Response to RTDS's Petition to Reinstate "Stretch Duck" Vehicle 21

Dear Mr. Johnson:

On July 25, 2017, the Commission issued Order 09, denying Ride the Ducks of Seattle's (RTDS) petition to lift the suspension on the use of its Stretch Ducks. The Commission ordered that RTDS must demonstrate that certain requirements had been met before the Commission would lift the suspension on its authority to provide excursion services using Stretch Duck vehicles. Order 09 at 3-4, ¶ 9. The Commission required RTDS to:

- Provide verification through a qualified third party, to the satisfaction of the Commission, that the new axle installation in each Stretch Duck vehicle meets or exceeds the applicable federal motor carrier safety standards;
- Perform an annual inspection in accordance with 459 CFR Part 396.17 and correct any defect discovered during the inspection; and
- Pass a jurisdictionally mandated Level VII commercial vehicle inspection by Staff on each Stretch Duck vehicle the company anticipates to operate.

On January 22, 2018, the Commission issued Order 10, granting in part and denying in part RTDS's Amended Petition to Reinstate Stretch Duck Vehicles. The Commission lifted the suspension on RTDS's use of Stretch Duck 4, finding that RTDS had complied with the requirements in Order 09 with respect to Stretch Duck 4. The Commission did not, however, lift the suspension as to the other vehicles in the Second Petition because those vehicles had not complied with the requirements in Order 09. The Commission ordered that RTDS "must submit one or more petitions for the remaining Stretch Duck vehicles demonstrating that the Company has satisfied the requirements . . . for each of those vehicles" before any would be reinstated. Order 10 at 4, ¶ 11.

On May 29, 2018, RTDS filed a Petition for Reinstatement of Stretch Duck 21, which has been fitted with a replacement axle.

In its Petition, RTDS provided verification that a qualified third party, Recreation Engineering, Inc., performed an onsite inspection of the new axle installation in Stretch Duck 21 to confirm that Stretch Duck 21 meets the applicable federal motor vehicle safety standards. Petition at 4, ¶ 12, Exh. 11. RTDS also provided evidence showing that an annual vehicle inspection that meets the requirements of 49 CFR Part 396.17 was performed on Stretch Duck 21. No defects were noted. Petition at 4, ¶ 13; Exh. 12.

On May 31, 2018, Motor Carrier Safety Staff performed a Level VII vehicle inspection of Stretch Duck 21. No violations were discovered.

**Recommendation:** Staff is satisfied that RTDS has met the conditions of Order 09 with respect to Stretch Duck 21. Staff accordingly recommends that the Commission allow RTDS to resume operation of Stretch Duck 21.
