DECLARATION OF JASON  
SHARP

1 I, Jason Sharp, under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of Washington, declare as follows:

2 I am over 18 years of age, a citizen of the United States, a resident of the State of Washington, and competent to be a witness.

3 I am employed by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (“Commission”), where I have worked as a Motor Carrier Safety Supervisor, Transportation Safety since 2017. My duties include supervising and conducting investigations into companies that may be operating in violation of Commission rules or State statutes enforced by the Commission. As part of those duties, I investigate whether companies are in compliance with the rules of the Commission, including the rules found in WAC 480-15.

4 On October 23, 2018, I sent a letter to Joshua Manion, owner of We Like to Move It, Move It!! LLC (“Company”) at the Company’s address on file with the Commission. The letter noted the Commission’s training requirement for obtaining permanent household goods carrier authority pursuant to WAC 480-15-305, and that Commission records indicated that no one from the Company had attended this required training. The letter informed the Company that failure to complete the required training could result in the cancellation the Company’s provisional operating authority. The letter further provided dates and registration instructions for upcoming Commission-sponsored household goods carrier trainings and contact information for a Commission employee made available to assist the Company with enrollment.

5 On May 17, 2019, I called Mr. Manion and left a voicemail message. I was attempting to reach Mr. Manion to gauge his interest in complying with Commission rules by signing up for an upcoming Commission-sponsored household goods carrier training, and thereafter potentially suspending or cancelling the brief adjudicative proceeding in this matter, currently set for June 3, 2019. My voicemail requested that Mr. Manion return my call, but as of the date of this declaration, he has not done so.

- 6 To the best of my knowledge, and as of the date of this declaration, no Company representative has attended the Commission-sponsored household goods training as required under WAC 480-15-305.
