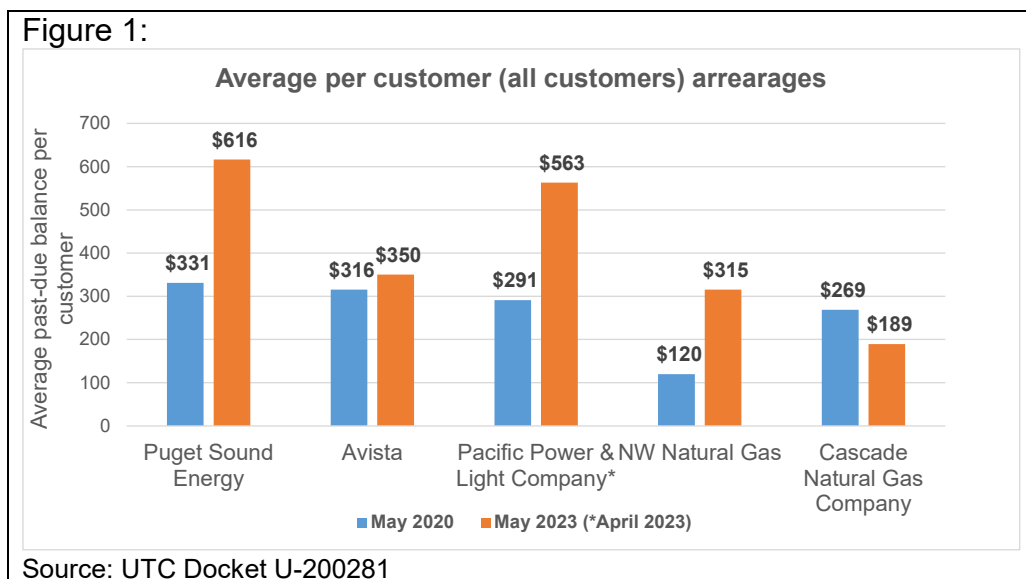

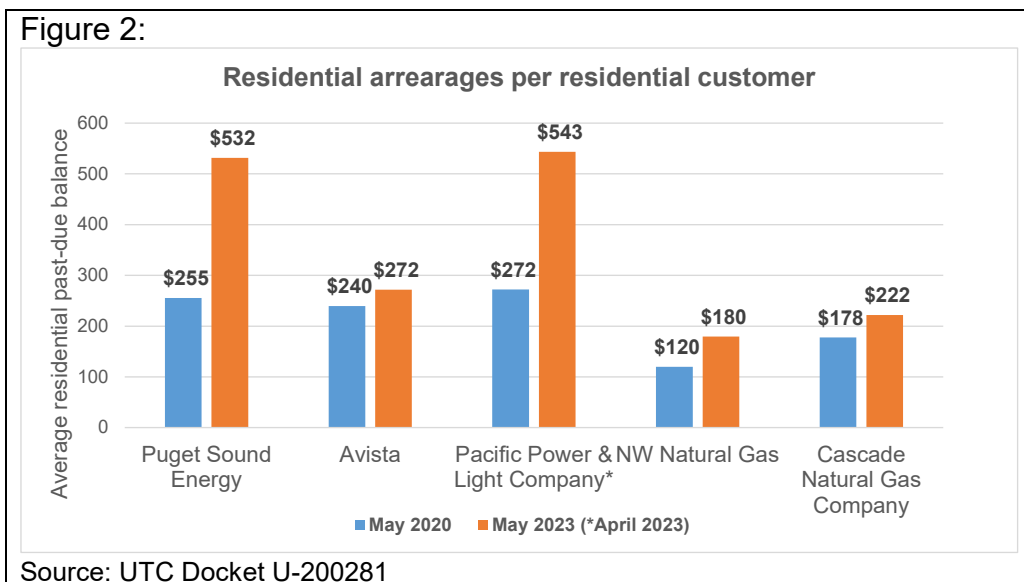
- a. What is PSE’s current level of residential arrearages per residential customer?
- b. What is the current level of residential arrearages per residential customer for the “other Washington State investor-owned utilit[ies]”?¹

Response:

- a. The arrearage data Puget Sound Energy (“PSE”) used for its June 2023 Comments in Docket U-210800 were based on data from Docket U-200281 as of May 2023 for all utilities (for April 2023 for Pacific Power & Light Company). Based on the same data, as of May 2023, PSE’s average arrearage amount per customer was \$616 (see Figure 1 below) and PSE’s residential arrearage amount per residential customer was \$532 (see Figure 2 below).
