your company refrains permanently from further operations as a household goods carrier without first obtaining a permit.

MR. WILDES: Yes.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And so the order to cease and desist is permanent. It never expires. So if Staff discovers you are still operating even after two years, Staff can go straight to Superior Court and ask for higher penalties. So do you understand that part?

MR. WILDES: Yes.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So it's very important that you follow the law. And let me see.

So is the entire part -- amount getting paid today?

MR. BRAUN: I'm not for sure, Your Honor --
MR. WILDES: I --
