RE: Skyline Compliance Filing to Receive \$58,503.50 From the State Universal Communications Services Program (Program) **Docket UT-190641**

Dear Mr. Johnson:

On November 7, 2019, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) entered Order 01, GRANTING DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS FROM THE STATE UNIVERSAL COMMUNICATIONS SERVICES PROGRAM SUBJECT TO CONDITIONS, (Order 01) in the above-referenced docket. In order for Skyline to receive the second distribution of \$58,503.50 from the Program, Order 01, among other things, required Skyline Telecom, Inc. (Skyline) to submit a specific officer-approved 2020 capital expenditure budget plan to invest at least \$58,503 towards regulated rate base benefitting Skyline's Washington exchange area service territories and an officer-signed affidavit attesting to the detail and estimated amount of the 2020 capital expenditure budget plan.¹

On December 4, 2019, Skyline filed with the Commission its Affidavit, Detailed Project Budget and an Officer Approvided Capital Budget for 2020. On December 9, 2019 Skyline filed revised documents which included a dated Affidavit. The Company's filing provides the required information and contains a summary on the company's ongoing Fiber to the Home project in the Mt. Hull exchange.

Commission Staff (Staff) reviewed the compliance filing provided by Skyline dated December 4, 2019 and revised and refiled on December 9, 2019, and finds that it contains sufficient detail with respect to the company's plan to invest atleast \$58,503 towards its regulated rate base. Therefore, Staff believes that the filing complies with the Commission's Order 01, entered November 7, 2019.
