those can
- 24 come in on the hearing day. It may be that the judge
- 25 who is assigned to this case after I am will make some

- 1 requirement of you about sending an exhibit list or
- 2 witnesses ahead of time.
- Actually, as I think about it, I'm going to
- 4 put a date in here by which I would like you to submit
- 5 to the Commission exhibit lists and witness lists. If
- 6 the hearing is May 11th, let's make that May 9th,
- 7 electronically. Of course, your direct exhibits will
- 8 have been filed.
- 9 All right. We haven't talked about
- 10 discovery, but I'm assuming that you all will be acting
- 11 cooperatively to accomplish discovery. If you have any
- 12 questions or concerns, you can contact me or probably
- 13 Judge Wallis after I leave. Is there anything else we
- 14 need to address at this point?
- 15 You will be getting a prehearing conference
- order that will tell you how many copies you need to
- 17 file, your testimony and exhibits, and give you other
- 18 information. If you would like to file electronically,
- 19 you need to contact me or whatever judge is assigned,
- 20 so you can get permission to do that.
- 21 Also, I believe if you file through the Web
- 22 portal, and I don't know if you are familiar with that,
- 23 it's much appreciated if you would send an electronic
- 24 copy to the judge of whatever you file, because at
- 25 least in recent experience, those filings made through

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the Web portal have not always made it to the judge in a timely way. MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: How many copies? JUDGE MACE: You will get that in the prehearing conference order. MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Thank you. JUDGE MACE: I think that's pretty much it. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact me. We are adjourned. Thank you. (Prehearing conference adjourned at 11:21 a.m.)
