Today is Wednesday, October 5th, 2016, and the time is 1:30 p.m. This is 8 9 Docket TE-160822, which is captioned In the Matter of Determining the Proper Carrier Classification of and 10 11 Complaint for Penalties Against Marcus Allen Perkins and 12 Emerald City Party Bus, LLC, d/b/a Ellie's Limo and 13 Luxury Car Service. 14 My name is Rayne Pearson. I'm the 15 administrative law judge presiding over today's brief 16 adjudicative proceeding. So we'll start by taking 17 appearances from both parties, and then we'll talk about 18 how we're going to proceed this afternoon. 19 So let's start with Commission Staff, 20 Mr. Roberson, if you would just give a brief appearance. 21 MR. ROBERSON: Good afternoon, your Honor. 22 My name is Jeff Roberson. I'm an assistant attorney 23 general representing Commission Staff. My address is 24 1400 South Evergreen Park Drive SW, P.O. Box 40128, Olympia, Washington 98504. My telephone number is area 25

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code (360) 664-1188, and my e-mail address is j-r-o-b-e-r-s-o@utc.wa.gov.
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JUDGE PEARSON: Thank you.

And Mr. Perkins, if you could just state your first and last name and provide your address, telephone number and e-mail address.

MR. PERKINS (via the bridge line): Yes, ma'am. It's Marcus Allen Perkins. Address is 20115 32nd Avenue South, SeaTac, Washington 98198. My e-mail is reservations@emeraldcitypartybus.com.

JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. And so Mr. Perkins this is a classification hearing that was brought by the Commission based on Staff's finding that you were conducting business as a charter party or excursion service carrier without the required certificate from the Commission.

So if we determine here today that you're conducting such business, we will issue an order requiring you to cease and desist all operations unless and until you obtain a certificate from the Commission.

And we also have a complaint for penalties.

That's somewhat of a separate issue. The complaint for penalties alleges that you have, in fact, engaged in activities as a charter party or excursion service carrier. So today is an evidentiary hearing to consider

whether you should be classified as a charter party or excursion service carrier and whether penalties are appropriate.

So Mr. Perkins, if you have any questions about the applicable laws, please let me know. I'm assuming that you're at least somewhat familiar with Commission laws and rules because you have applied for charter and excursion authority in the past.

MR. PERKINS: Yes, ma'am.

JUDGE PEARSON: So -- sorry. What did you

11 | say?

MR. PERKINS: I said, yes, ma'am. Yes, your

JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.

Staff alleges that you have at least once offered to provide charter party or excursion carrier services without having first obtained the required certificate, and that you have also advertised to provide charter party or excursion carrier services on at least three separate occasions. And Staff is requesting penalties of up to \$5,000 per violation as set forth in the complaint.

So Staff will present its case first today, and then you'll have the opportunity to cross-examine Staff's witness, Mr. Turcott, so you can ask him any

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    questions. And then after that, you'll have a chance to
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    testify, and Mr. Roberson may have some questions for
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    you.

  - O. Good afternoon.

Can you please state your name and spell it for the record.

- A. Good afternoon. Michael -- good afternoon.
- 7 | Michael L. Turcott, T-U-R-C-O-T-T.
  - Q. And what is your occupation?
  - A. I'm a compliance investigator with the
    Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission,
    working in the Transportation Safety section.
    - Q. And how long have you been a Commission investigator?
      - A. For one year.
    - Q. What did you do before you began working for the Commission?
    - A. I worked as a commissioned officer with the Washington State Patrol for 28 years, holding a variety of assignments. I retired in November 2013 from the Patrol as a lieutenant in field operations.
- I worked -- following that, I worked for a year and a half at the Department of Licensing. I was the administrator of the driver and vehicle title fraud investigation unit until I went to work here at the Commission one year ago.

## DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. ROBERSON / TURCOTT

- Q. And can you describe any trainings or educations you've received that enable you to carry out your duties as a Commission investigator?
- A. Yes. I had training throughout my career at the Patrol and with Department of Licensing and once I came to the Commission. Training was related to overall criminal and traffic investigations, training in vehicle licensing records, business licensing, databases.

And then once at the Commission, I received training in the licensing procedures and records here, along with the rules and regulations and statutes that apply to charter passenger services.

- Q. Are you aware of an individual named Marcus Allen Perkins?
- A. I am.
  - Q. And are you aware of Mr. Perkins' occupation?
  - A. I am aware that Mr. Perkins is the owner/operator of a limousine and/or charter service company. He may have other employment as well.
    - O. Okay.

Has Mr. Perkins, to your knowledge, ever operated a sole proprietorship named Ellie's Limo and Luxury Car Service?

- A. Yes.
- 25 Q. Okay.

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## DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. ROBERSON / TURCOTT 10

- Can you turn to Exhibit MT-7?
  - A. Okay. Ready.
  - Q. Is that a true and accurate copy of the Department of Revenue report showing that Mr. Perkins operated as Ellie's Limo and Luxury Car Service?
    - A. Yes, it is.
  - Q. And as you said, Mr. Perkins works for a different company now. Can you tell me what that is?
  - A. My investigation found that Mr. Perkins is the governing person in an LLC company -- just give me a moment here -- Ellie's -- just one moment -- Emerald City Party Bus, LLC, doing business as Ellie's Limo and Luxury Car Service. And Marcus Perkins is listed as one of the governing persons -- well, the governing person for that business.
    - Q. Thank you.
  - Did Mr. Perkins' operation of the sole proprietorship, which used the trade name Ellie's Limo, exist at the same time as Emerald City, which also used the same trade name?
  - A. Yes. There was actually a one-year overlap in those two businesses.
    - Q. Thank you.
- Has the Commission ever investigated Mr. Perkins
  before the current matter?

#### DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. ROBERSON / TURCOTT 11

 $1 \mid A.$  Yes.

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- Q. And when was that?
- A. It was May of 2014.
- Q. Did Mr. Perkins e-mail Commission Staff in the course of that investigation?
  - A. Yes, he did.
  - Q. And what did Mr. Perkins say in that e-mail?
- A. This was an e-mail from Mr. Perkins in response to technical assistance provided by Betty Young, who was a, at that time, compliance investigator in my section.

And Ms. Young had reached out to Mr. Perkins after seeing a Craigslist ad, and she provided the very standard technical assistance, referring to his advertisement, explaining what the law was, and asking him to either submit an application or explain in writing why he felt his business was not under the jurisdiction of the UTC.

And Mr. Perkins' response was that he was familiar with the guidelines as he had worked under the UTC with his bus previously, and that he was currently on light duty, disabled status working from home, and he only does dispatching of vehicles and referring of services to other carriers.

Q. Okay.

But you said Mr. Perkins stated in that e-mail

- 1 that he was familiar with the Commission's regulations?
- 2 A. Yes, he did.
  - Q. Did Commission Staff close that particular investigation after receiving Mr. Perkins' e-mail?
    - A. Yes, they did.
  - Q. Okay.

But did Commission Staff ever begin a new investigation of Mr. Perkins and/or Emerald City?

- A. Yes.
- Q. And when was that?
- 11 A. That was shortly after I came to work at the
  12 Commission. I began looking again at some old cases,
  13 and looking on the internet for advertising of party bus
  14 services, and I located his company website.
- Q. And I'm sorry. Actually, I'm going to have you jump back.
- Could you turn to Exhibit MT-1?
- 18 A. Yes.
  - Q. Is that a true and accurate copy of the e-mail in which Mr. Perkins stated that he was familiar with the Commission's regulations?
- 22 A. Yes.
- Q. Thank you. Okay.
- Turning back to the current investigation -- my apologies -- on January 4th, 2016, did you view Emerald

- 1 | City Party Bus's website?
  - A. Yes, I did.
    - Q. Would you turn to Exhibit MT-2?
- $4 \mid A.$  Okay.
  - Q. Is that series of pages a true and accurate screen capture of Emerald City's website as you saw it on that day?
    - A. Yes.
  - Q. And what did you find on the website when you saw it?
- 11 A. Well, it has the phone number (206) 571-5363.

  12 It says, "Thank you for visiting Emerald City. My name

  13 is Marcus Perkins," and he goes on to explain the

  14 business services that he offers. It has an Ambaum

  15 Boulevard address, 17431.

And I found that the -- though the website advertises services that fell within the jurisdiction of the UTC, specifically party bus services, a vehicle is depicted with perimeter seating that allows the passengers to circulate around the vehicle, as per the definition of a party bus. It also has additional amenities such as beverage service and lights and sound and TVs and those sorts of things.

In addition, there was transportation advertised that was in excess of 14 passengers behind the driver,

- which is what would be allowed under a limousine license, but in excess of 14 falls within the jurisdiction of the UTC.
  - Q. And did you say that Mr. Perkins identifies himself as the author of the website?
  - A. Yes. The website reads, "My name is Marcus Perkins, I am the owner and have been in the chauffeur business for over 10 years."
  - Q. Now, is it a violation of RCW 81.72.220 to engage in the business of a charter party or excursion services carrier without a certificate of authority from the Commission or registering as an interstate carrier?
  - A. Yes.
    - Q. Does advertising or soliciting or offering to provide charter party or excursion service carrier [sic] constitute engaging in the business of a charter party or excursion services carrier? Sorry. That's a really long question.
- 19 A. Yes.
- Q. Did you check to see if Emerald City has registered as an interstate carrier?
- 22 A. I did.
- Q. How did you do that?
- A. The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration, or FMCSA, has a website where a person can check the

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- 1 company's status, their DOT authority, et cetera.
  - And was Mr. Perkins registered as an interstate carrier?
  - He was registered, but did not have current Α. authority.
    - Could you turn to Exhibit MT-6? 0.

Is that a true and accurate copy of the USDOT Company Snapshot showing that Emerald City is not registered currently as an interstate carrier?

- 10 Α. Yes.
  - Has Emerald City or Mr. Perkins held a Department of License [sic] limousine endorsement since 2014?
- 14 Α. No.
  - So at the time you visited the website, he was not authorized to operate as a limousine carrier?
  - For -- checking limousine records, I'm not able to access those myself directly. I had to call Ms. Jody Sisk, who is the limousine program manager at Department of Licensing, who checked the records on my behalf, and she advised that there was no current limousine authority, and nothing -- at least since 2014 when they switched to a new records system.
    - Q. Thank you.
- 25 Have you ever viewed Emerald City's Facebook

- 2 | A. Yes.
  - Q. Have you seen a post on a page dated March 27,

  - Q. Is that a true and accurate screen capture of the Facebook posting that you saw dated that --
- 10 | March 27th, 2016?

  - Q. And could you tell me what that post contains?
- 13 A. The top of the Facebook page says "Emerald City

  15 there of the Seattle skyline with the Space Needle,
  16 which I observed in other advertising as well.

In the "About" area, the "About" section, the business address is 20115 32nd Avenue South, Seattle, Washington, the business phone number is (206) 571-5363, and the company website is www.emeraldcitypartybus.com.

There is a "Timeline" post, dated March 27th, by Emerald City Party Bus, which reads, "Its that time of [sic] my friends for, proms, concerts, bar crawls, nites on the town, And never forget Yearly Seahawks tailgates. So get at me for fun and safe times on the Party Bus and

  - Q. Thank you.
  - Now, did you ever e-mail Emerald City and ask for a quote for the provision of charter party services?
- 5 A. Yes, I did.
  - Q. Did you send that e-mail addressed particularly to Mr. Perkins?
  - A. The e-mail went not -- not per se to

    Mr. Perkins. It went to his -- on his website, the

    Reservations feature, and it went to -- the reply

    actually came from reservations@emeraldcitytaxi.com.
  - Q. With regard to, I guess, what you would call the salutation, the Dear Mr. So and So, is that to any particular individual?
  - A. I addressed -- yes, I addressed it -- I addressed the e-mail, "Good morning, Mr. Perkins," because that was the gentleman's name that appeared on the website, and I wanted to direct my inquiry to the business owner.

    That's my website. I have been -- that website has been
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    up since 2009. I have been advertising on Craigslist
    since that same time.

                And as far as responding back, I have not
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    been actually responding back for the last couple years
21
    as far as -- unless somebody calls me directly. But as

    far as e-mails, that was done by my girlfriend that's
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    been helping me, you know, out along the way since, you
24
    know, my injury, since the car accident, which I was
25
    hurt, you know, driving, you know, a licensed town car
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1 service and was hit, and so I'm going through that.

So she had -- she had been taking care of, like, up- -- you know, I should say -- what is it -- as far as updating, and just the -- my Craigslist, you know. I guess every seven to ten days, I guess, you can update it and keep it current.

And as far as my website, my website pictures have been the same since 2009. And as you can see, even on there, I do have an issue as far as that goes with the investigator. That address, that's where I was when I put this website together back in 2009. That's the condominium that I used to live in, and prior to buying my house in 2013.

So everything on the website has stayed the same, and I didn't think me having to change anything on there was a -- had any bearing on anything as far as business, me having pictures of colleagues' buses or their limos or advertising that way, you know. And that's basically all I can say in regards to my website.

And the Craigslist, I wasn't trying to hide anything from anybody, you know. We responded back to everybody. Anybody that asked, you know, I told them the situation. I referred them to colleagues that are licensed and insured through the UTC, and they would get that -- basically those busses. Or if they couldn't,

then they weren't able to get, you know, the busses, due
to, you know, reservation conflicts.

In my line of work, you know, this is not -this is not uncommon where, you know, business is passed
on to one another, and then -- and then on the backside
of that, commission is paid to the company that gives
the business out.

These colleagues of mine that I deal with that are -- that know about my current situation and my health situation, they were there by my side through this whole thing, and I was giving them pretty much all my business, and they were giving me commissions so that I could just barely -- you know, basically stay afloat, you know, keep my house while I'm going through this, trying to get better health-wise.

You know, I'm going through right now with the L&I as we speak. I got a hearing with them. I have major injuries, and I'm not just talking, like, little stuff. So I was not in the right state of mind to say, like, oh, I need to take down my website, or don't put anything on Craigslist, or don't respond to my customers.

I have built up trust for years with people, and they found out how hurt I was, you know, they still called me, and I referred them because I wanted them to

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- 1 be happy, to go out, to enjoy themselves, to have a good So if I'm guilty of that, then that's what I'm 2 3 guilty of. And that's the truth.
- 4 I mean, there's -- all that other stuff, 5 yeah, the investigator's right, I do have a website. I 6 did -- I do have stuff on my Facebook. Yes, ma'am, I 7 did have stuff on Craigslist that Adriana, she updates and uploads. And when calls come in, if I don't answer 8 9 the phone or -- she'll answer the phone.
  - Or with the e-mails, she'll respond to the e-mail, and she'll give them -- and she'll let them know, hey, we can do this. She'll call one of my colleagues and say, hey, does that date work for you? We got a call for a group.
  - And that's basically what I've been doing for the last three years now since those injuries. So yes, your Honor, that's pretty much what I have to say on my behalf in regards to this investigation.
  - JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Mr. Perkins, which companies are you referring business to?
  - MR. PERKINS: My companies that I refer business to is Brar Limousine out of SeaTac. Rick is the governing agent of that. He has two party busses, one with 20, one with 16 and a 28-passenger.
- 25 And the other one is DD Limousine, and the

1 governing person of that is Manoj Sharma. 2 JUDGE PEARSON: Did you say "DB"? 3 MR. PERKINS: Excuse me, ma'am? 4 JUDGE PEARSON: Did you say "DB," D as in 5 David, B --6 MR. PERKINS: D as in dog, yes, ma'am. Yes. 7 Yes, your Honor. DD Limousine. Governing person for 8 that is Manoj Sharma. It's actually his picture of his 9 Hummer on my Facebook. 10 You know, it's not uncommon that we use 11 pictures for advertising, you know, to bring people in 12 to get all the -- to use the -- you know, to get the 13 work. So those are the two companies I use. Those are 14 the two colleagues that I trust that I give business to, 15 and that's -- that's what I do --16 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. 17 MR. PERKINS: -- you know, just because I'm 18 not working. 19 I'm in, like, you know, kind of an area 20 right now where they're not sure what's going to happen 21 with me, you know, with my nerves and my back. 22 I had back surgery, I had shoulder surgery, 23 I broke my arm in four different places, all due because 24 of the accident driving a town car, and I have to have 25 neck and still -- knee surgery still to this date.

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And they're both located here close to my house here in SeaTac. That's where the majority of us all live that are in this line of work, because it's close to the airport with airport service.

And so I've known these gentlemen for ten years now, if not more. And when they found out what happened to me, they stepped in and are -- basically are trying to help me, you know, until I get back on my feet as far as, you know, hey, if you get calls, send them my way, we'll take care of it for you, and we'll take care of you, you know, while you're going through this and getting help here.

And that's all, your Honor. That's all I've been doing. And if I'm quilty of that, like I said, I'm quilty of that. And that's all I can say about it. I mean, I'm not going to sit here and tell you some other story, but that's -- that's the truth.

Yes, I have my website, I have Craigslist, there's advertisements on my Facebook, yes. Yes, there is.

> JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.

MR. PERKINS: But not -- but not have I been out driving, picking up people and putting people's lives in danger in the condition that I am with all the narcotics that they give me and shots that they give me

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1 in my spine.

> So no, I don't -- I'm not out there actively driving and trying to do that. I understand -- safety is the most important thing to me in this line of work, and now -- and now it's almost like I'm -- almost like I'm going -- I'm basically going against with L&I right now, we're fighting, and then I get served with these papers, like, a week later after. So I just kind of find it, like, really odd that all this came about all at the same time. So it's just a lot to deal with.

And your Honor -- and that's basically what I have to say about those -- those actions or what's being, you know, approached [sic] to me, you know, the complaints -- excuse me -- that are filed against me.

> JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you,

Mr. Perkins.

I'm going to ask Mr. Roberson here in just a minute if he has any questions for you. But before I do that, I just want to advise you, based on what you've said, that RCW 81.70.220, Subsection 1, which is the applicable statute upon which Staff's complaint was based, provides that it is illegal to advertise as a charter party or excursion service carrier without first obtaining a permit from the Commission.

So even if, as you say, you're not actually

providing those services yourself, you may not advertise
those services, so you will need to take that down, to
take down your website and take down your Facebook page
and your Craigslist ads, or get a permit from the
Commission. Those are the two choices that you have
right now.

MR. PERKINS: That's totally understandable, your Honor, you know -- and -- and then, to be honest with you, I didn't read through the whole UTC Commission book. I mean, you know, it's like -- it's like an encyclopedia, you know. I was doing the safety checks and doing the things that I thought were the most prominent.

And I was unaware that I couldn't do that as far as, you know, advertise -- you know, especially with my -- for example, your Honor, with my -- with my website, that website was there when I had my UTC permit, when I didn't have a bus, that was in compliance with you guys.

So that website has not changed since 2009, just in my defense, just to say -- to let you know that, you know, I didn't change anything. It's been that way since 2009. But I do understand what you're saying now.

JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.

Mr. Roberson, do you have any questions for

BY MR. ROBERSON:

- Mr. Perkins, so when Commission Staff reached Q. out to you in January and sent you a technical compliance letter and advised you you needed to get a permit if you were going to advertise as a charter party services carrier, you didn't do that, did you?
- Α. No, I did not, because I wasn't -- I wasn't driving, so I didn't think that it really was -- I thought it was just affecting me personally, like I had to do it myself in order to do that. You know, I didn't know that I had to actually not have, you know, things posted in that regards to that same sort of party excursions. Yeah, I didn't know that.
- To the extent that Staff informed you that advertisement was forbidden under RCW 81.70.220, you didn't take down the advertisements, did you?
- Α. Yes, I did. If you look on my website, I did take down the party busses on my website. And as far as the Craigslist and stuff like that, those are -- those are done by, like I said, my girlfriend. She is the one that would just, you know, click it to update it, you know, on Craigslist. Because when you set up an account

and it expires, you can just push "Repost" and it will repost. So she would just go in and do that every week, and do that, you know. And I'm not on top of those things right now as far as, you know, Craigslist.

And as far as my Facebook, I put that on there, yes, I did, because, you know -- I did do that because, you know, it's that time of year coming and, you know -- and I did put that on there as far as that one goes, yes.

Q. Okay.

So is your girlfriend an employee of Emerald City Party Bus or no?

- A. Excuse me?
- Q. Is your girlfriend an employee of Emerald City Party Bus?
- A. She's just been helping me out. She's -- she used to drive a town car for me, you know, before the accident, and so basically she's been trying to stay on top of all the paperwork, you know, and just take care of those kinds of day-to-day kind of things, you know. So that's -- that's where she is at right now with everything.
- Q. So she's acting on your behalf for the purposes of your business, just --
- A. Yes. Yes, sir.

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#### Q. Okay.

I think the -- your Facebook post, your website, your Craigslist post repeatedly discuss "I have," "I have." You don't ever say that you're dispatching, right? You say that you're providing the service in your vehicles?

Yes. And my Craigslist ad, I've been having that since 2009. It's been the same posting since then, and I've never changed it. It's just been the same paragraph that's been on there since then. Nothing's been changed, so she's been going in and reposting. She hasn't gone in there and done any kind of changing of any wording or anything, so she's just been reposting it.

So yes, I have -- if I have, yes -- if it says "I have" on there, yes -- if you say it does, then it probably does. I just don't look at it on a daily or even a monthly basis right now.

JUDGE PEARSON: Mr. Perkins, this is Judge Pearson. Can you tell me what your girlfriend's name is, please, her first and last name?

MR. PERKINS: Yes. Adriana Ivan.

JUDGE PEARSON: I'm sorry. What?

  - Q. Are you familiar with RCW 81.70.220?
- 9 A. Yes, I am.
  - Q. And what does that statute set out as the maximum penalty for engaging in the business of a charter party service or excursion service carrier without a certificate from the Commission or registering as an interstate carrier?
- A. The penalties under that statute are up to \$5,000 per violation.
  - Q. Are you familiar with the Commission's guidance [sic] on penalties?
- 19 A. Yes, I am.
- Q. And are you familiar with Staff's investigation of Emerald City Party Bus and/or Marcus Perkins?
- 22 A. Yes, I am.
- Q. Do you have a recommendation as to the appropriate penalties for the violations we've been discussing today?

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# DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. ROBERSON / PRATT 44

- A. Yes, I do.
  - Q. And what is that penalty?
- A. Okay. Based on my review, where we have four violations that we've talked about, which was the offer to provide service and the three advertisements, that would give us a potential of up to \$20,000 penalty, or \$5,000 each.

And I've listened to Mr. Perkins' case, and I understand his dilemma and where he's been at, but I do believe that he has reposted advertisements since then and he has not changed them, so I'm not swayed [sic] of that, but I also am swayed about his financial condition.

So my recommendation would be to penalize him \$1,000 for each violation, which would be a penalty of \$4,000. I would recommend that the other \$16,000, though, be suspended for a period of two years under the conditions that he is compliant, which means he either gets a permit or he ceases and desists from operating or advertising.

MR. ROBERSON: Thank you.

JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.

Mr. Perkins, did you want to respond to

24 that?

MR. PERKINS: Yes.

MR. PERKINS: I believe the fines are just -- I don't think they, you know, justify for the situation. I never misled anybody that contacted me. I let them know that there was going to be another company calling that would take care of them.

You know, as far as advertising, I mean, advertising is a part of business. I mean, I have to make a living, and any colleagues of mine, you know, they're helping me out, and so I don't see a fine that severe being pushed on me.

And then to have me shut down my website is what -- basically what he's saying. I mean, I gained a lot of trust and a lot of customers over the years prior to my accident, and, I mean, that's just -- you know, be considered -- should be taken into consideration for the great services and everything that I've done, and was doing the right thing, including by following the safety -- you know, I went about it the right way in that accident.

I wasn't -- I wasn't trying to get over, I guess you can say, or try to -- try to work the system, you know. If that was the case, I would have just completely just shut my business down and just dealt with it and just whatever. But I -- I'm keeping my

business alive, because there's people out there that actually enjoy what I've done for them, the business in the past, the business that they want to do with me in the future.

So shutting my website down -- I have no problem with making adjustments to -- as far as, you know, as far as the UTC action part of it is, you know, involved in this, I have no problem with doing that.

And shutting down with Craigslist, that's -- I have no problem with doing that.

But with that being said, I mean, if you fine \$4,000 for basically, like, I'm just trying to, you know, just stay afloat and not lose my home, you know. I'm a father to a six-year-old daughter that I can't even do anything with. You know, I have serious injuries.

You know, due to working under the State, you know, that I'm fighting with now through L&I -- and it's, like, I'm getting it from both sides right now.

And it's like -- it's been -- it's been overwhelming.

And yes, I have not been on top of these things probably like I should have been, but I've been under doctor's, specialist's care for over three years now, with major surgeries, not just broken femur or something like that.

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## CROSS TESTIMONY BY MR. PERKINS

You know, I've taken a lot of medication. I'm on nerve medication, pain medication, everything, and I just -- I just -- I couldn't take -- I just -- I couldn't -- I just -- I don't think I could even afford to do that. I mean, I would rather just shut things down and deal with it and, you know, and see where the next step in my life goes at this point.

Because you know -- I mean, I just thought I was doing a service for people out there, getting them to go out and have a great time. And advertising is one of the things, and I thought I did a great job and was great customer service to people, and people would think that way. And you know, it's just -- I kind of find it sad that it's come to this point where now, I mean, it's like I'm going to have to shut down my websites and all this stuff. And so that's -- that's it, your Honor.

JUDGE PEARSON: But Mr. Perkins, you understand you have the option of applying for a certificate, correct?

MR. PERKINS: Yes, ma'am. But the thing is this. I'm not going to pass the required physical that is required, you know, through the DOT, you know, because you have to take a physical. And then the doctors, they've already told me, Marcus, you're far from that even happening.

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## CROSS TESTIMONY BY MR. PERKINS

So even if I applied, I'm the one that, when I drive the busses, I'd be usually the only one. I never had another bus driver. When I had my town cars and I was doing the car service, that was different, because people can drive cars, but they can't drive busses safely.

So I took that very seriously, because when you have that many people on board, I mean, an accident can hurt, obviously kill people. And so I was trained to drive. I got extra training prior to even applying to be -- you know, for a business here, I worked for FedEx for seven years prior to this driving tractor-trailer. I had all kinds of training. So I took the training and safety very seriously.

So that's why, you know, I just -- I just --I'm just -- like I said, I guess that's all I have to say, your Honor. I just -- I don't believe this. I'm kind of at a loss for words right now.

JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. I just --

MR. PERKINS: I've got a lot going on, and I understand where the State's coming from as far as the UTC thing, the violation, or the complaints, you know. There was not -- no intention or any kind of malice in that to try to -- to try to do something to the State, you know, on purpose. It wasn't -- it wasn't that at

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And I feel like I'm being penalized or, like, I was trying to do this on purpose, and I wasn't trying to do anything intentionally. And you know, I pride myself on safety and taking care of others and whatever, and having people have fun.

So that's it, your Honor. That's all I have to say about it.

JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you,

10 Mr. Perkins.

So Mr. Roberson, I just want to ask if Staff is amenable to a payment plan as part of their recommendation.

MR. ROBERSON: Yes, your Honor.

JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.

So anything else, Mr. Pratt?

MR. PRATT: Yeah. I would just like to make an offer to Mr. Perkins. When this case is concluded, we would be happy to work with you to adjust the wording on your advertisements and your website to reflect that you do not provide the service yourself but that you refer it to others.

And we have some criteria, and if you're willing to meet that criteria, you could then continue to advertise, which does not run afoul of our rules.

And so I would say, when this case is resolved, which would be after the order comes out and you comply with it, then we'd be happy to work with you so you can continue to broker, so to speak, loads out, as long as you did it appropriately.

MR. PERKINS: That's great. Thank you very much. I will consider that. And I'd be willing to do that, you know, come down there and talk with you about that, and show me -- you know, show me what I did wrong, you know, as far as how to reword everything now with, you know -- but yes, I'm definitely -- I'm definitely on board with doing things like that.

I built up a lot of customers and, you know, and a good base, you know, and gave great service, and I just don't want to throw that all away just because I'm hurt and trying to just get better. So yes, I would really appreciate that. Thank you.

JUDGE PEARSON: So I will just note that there's nothing that prevents the parties from working together immediately towards fixing the website, and my preference is that that would be corrected sooner rather than later to get Mr. Perkins into compliance with Commission rules.

So Mr. Perkins, at your earliest convenience, you're welcome to contact Staff and get

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    some technical assistance about how to make changes to
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    your website to bring it into compliance.
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                MR. PERKINS: Your Honor, may I ask, can I
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    have a phone number and that gentleman, Mr. Pratt's,
